This edition includes program descriptions and outlay information, as well as sections to assist legislators and staff in linking the federal program data to the state budget. A State Trust Fund section identifies the trust fund(s) used for depositing the federal grants, and a table indicates which State programs are supported and what areas and populations of Illinois are served by the federal grants.

It is the hope of the Legislative Research Unit that this handbook will be a useful resource for legislators in enhancing their understanding of federal assistance.

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# **INTRODUCTION**

The Legislative Research Unit, a bipartisan support services agency of the Illinois General Assembly, has a responsibility of serving as the "... information center for the General Assembly in the field of federal-state relations, ... and compiling and maintaining current information on available and pending federal aid programs." [25 ILCS 130/4-2.1] In meeting this responsibility, the Legislative Research Unit records and tracks applications for, and awards of, federal grants to State agencies. In addition, the Legislative Research Unit conducts an annual survey designed to identify federal funds received by Illinois State agencies.

This *Federal Funds to State Agencies* report is designed to provide legislators and legislative staff with a comprehensive guide to federal funds that are received by State agencies. It augments the information provided in the Legislative Research Unit's weekly reports of federal fund transactions by listing federal aid awards on a State or federal fiscal year basis and including descriptive program information. Weekly reports are available on the Legislative Research Unit Website. This report is designed to help legislators and legislative staff develop a clearer understanding of the federal programs used by Illinois State agencies, and of the levels at which those programs are funded.

The Legislative Research Unit is also required to report annually to the General Assembly on the adequacy of State agency participation in programs financed by federal aid and the nature of federal aid programs in which State agencies or local governments did not participate, and to make recommendations. [25 ILCS 130/4-2.1(c)]

## **Adequacy of Participation in Federal Aid Programs**

Each State agency, in its budgetary process with the General Assembly, reports evaluation and funding data as required. Through this process, the General Assembly receives information on the adequacy of programs financed by federal aid in the State. The Legislative Research Unit, as requested or assigned by members of the General Assembly, produces special reports relative to federal funds.

# Identification of New Federal Funds (Types and Nature of Programs Not Applied For)

The Legislative Research Unit works with the Illinois Federal Clearinghouse in the Governor's Office to identify and make information available on federal aid programs that may provide resources for State agencies and local governments. Extensive Clearinghouse information, including referrals to Legislative Research Unit's publications, such as *Grant Alerts*, is available on the Legislative Research Unit Website. *Grant Alerts* is also published monthly and mailed to potential grant users throughout the State.

#### Recommendations

The Legislative Research Unit will make recommendations as deemed appropriate.

#### Overview


Illinois State agencies received federal funds from 336 programs in FY 2014, 13 of which are programs supported by American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) funds. (These totals may be duplicated, because more than one agency may report funds from a federal program.) State agency revenues from federal programs increased significantly in 2010 and 2011—largely due to ARRA funds—before decreasing in 2012 as ARRA funding ends. There was a slight increase in 2013. The 2014 projection is below the amount received in FY 2010. Table 1 and Figure 1 below show the total amounts of federal funds that Illinois agencies reported in each year from 2010 to 2013, and the combined estimate for 2014. They also show the total federal outlays (payments) for grants to state and local governments for the same years, as reported in the President's federal fiscal year 2015 budget.

In FY 2014, awards received by state agencies are estimated to be about \$1 billion 317 million above the FY 2013 awards. Program details are summarized in Appendix B.

Some of the major increases in federal funds from FY 2013 to FY 2014 include the Department of Human Services; Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and Department of Healthcare and Family Services' Children's Health Insurance Program; and the Department of Natural Resources' Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation (AMLR) Program.

Programs with substantial reductions include the Department of Transportation's Highway Planning and Construction; State Board of Education; Special Education-Grants to States; and the Department of Employment Security's Unemployment Insurance.

# **Using This Handbook**

The federal programs in this handbook were included if the federal funds were received directly from the federal government or a non-State agency (such as a consortium of states that receive federal monies for a particular project or a national study group that pays the State agency for research or services). Programs in which a State agency received funds from another State agency (subgrants) have been excluded to avoid "double counting," or falsely inflating the dollar totals. However, Appendix C on subgrants shows the flow of federal funds from some State agencies to others.

The table of contents lists the federal programs used by State agencies from FY 2012 through FY 2014. This table shows the location of the federal program descriptions, as well as which federal programs are used by each State agency. Tables showing federal aid award totals by State agency are appended. Each agency's programs are listed by the numbers assigned by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget in its *Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance* (CFDA). Descriptions of each program include the proper name, program description (objectives and services provided or supported), formula description, matching requirements, account identification number (federal), and a table illustrating the outlays to Illinois for FY 2012 and FY 2013, and estimated receipts in FY 2014.

This *Federal Funds to State Agencies* handbook contains two sections of State information to assist legislators and staff in linking the federal program data to the State budget. A State Trust Fund section identifies the fund(s) used for depositing the federal grants, and tables show which State programs are supported and what areas and populations of Illinois are served by the federal grants. Descriptions of the federal programs include their proper names, common names (where appropriate), and five-digit identifying numbers (CFDA numbers). Each CFDA number identifies a federal program and the administering federal agency. #### **Information Sources**

The basic sources for the fiscal data included in the *Federal Funds to State Agencies* report are the Legislative Research Unit's annual federal aid surveys, which have examined the use of federal funds by Illinois State agencies from FY 1973 until the present. The fiscal information is supplied directly by the State agencies, and it is assumed the figures are supplied in good faith and are substantially correct. The primary source for the program descriptive information is the U.S. Office of Management and Budget's *Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance*.

# 16.590 GRANTS TO ENCOURAGE ARREST POLICIES AND ENFORCEMENT OF PROTECTION ORDERS PROGRAM

**Program Description:** The program provides grants for governments, state and local courts (including juvenile courts), tribal courts, and units of local government to treat domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking as serious crimes.

**Formula Description:** The program has no statutory formula or matching requirements. Applicants are encouraged to contribute to project costs, and maintenance of effort may be required.

# 93.586 STATE COURT IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

**Program Description:** The program provides formula grants to assist state courts in carrying out their role in the continuum of care provided for families and children at risk. It offers support for the implementation of alternatives and improvements to, as well as the expansion of, successful court systems. It enables state courts to design assessments that identify barriers to effective decision-making, highlight practices that are not fully successful, examine areas in need of correction or added attention, and implement reforms that address the state court's specific needs.

**Formula Description:** Each state court with an approved application is allotted \$85,000 for each of the fiscal years 2012-2016. The remainder of the amount appropriated for all state courts will be divided among those courts with approved applications, according to each state's proportionate share of children under the age of 21. Twenty-five percent of the total cost must come from non-federal funds.

### 16.543 MISSING CHILDREN'S ASSISTANCE

Program Description: The program provides grants to public agencies or private non-profit organizations for research, demonstration projects, or service programs designed to: (1) educate parents, children, and community agencies and organizations in ways to prevent the abduction and sexual exploitation of children; (2) provide information to assist in the location and return of missing children; (3) aid communities in the collection of materials that would be useful to parents in assisting others in the identification of missing children; (4) develop effective treatment for the psychological consequences to both parents and children of (a) the abduction of a child, both during the period of disappearance and after the child is recovered, and (b) the sexual exploitation of a missing child; (5) collect detailed data on the actual investigative practices used by law enforcement agencies in missing children's cases; (6) address the particular needs of missing children by minimizing the negative impact of judicial and law enforcement procedures on children who are victims of abuse or sexual exploitation and by promoting the active participation of children and their families in cases involving abuse or sexual exploitation of children; (7) address the needs of missing children and their families following the recovery of such children; (8) reduce the likelihood that individuals under 18 years of age will be abducted; and (9) establish or operate statewide clearinghouses to assist in recovering or locating missing children.

**Program Description:** The Institute of Museum and Library Services program consolidates federal library services programs designed to improve services, facilitate access to resources, and encourage resource sharing among all types of libraries. Grants are available to state library administrative agencies, which may spend the funds themselves or make them available to other agencies. Subgrants may be made available for several listed purposes.

**Formula Description:** Grants to states are based on the most recent total population calculations from the Bureau of the Census. The federal share is 66% and the state matching requirement is 34%.

**Program Description:** The program provides funds for states to reimburse schools for providing more nutritious school lunches through the donation of domestic agricultural commodities and cash grants.

**Formula Description:** The program is funded on a performance basis. For every lunch or snack served, the state receives a payment from funds made available under the School Lunch Act. The state also receives a payment for each lunch served to a student eligible for free or reduced-price lunches. The amounts of such payments are determined by National Average Payment (NAP) factors. NAP factors are adjusted annually according to changes in the "Food Away From Home" component of the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers.

# 10.560 STATE ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES FOR CHILD NUTRITION

**Program Description:** The program provides funds to states for administrative expenses associated with supervising and giving technical assistance to schools and other institutions that conduct Child Nutrition Programs. State agencies that administer the distribution of USDA-donated commodities to schools, or child or adult care institutions, are also eligible for funding.

Formula Description: For the National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, and

Special Milk Program, states receive 1% of the total funds used in the state during the second preceding year, with a minimum of \$200,000 or the amount received in federal FY 1981. For the Child and Adult Care Food Program a sliding grant is based on program and fiscal data. (The Secretary of Agriculture may provide additional funds.) Each state must contribute at least as much as it did in 1977.

# 17.235 SENIOR COMMUNITY SERVICE EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

**Program Description:** The program provides grants to states, public and private non-profit organizations, and tribal organizations for programs to (1) foster individual economic selfsufficiency; (2) provide part-time training opportunities in community service activities for unemployed low-income (at or below 125% of federal poverty level) persons 55 years or older; and (3) increase the number of older persons who enjoy unsubsidized public or private employment. Training must not involve political or sectarian purposes. Projects must be coordinated with WIA projects, One-Stop Career Centers, and the State Office of the Aging. At least 75% of total funds must be used to pay wages; no more than 13.5 % of the federal share may be used on administration.

**Formula Description:** Grantees must provide at least 10% of total cost through cash or in-kind contributions. The program has a maintenance of effort requirement.
