

Illinois Regulation is a summary of the weekly regulatory decisions of State agencies published in the Illinois Register and action taken by the Illinois General Assembly's Joint Committee on Administrative Rules. Illinois Regulation, also titled The Flinn Report in memory of founding JCAR member Rep. Monroe Flinn, is designed to inform and involve the public in changes taking place in agency administration.

New Rules

■ COMMUNITY CARE

The DEPARTMENT ON AGING adopted amendments to Community Care Program (89 IAC 240; 42 Ill Reg 314), effective 1/1/19, that update various definitions and references, along with payment rates, financial and other eligibility criteria, and certain requirements for the application process. "Case Coordination Units" will be called "Care Coordination Units"; "clients" are now "participants", applications are now "requests for services", and plans of care will be "person-centered". New Sections have been added outlining the person-centered planning process, which will include a review of the participant's condition and services at least every 12 months. Other issues addressed in this rulemaking include participant privacy, requirements that care providers report critical events

(incidents or situations that place the participant in danger of serious harm), Automatic Medication Dispenser service, and criteria for suspending or terminating services. Changes since 1st Notice include an added requirement that care providers who have direct contact with participants be educated annually about exposure to influenza and steps to minimize the risk of exposing participants to influenza, including immunizations. Other changes clarify various definitions and procedures. Agencies providing CCP services are affected by this rulemaking.

Proposed Rulemakings

■ EMERGENCY RESPONDERS

The DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH proposed amendments to Emergency Medical Services, Trauma Center, Comprehensive Stroke Center, Primary Stroke Center and Acute Stroke Ready Hospital Code (77 IAC 515; 42 Ill Reg 20621) implementing Public Acts 100-255 and 100-108. The rulemaking allows ambulance assistance vehicles to upgrade their level of care (Basic Life Support, Intermediate Life Support, or Advanced Life Support/Paramedic) based on the highest level of certification among the regular on-board personnel. It also allows EMS personnel to provide basic first aid and ambulance transport to police dogs injured in the line of duty if no human patient requires the unit's immediate assistance. Ambulance and EMS providers,

NEW RULES: Rules adopted by agencies this week. **EMERGENCY RULES:** Adopted for a temporary period not to exceed 150 days.
PROPOSED RULES: Rules proposed by agencies this week, commencing a 45-day First Notice period during which public comments must be accepted.
PEREMPTORY RULES: Rules adopted without prior public notice or JCAR review as authorized by 5 ILCS 100/5-50.
■ Designates rules of special interest to small businesses, small municipalities, and not-for-profit corporations. Agencies are required to consider comments from these groups and minimize the regulatory burden on them.

■ COMMUNITY COLLEGES

The ILLINOIS COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD proposed amendments to Administration of the Illinois Public Community College Act (23 IAC 1501; 42 Ill Reg 20592) implementing Public Act 99-692, which requires community college trustees elected or appointed after 1/1/17 to undergo leadership training during their first, third and fifth years in office. The rulemaking establishes the application process through which ICCB will approve providers of trustee leadership training. Entities pre-approved to offer this training include Illinois public community colleges, the Illinois Office of the

Attorney General, the Illinois Minimum Continuing Legal Education Board, and continuing professional education sponsors for public accountants (if the sponsor is registered with the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation). Other entities that offer professional development activities (e.g., training organizations, professional associations) may apply to ICCB for approval. The rulemaking specifies the information applicants must submit and the criteria for approval. Approved leadership training providers will be listed on the ICCB website and approval must be renewed every 2 years. Those affected by this rulemaking include community colleges and certain professional development/training organizations or firms.

The POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD proposed amendments to Air Quality Standards (35 IAC 243; 42 Ill Reg 20601) implementing changes to the National Ambient Air Quality Standards that were adopted by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency from 1/1/18 through 6/30/18. PCB will hold simultaneous public hearings on this rulemaking **Monday, Jan. 10, at 11:30 a.m.** at the James R. Thompson Center, Room 11-512, 100 W. Randolph St., Chicago, and at the PCB Hearing Room at IEPA headquarters, 1021 N. Grand Ave. East, Springfield.
