Mary/Anne:

How has our progress been re: recruiting Senators to testify re: the positive attributes of the NRI program?

Also, we should be prepared to be responsive to questions re: issues raised in the CNN piece: e.g. Bud Billiken parade, election/timing, and how this program is being reworded to include more "traditional" employment and mentoring situations.

Reshma/Jack, correct me if I'm wrong on any of these, but proposed responses are below:

Bud Billiken – The parade took place on a Saturday morning; Saturday is a regularly scheduled work day for the students who participated in that program. Additionally, the students received their paychecks on Saturdays. The students were paid their normal paychecks that day, for the violence prevention work that they performed both on the street and at the parade.

Election/timing – In the summer of 2010, there was a sense that violence and crime were spinning out of control in some of Chicago's hardest hit communities. There were six police officers shot and killed in 2010 - three of these in a period of weeks from May through July. The shocking, video-taped beating death of Fenger High School student Derrion Albert was still on people's minds. Community activists and residents were clamoring for action by their elected leaders. In July of 2010, Governor Pat Quinn heard these cries for action and appointed an Anti-violence Commission to look at the causes of violence and recommend solutions. The group was composed of people who had all personally been victims of violence. After a series of meetings in the affected areas of the City, the Anti-violence Commission recommended creation of a Neighborhood Recovery Initiative (NRI). The program focused on directly helping children and families and took direct aim at the risk factors associated with violence.

NRI success - We know there's still too much violence in our communities. However, if you talk to those involved in NRI, you can see it's made an impact and given people hope – and just as importantly skills they can build on. And in the last year, we know four fewer school children were killed in Chicago. As Father Michael Pflieger, of the Church of St. Sabina, one of the program's lead agencies, said, the overall success of NRI cannot be measured by Chicago's crime rate. "Let's not say because the NRI can't show evidence of crime being down that it's failed," Pflieger said. "No, I look at the NRI with the boots on the street and within the community that we're helping from getting worse."

"Traditional" employment/mentoring – Jack, can you provide any insight for this one.

FAQ for House Bill 3816 as amended

What does HB 3816 do?

Senate Amendment 1 to HB 3816 eliminates government waste and redundancy by consolidating the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority (IVPA) into the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority (ICJIA).

Provisions of Senate Amendment 1 to HB 3816:

- Creates a new “Violence Prevention Section” within ICJIA, with the express purpose of coordinating statewide violence prevention efforts and developing a statewide plan that includes public health and public safety approaches to violence prevention in families, communities, and schools.
- Incorporates the original responsibilities of IVPA into ICJIA’s authorized powers, duties, and responsibilities.
- Adds 2 new members to ICJIA that were previously represented on the IVPA Board: (1) the Director of the Department of Public Health and (2) the Director of The Department of Children and Family Services.
- The ICJIA will create a standing committee through rules that will mirror the public membership of the current IVPA board.
- Transfers all funds currently available to IVPA into new funds controlled by ICJIA, including placing the majority of violence prevention programs under IVPA under the jurisdiction of ICJIA to avoid duplication.
- Requires that all unexpended balances transferred to ICJIA by this act may only be expended by the Authority for the purpose for which the appropriation was originally made.
- Transfers personnel of IVPA to ICJIA to maintain grant review continuity.

Why is it needed?

Last May, the General Assembly moved GRF funding for the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative to ICJIA for FY 13. The NRI grant comprised nearly 70 % of IVPA appropriation last fiscal year.

As the IVPA, ICJIA, the Attorney General’s and Governor’s offices have been working over the last few months to transfer the NRI staff to ICJIA, a number of logistical issues arose. For instance, the General Assembly appropriated funds to ICJIA for NRI grants but not for staff to oversee the grants, hence there were no dollars to pay grant monitoring staff for the NRI at ICJIA.

After considering an intergovernmental agreement to pay for the NRI staff, the most logical option was to consolidate all the violence prevention programs under ICJIA.

In addition, it did not seem prudent to have two state agencies administer violence prevention programs. It was determined that it would be simpler, would streamline the programming, and create cost savings to eliminate IVPA and move all the funding and staff (NRI plus regular IVPA funds and staff) to ICJIA.

(Footnote: ICJIA is a state agency dedicated to improving the administration of criminal justice. The Authority brings together key leaders from the justice system and the public to identify critical issues facing the criminal justice system in Illinois, and to propose and evaluate policies, programs, and legislation that address those issues. The statutory responsibilities of the Authority fit into four areas: grants administration; research and analysis; policy and planning; and information systems and technology.)

Cost Savings Info:IVPA Director position is currently budgeted for \$95,000 with current FY 13 retirement (37.98%), social security (7.65%) and health insurance (estimated at \$24,000). Total estimated savings=\$162,000

If we were to fill NRI program developer position it would be approximately 42-45,000 with associated FY 13 retirement, social security and health insurance. Total estimated savings=\$85,000-90,000

Estimated grand total=\$247,000-252,000

Whose initiative is SB 3816?

The Attorney General's

ROLE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

What is the AG's interest's in this legislation?

- As co-chair of IVPA and on the board of ICJIA the AG's Office, has been working with the Governor's Office and IDPH over the last few months to finalize the transfer of the NRI staff to ICJIA. There were a number of hurdles to accomplish this because of the way the NRI Appropriation to ICJIA was written. It was determined that consolidating all of the violence prevention grant programs into one agency would reduce redundancy in government and create costs savings.
 - o Specific problem was the logistics of having staff from one agency oversee a program funded under another agency.

Was NRI an initiative of the AG?

- NO

Was the transfer of NRI to ICJIA an initiative of the AG?

- NO. It was initiated by members of the General Assembly during the budget process last session.
- (*Footnote: The House not only initiated the move of NRI funding to ICJIA but it also passed a resolution asking the Auditor General to conduct a performance audit of the NRI program.*)

When/how did the AG initiate the IVPA move to ICJIA?

- Last May, the General Assembly moved the GRF funding for the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative to ICJIA for FY 13. The NRI appropriation comprised nearly 70 % of IVPA appropriation last fiscal year.
- As the IVPA, ICJIA, IDPH, the Attorney General’s and Governor’s offices have been working over the last few months to transfer the NRI staff to ICJIA, a number of logistical issues arose. For instance, the General Assembly appropriated funds to ICJIA for NRI grants but not for staff to oversee the grants, hence there were no dollars to pay grant monitoring staff for the NRI at ICJIA.
- After considering an intergovernmental agreement to pay for the NRI staff, the most logical option was to consolidate all the violence prevention programs under ICJIA.

IVPA Q & A:

Will IVPA continue to exist?

IVPA will no longer operate as an independent agency, however, IVPA’s programs and employees will continue to implement and monitor violence prevention grant programs in the newly formed violence prevention grants unit within ICJIA.

What is IVPA?

The Illinois Violence Prevention Authority.

Established by the Illinois Violence Prevention Act of 1995, the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority (IVPA) is the only state agency dedicated to violence prevention in the United States.

- Primary role has been grant making to community based agencies across Illinois for violence prevention.
- Developed innovative and needed violence prevention programming such as:
 - o Safe From the Start: serving young children (ages 0—5) exposed to violence such as domestic and community violence
 - o Illinois Health Cares: Improves local health systems’ capacities to respond to domestic violence, elder abuse and sexual assault.
 - o Illinois Family Violence Coordinating Councils; 23 judicial circuits in Illinois work on improving the criminal justice and social systems response to family violence.
 - o Choose Respect: promotes healthy relationship skills for youth in community based collaborations

- Bullying Prevention: supports bullying prevention in schools and communities throughout Illinois.
- Collaborative Grants: assists new innovative violence prevention efforts in Illinois
- IVPA grants reach 30-40,000 Illinois children, youth, parents and professionals across Illinois annually.
- IVPA has a strong track record of good fiscal audits.
- IVPA violence prevention grants and technical assistance have supported local communities across that state for the last 15 years.

What is IVPA's budget?

- IVPA's total Appropriation?
 - FY12 - \$14.6 million (\$14,589,700)/GRF portion \$12.5 million (\$12,512,200)
 - FY13- \$4.5 million (\$4,476,500)/GRF: \$2.29 million (\$2,286,200)
- IVPA's Total budget: \$XXX (I believe the group wanted the total non-appropriated funds balance here. I will have this information tomorrow. The fiscal contracts manager is out sick today.)

What will happen to the funds that IVPA currently controls?

- The legislation mandates that all IVPA funds, included those originating from federal or other non-state grants, be transferred to ICJIA to be directed to violence prevention.

Will those funds still be used for violence prevention?

- Yes. The legislation requires that all IVPA funds be used only for the purposes for which they were originally intended.

IVPA employees

- IVPA currently has 20 employees. (Head count of 22)
- 5 employees oversee the NRI grants (Head count of 6)
- 2 employees are based in Springfield
Footnote: (IVPA employees are currently non-union employees, but most will likely be certified into the union at ICJIA.)

Will Springfield-based employees be forced to relocate? NO

Will moving IVPA to ICJIA save money?

- Merging the two agencies will eliminate redundancy. At a minimum, the merger will eliminate the need for an executive director. Barbara Shaw, the only ED that the IVPA has ever had, retired at the end of September and has not yet been replaced. There is at least one other vacant position that might not need to be filled. The combined savings of these two vacant positions (salary and benefits) is estimated at \$247-252,000. Other administrative efficiencies are expected but won't be known until the merger occurs.

Why should we transfer the remaining IVPA funding to ICJIA, an agency that deals primarily with law enforcement issues?

- The General Assembly has already made the decision to transfer the majority of IVPA violence prevention programs to ICJIA. This legislation updates the ICJIA statute to include the violence prevention programs that were included in the Illinois Violence Prevention Act.
- **Are NRI funds currently being spent by ICJIA? If so, what are some examples of what the money has been used for since ICJIA took over the program?**
 - No funds have yet been vouchered to any of the agencies.
 - Since the beginning of FY13, ICJIA has been working to implement NRI. Under guidance from the Governor's office, the plan is to continue three of NRI's four components:
 - A combination summer employment and mentoring program for youth; a parenting segment and in 9 of the 23 NRI communities, although using different models for the summer jobs program, the mentoring element and the parent program. ICJIA is in the process of completing contracts with the lead agencies in each community which are in turn, contracting with the agencies which will be providing services.
 - o Examples: ICJIA has entered into a contract with the Illinois African American Coalition for Prevention which has been assisting ICJIA in developing the new models for the program and will be coordinating training for all grantees and their sub-grantees as to the various components of the program.
 - o The new model for the Youth Employment Program will be placing youth in subsidized part-time employment with local businesses and companies, governmental agencies and officials and community organizations during the summer of 2013. ICJIA is being assisted in regard to the youth employment component by One Summer Chicago, a combined effort of the City of Chicago and Cook County in placing youth for employment.
 - o ICJIA is receiving technical assistance in regard to the creation of the mentoring portion of the program from Mentoring.org a national organization serving as parent organization to mentoring programs and organizations nationwide. ICJIA is partnering with Be Strong Families to use their Strengthening Families as a new model to assist parents in promoting protective factors to inhibit criminal behavior by their children.
 - o The reentry component is currently in operation.
 - o The Youth Employment Program and the Parent Program will not become active until April, 2013 but ICJIA is currently in the working with the lead agencies to implement the programs.

Why is ICJIA seeking to use the personnel from IVPA to run the violence prevention programs at ICJIA?

- ICJIA received \$15 million in new GRF funding for grants to community organizations for violence prevention programs and an additional \$5 million for grants to the Chicago Area Project, a lead agency in multiple communities. However, no funding was provided for staff necessary to administer the NRI program and ICJIA's current grant staff is entirely occupied with administering existing federal and state grants. ICJIA is requesting the transfer of IVPA personnel to allow ICJIA to administer the NRI grant funding. The current IVPA personnel are familiar with the programs and under ICJIA's management, will administer the grant funds and allow for the smooth transition of the program from IVPA to ICJIA.

What is the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative?

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative, created by Governor Quinn in the fall of 2010, has accomplished a great deal since its inception. This initiative was developed to help communities respond to the economic and social crises that seed violence.

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative was initiated in twenty (20) communities in the Chicago area and three (3) regions in the South Suburbs. NRI works through local lead agencies in a collaborative way to mitigate the factors that lead to violence in the community.

The goal of the Initiative is to reduce risk factors and promote protective factors associated with violence through:

1. Creation of jobs for community youth, adults and professionals that promote community wellness and healthy behaviors, youth and parent leadership, and healthy, caring community environments.
2. Provision of a wide range of community-based services for youth and young adults including: social, emotional and job skill development; case management, trauma-informed counseling for students in need of early intervention; mentoring; reentry services; and tutoring and other school supports that enhance young people's ability to succeed in school, in their community and in life.

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative works through Lead Agencies that are responsible for managing the Initiative in their community and partnering and subcontracting with other community organizations to implement the various program components. Considerable technical assistance and support will be provided to the Lead Agencies and their community partners to assist the communities in implementation of the various program component models.

What has the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative accomplished?

YEAR ONE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- **Twenty-three Lead Agencies** were empowered to build and lead local partnerships that **engaged over 190 community agencies and faith-based groups** in youth development, violence prevention and community-capacity building efforts.
- **Over 3,300 full and part-time jobs were created** that employed youth, parents and community professionals in **jobs within the community**.

- **Over 18,000 children, youth and parents were served** through programs that offered job experience, mentoring, counseling, case management, youth development, parent leadership and reentry services.
- **Funding mechanisms were implemented that promoted accountability** within communities as well as the State for responsible use of resources. Local Advisory Committees and Lead Agencies worked together to select partners, enter into and monitor subcontracts, and oversee the implementation of NRI programs in the community.
- **An on-line NRI Database was launched** which allowed local agencies to begin capturing data. **An evaluation team from the UIC Institute for Juvenile Research was retained** to assist in data analysis and outcome reporting for NRI.
- **Evaluation measures were developed** that allowed for rapid review of the program models.
- **Policy makers and community leaders** have worked together in supporting NRI and are committed to sustain the program over time.

Will NRI continue to exist?

- Yes, funding for NRI program was transferred to ICJIA at the beginning of FY13. The functions of IVPA and its employees will continue under ICJIA.

Audit

Background of the audit

The Auditor General is currently conducting a performance audit of the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative per HR 1110 that was adopted last May.

What if the audit comes back with some horrific finding, who is responsible?

- The NRI staff that are currently at IVPA will move to ICJIA. Any audit findings will inform the ICJIA management and board in its oversight of the NRI program.
- Any audit findings of the NRI program will likely be against IVPA as the agency that administered the program. However, because the program will transfer to ICJIA, ICJIA will likely be responsible for providing a response to the audit findings and explaining how it will resolve the issues identified to avoid future audit findings.

What impact will this have on the audit?

- None that we are aware of. All the staff and records of NRI at IVPA will go to ICJIA.

Who will be accountable for the audit findings?

- Any audit findings of the NRI program will likely be against IVPA as the agency that administered

the program. However, because the program will transfer to ICJIA, ICJIA will likely be responsible for providing a response to the audit findings and explaining how it will resolve the issues identified to avoid future audit findings.

Will the audit findings transfer to ICJIA?

- Yes

Is this just an attempt by IVPA to dodge responsibility for the audit?

- IVPA has a good track record of providing grants to communities for over 15 years. They have had good fiscal audits over the course of its 15 year history. The only material finding was that IVPA needed to create grant administrative rules and they did.
- The NRI staff that are currently at IVPA will move to ICJIA. Any audit findings will inform the ICJIA management and board in its management of the NRI program.

FAQ for House Bill 3816 as amended

What does HB 3816 do?

Senate Amendment 1 to HB 3816 eliminates government waste and redundancy by consolidating the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority (IVPA) into the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority (ICJIA).

Provisions of Senate Amendment 1 to HB 3816:

- Creates a new “Violence Prevention Section” within ICJIA, with the express purpose of coordinating statewide violence prevention efforts and developing a statewide plan that includes public health and public safety approaches to violence prevention in families, communities, and schools.
- Incorporates the original responsibilities of IVPA into ICJIA’s authorized powers, duties, and responsibilities.
- Adds 2 new members to ICJIA that were previously represented on the IVPA Board: (1) the Director of the Department of Public Health and (2) the Director of The Department of Children and Family Services.
- The ICJIA will create a standing committee through rules that will mirror the public membership of the current IVPA board.
- Transfers all funds currently available to IVPA into new funds controlled by ICJIA, including placing the majority of violence prevention programs under IVPA under the jurisdiction of ICJIA to avoid duplication.
- Requires that all unexpended balances transferred to ICJIA by this act may only be expended by the Authority for the purpose for which the appropriation was originally made.
- Transfers personnel of IVPA to ICJIA to maintain grant review continuity.

Why is it needed?

Last May, the General Assembly moved GRF funding for the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative to ICJIA for FY 13. The NRI grant comprised nearly 70 % of IVPA appropriation last fiscal year.

As the IVPA, ICJIA, the Attorney General’s and Governor’s offices have been working over the last few months to transfer the NRI staff to ICJIA, a number of logistical issues arose. For instance, the General Assembly appropriated funds to ICJIA for NRI grants but not for staff to oversee the grants, hence there were no dollars to pay grant monitoring staff for the NRI at ICJIA.

After considering an intergovernmental agreement to pay for the NRI staff, the most logical option was to consolidate all the violence prevention programs under ICJIA.

In addition, it did not seem prudent to have two state agencies administer violence prevention programs. It was determined that it would be simpler, would streamline the programming, and create cost savings to eliminate IVPA and move all the funding and staff (NRI plus regular IVPA funds and staff) to ICJIA.

(Footnote: ICJIA is a state agency dedicated to improving the administration of criminal justice. The Authority brings together key leaders from the justice system and the public to identify critical issues facing the criminal justice system in Illinois, and to propose and evaluate policies, programs, and legislation that address those issues. The statutory responsibilities of the Authority fit into four areas: grants administration; research and analysis; policy and planning; and information systems and technology.)

Cost Savings Info: IVPA Director position is currently budgeted for \$95,000 with current FY 13 retirement (37.98%), social security (7.65%) and health insurance (estimated at \$24,000). Total estimated savings=\$162,000

If we were to fill NRI program developer position it would be approximately 42-45,000 with associated FY 13 retirement, social security and health insurance. Total estimated savings=\$85,000-90,000

Estimated grand total=\$247,000-252,000

Whose initiative is SB 3816?

The Attorney General's

ROLE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

What is the AG's interest's in this legislation?

- As co-chair of IVPA and on the board of ICJIA the AG's Office, has been working with the Governor's Office and IDPH over the last few months to finalize the transfer of the NRI staff to ICJIA. There were a number of hurdles to accomplish this because of the way the NRI Appropriation to ICJIA was written. It was determined that consolidating all of the violence prevention grant programs into one agency would reduce redundancy in government and create costs savings.
 - o Specific problem was the logistics of having staff from one agency oversee a program funded under another agency.

Was NRI an initiative of the AG?

- NO

Was the transfer of NRI to ICJIA an initiative of the AG?

- NO. It was initiated by members of the General Assembly during the budget process last session.
- (*Footnote: The House not only initiated the move of NRI funding to ICJIA but it also passed a resolution asking the Auditor General to conduct a performance audit of the NRI program.*)

When/how did the AG initiate the IVPA move to ICJIA?

- Last May, the General Assembly moved the GRF funding for the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative to ICJIA for FY 13. The NRI appropriation comprised nearly 70 % of IVPA appropriation last fiscal year.
- As the IVPA, ICJIA, IDPH, the Attorney General's and Governor's offices have been working over the last few months to transfer the NRI staff to ICJIA, a number of logistical issues arose. For instance, the General Assembly appropriated funds to ICJIA for NRI grants but not for staff to oversee the grants, hence there were no dollars to pay grant monitoring staff for the NRI at ICJIA.

IVPA Q & A:

Will IVPA continue to exist?

IVPA will no longer operate as an independent agency, however, IVPA's programs and employees will continue to implement and monitor violence prevention grant programs in the newly formed violence prevention grants unit within ICJIA.

What is IVPA?

The Illinois Violence Prevention Authority.

Established by the Illinois Violence Prevention Act of 1995, the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority (IVPA) is the only state agency dedicated to violence prevention in the United States.

- Primary role has been grant making to community based agencies across Illinois for violence prevention.
- Developed innovative and needed violence prevention programming such as:
 - o Safe From the Start: serving young children (ages 0—5) exposed to violence such as domestic and community violence
 - o Illinois Health Cares: Improves local health systems' capacities to respond to domestic violence, elder abuse and sexual assault.
 - o Illinois Family Violence Coordinating Councils; 23 judicial circuits in Illinois work on improving the criminal justice and social systems response to family violence.
 - o Choose Respect: promotes healthy relationship skills for youth in community based collaborations

- Bullying Prevention: supports bullying prevention in schools and communities throughout Illinois.
- Collaborative Grants: assists new innovative violence prevention efforts in Illinois
- IVPA grants reach 30-40,000 Illinois children, youth, parents and professionals across Illinois annually.
- IVPA has a strong track record of good fiscal audits.
- IVPA violence prevention grants and technical assistance have supported local communities across that state for the last 15 years.

What is IVPA's budget?

- IVPA's total Appropriation?
 - FY12 - \$14.6 million (\$14,589,700)/GRF portion \$12.5 million (\$12,512,200)
 - FY13- \$4.5 million (\$4,476,500)/GRF: \$2.29 million (\$2,286,200)
- IVPA's Total budget: ~~XXXX~~

What will happen to the funds that IVPA currently controls?

- The legislation mandates that all IVPA funds, included those originating from federal or other non-state grants, be transferred to ICJIA to be directed to violence prevention.

Will those funds still be used for violence prevention?

- Yes. The legislation requires that all IVPA funds be used only for the purposes for which they were originally intended.

IVPA employees

- IVPA currently has 20 employees. (Head count of 22)
- 5 employees oversee the NRI grants (Head count of 6)
- 2 employees are based in Springfield
Footnote: (IVPA employees are currently non-union employees, but most will likely be certified into the union at ICJIA.)

Will Springfield-based employees be forced to relocate? NO

Will moving IVPA to ICJIA save money?

- Merging the two agencies will eliminate redundancy. At a minimum, the merger will eliminate the need for an executive director. Barbara Shaw, the only ED that the IVPA has ever had, retired at the end of September and has not yet been replaced. There is at least one other vacant position that might not need to be filled. The combined savings of these two vacant positions (salary and benefits) is estimated at \$247-252,000. Other administrative efficiencies are expected but won't be known until the merger occurs.

Why should we transfer the remaining IVPA funding to ICJIA, an agency that deals primarily with law enforcement issues?

- The General Assembly has already made the decision to transfer the majority of IVPA violence prevention programs to ICJIA. This legislation updates the ICJIA statute to include the violence prevention programs that were included in the Illinois Violence Prevention Act.
- **Are NRI funds currently being spent by ICJIA? If so, what are some examples of what the money has been used for since ICJIA took over the program?**
 - No funds have yet been vouchered to any of the agencies.
 - Since the beginning of FY13, ICJIA has been working to implement NRI. Under guidance from the Governor's office, the plan is to continue three of NRI's four components:
 - A combination summer employment and mentoring program for youth; a parenting segment and in 9 of the 23 NRI communities, although using different models for the summer jobs program, the mentoring element and the parent program. ICJIA is in the process of completing contracts with the lead agencies in each community which are in turn, contracting with the agencies which will be providing services.
 - o Examples: ICJIA has entered into a contract with the Illinois African American Coalition for Prevention which has been assisting ICJIA in developing the new models for the program and will be coordinating training for all grantees and their sub-grantees as to the various components of the program.
 - o The new model for the Youth Employment Program will be placing youth in subsidized part-time employment with local businesses and companies, governmental agencies and officials and community organizations during the summer of 2013. ICJIA is being assisted in regard to the youth employment component by One Summer Chicago, a combined effort of the City of Chicago and Cook County in placing youth for employment.
 - o ICJIA is receiving technical assistance in regard to the creation of the mentoring portion of the program from Mentoring.org a national organization serving as parent organization to mentoring programs and organizations nationwide. ICJIA is partnering with Be Strong Families to use their Strengthening Families as a new model to assist parents in promoting protective factors to inhibit criminal behavior by their children.
 - o The reentry component is currently in operation.
 - o The Youth Employment Program and the Parent Program will not become active until April, 2013 but ICJIA is currently in the working with the lead agencies to implement the programs.

Why is ICJIA seeking to use the personnel from IVPA to run the violence prevention programs at ICJIA?

- ICJIA received \$15 million in new GRF funding for grants to community organizations for violence prevention programs and an additional \$5 million for grants to the Chicago

Area Project, a lead agency in multiple communities. However, no funding was provided for staff necessary to administer the NRI program and ICJIA's current grant staff is entirely occupied with administering existing federal and state grants. ICJIA is requesting the transfer of IVPA personnel to allow ICJIA to administer the NRI grant funding. The current IVPA personnel are familiar with the programs and under ICJIA's management, will administer the grant funds and allow for the smooth transition of the program from IVPA to ICJIA.

What is the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative?

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative, created by Governor Quinn in the fall of 2010, has accomplished a great deal since its inception. This initiative was developed to help communities respond to the economic and social crises that seed violence.

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative was initiated in twenty (20) communities in the Chicago area and three (3) regions in the South Suburbs. NRI works through local lead agencies in a collaborative way to mitigate the factors that lead to violence in the community.

The goal of the Initiative is to reduce risk factors and promote protective factors associated with violence through:

1. Creation of jobs for community youth, adults and professionals that promote community wellness and healthy behaviors, youth and parent leadership, and healthy, caring community environments.
2. Provision of a wide range of community-based services for youth and young adults including: social, emotional and job skill development; case management, trauma-informed counseling for students in need of early intervention; mentoring; reentry services; and tutoring and other school supports that enhance young people's ability to succeed in school, in their community and in life.

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative works through Lead Agencies that are responsible for managing the Initiative in their community and partnering and subcontracting with other community organizations to implement the various program components. Considerable technical assistance and support will be provided to the Lead Agencies and their community partners to assist the communities in implementation of the various program component models.

What has the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative accomplished?

YEAR ONE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- **Twenty-three Lead Agencies** were empowered to build and lead local partnerships that **engaged over 190 community agencies and faith-based groups** in youth development, violence prevention and community-capacity building efforts.
- **Over 3,300 full and part-time jobs were created** that employed youth, parents and community professionals in **jobs within the community**.
- **Over 18,000 children, youth and parents were served** through programs that offered job experience, mentoring, counseling, case management, youth development, parent leadership and reentry services.
- **Funding mechanisms were implemented that promoted accountability** within communities as well as the State for responsible use of resources. Local Advisory Committees and Lead Agencies worked together to select partners, enter into and monitor subcontracts, and oversee the implementation of NRI programs in the community.
- **An on-line NRI Database was launched** which allowed local agencies to begin capturing data. **An evaluation team from the UIC Institute for Juvenile Research was retained** to assist in data analysis and outcome reporting for NRI.
- **Evaluation measures were developed** that allowed for rapid review of the program models.
- **Policy makers and community leaders** have worked together in supporting NRI and are committed to sustain the program over time.

Will NRI continue to exist?

- Yes, funding for NRI program was transferred to ICJIA at the beginning of FY13. The functions of IVPA and its employees will continue under ICJIA.

Audit

Background of the audit

The Auditor General is currently conducting a performance audit of the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative per HR 1110 that was adopted last May.

What if the audit comes back with some horrific finding, who is responsible?

- The NRI staff that are currently at IVPA will move to ICJIA. Any audit findings will inform the ICJIA management and board in its oversight of the NRI program.
- Any audit findings of the NRI program will likely be against IVPA as the agency that administered the program. However, because the program will transfer to ICJIA, ICJIA will likely be responsible for providing a response to the audit findings and explaining how it will resolve the issues identified to avoid future audit findings.

What impact will this have on the audit?

- None that we are aware of. All the staff and records of NRI at IVPA will go to ICJIA.

Who will be accountable for the audit findings?

- Any audit findings of the NRI program will likely be against IVPA as the agency that administered the program. However, because the program will transfer to ICJIA, ICJIA will likely be responsible for providing a response to the audit findings and explaining how it will resolve the issues identified to avoid future audit findings.

Will the audit findings transfer to ICJIA?

- Yes

Is this just an attempt by IVPA to dodge responsibility for the audit?

- IVPA has a good track record of providing grants to communities for over 15 years. They have had good fiscal audits over the course of its 15 year history. The only material finding was that IVPA needed to create grant administrative rules and they did.
- The NRI staff that are currently at IVPA will move to ICJIA. Any audit findings will inform the ICJIA management and board in its management of the NRI program.

Mary/Anne:

How has our progress been re: recruiting Senators to testify re: the positive attributes of the NRI program?

Also, we should be prepared to be responsive to questions re: issues raised in the CNN piece: e.g. Bud Billiken parade, election/timing, and how this program is being reworded to include more "traditional" employment and mentoring situations.

Reshma/Jack, correct me if I'm wrong on any of these, but proposed responses are below:

Bud Billiken – The parade took place on a Saturday morning; Saturday is a regularly scheduled work day for the students who participated in that program. Additionally, the students received their paychecks on Saturdays. The students were paid their normal paychecks that day, for the violence prevention work that they performed both on the street and at the parade.

Election/timing – In the summer of 2010, there was a sense that violence and crime were spinning out of control in some of Chicago's hardest hit communities. There were six police officers shot and killed in 2010 - three of these in a period of weeks from May through July. The shocking, video-taped beating death of Fenger High School student Derrion Albert was still on people's minds. Community activists and residents were clamoring for action by their elected leaders. In July of 2010, Governor Pat Quinn heard these cries for action and appointed an Anti-violence Commission to look at the causes of violence and recommend solutions. The group was composed of people who had all personally been victims of violence. After a series of meetings in the affected areas of the City, the Anti-violence Commission recommended creation of a Neighborhood Recovery Initiative (NRI). The program focused on directly helping children and families and took direct aim at the risk factors associated with violence.

NRI success - We know there's still too much violence in our communities. However, if you talk to those involved in NRI, you can see it's made an impact and given people hope – and just as importantly skills they can build on. And in the last year, we know four fewer school children were killed in Chicago. As Father Michael Pflieger, of the Church of St. Sabina, one of the program's lead agencies, said, the overall success of NRI cannot be measured by Chicago's crime rate. "Let's not say because the NRI can't show evidence of crime being down that it's failed," Pflieger said. "No, I look at the NRI with the boots on the street and within the community that we're helping from getting worse."

"Traditional" employment/mentoring – Jack, can you provide any insight for this one.

Mary/Anne:

How has our progress been re: recruiting Senators to testify re: the positive attributes of the NRI program?

Also, we should be prepared to be responsive to questions re: issues raised in the CNN piece: e.g. Bud Billiken parade, election/timing, and how this program is being reworded to include more "traditional"

employment and mentoring situations.

Reshma/Jack, correct me if I'm wrong on any of these, but proposed responses are below:

Bud Billiken – The parade took place on a Saturday morning; Saturday is a regularly scheduled work day for the students who participated in that program. Additionally, the students received their paychecks on Saturdays. The students were paid their normal paychecks that day, for the violence prevention work that they performed both on the street and at the parade.

Election/timing – In the summer of 2010, there was a sense that violence and crime were spinning out of control in some of Chicago's hardest hit communities. There were six police officers shot and killed in 2010 - three of these in a period of weeks from May through July. The shocking, video-taped beating death of Fenger High School student Derrion Albert was still on people's minds. Community activists and residents were clamoring for action by their elected leaders. In July of 2010, Governor Pat Quinn heard these cries for action and appointed an Anti-violence Commission to look at the causes of violence and recommend solutions. The group was composed of people who had all personally been victims of violence. After a series of meetings in the affected areas of the City, the Anti-violence Commission recommended creation of a Neighborhood Recovery Initiative (NRI). The program focused on directly helping children and families and took direct aim at the risk factors associated with violence.

NRI success - We know there's still too much violence in our communities. However, if you talk to those involved in NRI, you can see it's made an impact and given people hope – and just as importantly skills they can build on. And in the last year, we know four fewer school children were killed in Chicago. As Father Michael Pflieger, of the Church of St. Sabina, one of the program's lead agencies, said, the overall success of NRI cannot be measured by Chicago's crime rate. "Let's not say because the NRI can't show evidence of crime being down that it's failed," Pflieger said. "No, I look at the NRI with the boots on the street and within the community that we're helping from getting worse."

"Traditional" employment/mentoring – Jack, can you provide any insight for this one.

Re: Success Stories

As a result of the effectiveness of the Governor's Neighborhood Recovery Initiative – M+J component, the Community Action Team Members (CATs) has been able to internalize the messages around (Health/Wellness) and empower the West Garfield Park community through peer to peer outreach. The program has allowed 80 youth, 16 Mentors, 3 Lead Coordinators, and 1 Administrative Coordinator to proactively seek and provide alternatives to the violence in our community. Below is a list of some of the results in which the Governor's Neighborhood Recovery Initiative has produced.

Chatrice Williams has become a true leader in every sense of the word by taking on the responsibility by providing information around health and wellness to peers. Ms. Williams became assertive and confident in approaching the so called hard to reach youth on the street corners with a message (It's ok to seek help !). Ms. Williams did not allow the personalities of others get in the way of fulfilling her obligations as a Community Action Team member. Prior to becoming a CAT member, Chatrice was not actively in school. As a result of her involvement with the program, she has return back to high school and completing her studies.

Astoria Griggs-Burns is intelligent, creative, and enjoys bringing out the best in her team members by providing support in overcoming personal challenges through inspiration and encouragement. Ms. Burns has enjoyed the pleasure of sharing with the Governor of the State of Illinois Pat Quinn, CNN, and a host of media outlets the affect the program has had on her life and the WGP Community. Ms. Burns is a honor roll student at George Westinghouse College Prep and plan to become a journalist.

Marcus Funches was living a very risky lifestyle, prior to becoming a CAT member. Selling drugs, violence, becoming a father, and not completing high school had become a reality for Marcus. Marcus came into the program in search of a opportunity to make some positive changes in his life and help the community by providing positive messages around health/wellness. Since joining the program, Mr. Funches has returned to school and pursuing his GED.

FAQ for House Bill 3816 as amended

What does HB 3816 do?

Senate Amendment 1 to HB 3816 eliminates government waste and redundancy by consolidating the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority (IVPA) into the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority (ICJIA).

Provisions of Senate Amendment 1 to HB 3816:

- Creates a new “Violence Prevention Section” within ICJIA, with the express purpose of coordinating statewide violence prevention efforts and developing a statewide plan that includes public health and public safety approaches to violence prevention in families, communities, and schools.
- Incorporates the original responsibilities of IVPA into ICJIA’s authorized powers, duties, and responsibilities.
- Adds 2 new members to ICJIA that were previously represented on the IVPA Board: (1) the Director of the Department of Public Health and (2) the Director of The Department of Children and Family Services.
- The ICJIA will create a standing committee through rules that will mirror the public membership of the current IVPA board.
- Transfers all funds currently available to IVPA into new funds controlled by ICJIA, including placing the majority of violence prevention programs under IVPA under the jurisdiction of ICJIA to avoid duplication.
- Requires that all unexpended balances transferred to ICJIA by this act may only be expended by the Authority for the purpose for which the appropriation was originally made.
- Transfers personnel of IVPA to ICJIA to maintain grant review continuity.

Why is it needed?

Last May, the General Assembly moved GRF funding for the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative to ICJIA for FY 13. The NRI grant comprised nearly 70 % of IVPA appropriation last fiscal year.

As the IVPA, ICJIA, the Attorney General’s and Governor’s offices have been working over the last few months to transfer the NRI staff to ICJIA, a number of logistical issues arose. For instance, the General Assembly appropriated funds to ICJIA for NRI grants but not for staff to oversee the grants, hence there were no dollars to pay grant monitoring staff for the NRI at ICJIA.

After considering an intergovernmental agreement to pay for the NRI staff, the most logical option was to consolidate all the violence prevention programs under ICJIA.

In addition, it did not seem prudent to have two state agencies administer violence prevention programs. It was determined that it would be simpler, would streamline the programming, and create cost savings to eliminate IVPA and move all the funding and staff (NRI plus regular IVPA funds and staff) to ICJIA.

(Footnote: ICJIA is a state agency dedicated to improving the administration of criminal justice. The Authority brings together key leaders from the justice system and the public to identify critical issues facing the criminal justice system in Illinois, and to propose and evaluate policies, programs, and legislation that address those issues. The statutory responsibilities of the Authority fit into four areas: grants administration; research and analysis; policy and planning; and information systems and technology.)

Cost Savings Info: IVPA Director position is currently budgeted for \$95,000 with current FY 13 retirement (37.98%), social security (7.65%) and health insurance (estimated at \$24,000). Total estimated savings=\$162,000

If we were to fill NRI program developer position it would be approximately 42-45,000 with associated FY 13 retirement, social security and health insurance. Total estimated savings=\$85,000-90,000

Estimated grand total=\$247,000-252,000

Whose initiative is SB 3816?

The Attorney General's

ROLE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

What is the AG's interest's in this legislation?

- As co-chair of IVPA and on the board of ICJIA the AG's Office, has been working with the Governor's Office and IDPH over the last few months to finalize the transfer of the NRI staff to ICJIA. There were a number of hurdles to accomplish this because of the way the NRI Appropriation to ICJIA was written. It was determined that consolidating all of the violence prevention grant programs into one agency would reduce redundancy in government and create costs savings.
 - o Specific problem was the logistics of having staff from one agency oversee a program funded under another agency.

Was NRI an initiative of the AG?

- NO

Was the transfer of NRI to ICJIA an initiative of the AG?

- NO. It was initiated by members of the General Assembly during the budget process last session.
- (*Footnote: The House not only initiated the move of NRI funding to ICJIA but it also passed a resolution asking the Auditor General to conduct a performance audit of the NRI program.*)

When/how did the AG initiate the IVPA move to ICJIA?

- Last May, the General Assembly moved the GRF funding for the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative to ICJIA for FY 13. The NRI appropriation comprised nearly 70 % of IVPA appropriation last fiscal year.
- As the IVPA, ICJIA, IDPH, the Attorney General's and Governor's offices have been working over the last few months to transfer the NRI staff to ICJIA, a number of logistical issues arose. For instance, the General Assembly appropriated funds to ICJIA for NRI grants but not for staff to oversee the grants, hence there were no dollars to pay grant monitoring staff for the NRI at ICJIA.
- After considering an intergovernmental agreement to pay for the NRI staff, the most logical option was to consolidate all the violence prevention programs under ICJIA.

IVPA Q & A:

Will IVPA continue to exist?

IVPA will no longer operate as an independent agency, however, IVPA's programs and employees will continue to implement and monitor violence prevention grant programs in the newly formed violence prevention grants unit within ICJIA.

What is IVPA?

The Illinois Violence Prevention Authority.

Established by the Illinois Violence Prevention Act of 1995, the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority (IVPA) is the only state agency dedicated to violence prevention in the United States.

- Primary role has been grant making to community based agencies across Illinois for violence prevention.
- Developed innovative and needed violence prevention programming such as:
 - o Safe From the Start: serving young children (ages 0—5) exposed to violence such as domestic and community violence
 - o Illinois Health Cares: Improves local health systems' capacities to respond to domestic violence, elder abuse and sexual assault.
 - o Illinois Family Violence Coordinating Councils; 23 judicial circuits in Illinois work on improving the criminal justice and social systems response to family violence.
 - o Choose Respect: promotes healthy relationship skills for youth in community based collaborations

- Bullying Prevention: supports bullying prevention in schools and communities throughout Illinois.
- Collaborative Grants: assists new innovative violence prevention efforts in Illinois
- IVPA grants reach 30-40,000 Illinois children, youth, parents and professionals across Illinois annually.
- IVPA has a strong track record of good fiscal audits.
- IVPA violence prevention grants and technical assistance have supported local communities across that state for the last 15 years.

What is IVPA's budget?

- IVPA's total Appropriation?
 - FY12 - \$14.6 million (\$14,589,700)/GRF portion \$12.5 million (\$12,512,200)
 - FY13- \$4.5 million (\$4,476,500)/GRF: \$2.29 million (\$2,286,200)
- IVPA's Total FY 13 budget: \$21.5 million (current balance in non appropriated fund 318 is 2.8 million as much of the special projects and NRI/SNW has been paid out in the last 6 months)
-

What will happen to the funds that IVPA currently controls?

- The legislation mandates that all IVPA funds, included those originating from federal or other non-state grants, be transferred to ICJIA to be directed to violence prevention.

Will those funds still be used for violence prevention?

- Yes. The legislation requires that all IVPA funds be used only for the purposes for which they were originally intended.

IVPA employees

- IVPA currently has 20 employees. (Head count of 22)
 - 5 employees oversee the NRI grants (Head count of 6)
 - 2 employees are based in Springfield
- Footnote: (IVPA employees are currently non-union employees, but most will likely be certified into the union at ICJIA.)

Will Springfield-based employees be forced to relocate? NO

Will moving IVPA to ICJIA save money?

- Merging the two agencies will eliminate redundancy. At a minimum, the merger will eliminate the need for an executive director. Barbara Shaw, the only ED that the IVPA has ever had, retired at the end of September and has not yet been replaced. There is at least one other vacant position that might not need to be filled. The combined savings of these two vacant positions (salary and benefits) is estimated at \$247-252,000. Other administrative efficiencies are expected but won't be known until the merger occurs.

Why should we transfer the remaining IVPA funding to ICJIA, an agency that deals primarily with law enforcement issues?

- The General Assembly has already made the decision to transfer the majority of IVPA violence prevention programs to ICJIA. This legislation updates the ICJIA statute to include the violence prevention programs that were included in the Illinois Violence Prevention Act.
- **Are NRI funds currently being spent by ICJIA? If so, what are some examples of what the money has been used for since ICJIA took over the program?**
 - No funds have yet been vouchered to any of the agencies.
 - Since the beginning of FY13, ICJIA has been working to implement NRI. Under guidance from the Governor's office, the plan is to continue three of NRI's four components:
 - A combination summer employment and mentoring program for youth; a parenting segment and in 9 of the 23 NRI communities, although using different models for the summer jobs program, the mentoring element and the parent program. ICJIA is in the process of completing contracts with the lead agencies in each community which are in turn, contracting with the agencies which will be providing services.
 - o Examples: ICJIA has entered into a contract with the Illinois African American Coalition for Prevention which has been assisting ICJIA in developing the new models for the program and will be coordinating training for all grantees and their sub-grantees as to the various components of the program.
 - o The new model for the Youth Employment Program will be placing youth in subsidized part-time employment with local businesses and companies, governmental agencies and officials and community organizations during the summer of 2013. ICJIA is being assisted in regard to the youth employment component by One Summer Chicago, a combined effort of the City of Chicago and Cook County in placing youth for employment.
 - o ICJIA is receiving technical assistance in regard to the creation of the mentoring portion of the program from Mentoring.org a national organization serving as parent organization to mentoring programs and organizations nationwide. ICJIA is partnering with Be Strong Families to use their Strengthening Families as a new model to assist parents in promoting protective factors to inhibit criminal behavior by their children.
 - o The reentry component is currently in operation.
 - o The Youth Employment Program and the Parent Program will not become active until April, 2013 but ICJIA is currently in the working with the lead agencies to implement the programs.

Why is ICJIA seeking to use the personnel from IVPA to run the violence prevention programs at ICJIA?

- ICJIA received \$15 million in new GRF funding for grants to community organizations for violence prevention programs and an additional \$5 million for grants to the Chicago

Area Project, a lead agency in multiple communities. However, no funding was provided for staff necessary to administer the NRI program and ICJIA's current grant staff is entirely occupied with administering existing federal and state grants. ICJIA is requesting the transfer of IVPA personnel to allow ICJIA to administer the NRI grant funding. The current IVPA personnel are familiar with the programs and under ICJIA's management, will administer the grant funds and allow for the smooth transition of the program from IVPA to ICJIA.

What is the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative?

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative, created by Governor Quinn in the fall of 2010, has accomplished a great deal since its inception. This initiative was developed to help communities respond to the economic and social crises that seed violence.

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative was initiated in twenty (20) communities in the Chicago area and three (3) regions in the South Suburbs. NRI works through local lead agencies in a collaborative way to mitigate the factors that lead to violence in the community.

The goal of the Initiative is to reduce risk factors and promote protective factors associated with violence through:

1. Creation of jobs for community youth, adults and professionals that promote community wellness and healthy behaviors, youth and parent leadership, and healthy, caring community environments.
2. Provision of a wide range of community-based services for youth and young adults including: social, emotional and job skill development; case management, trauma-informed counseling for students in need of early intervention; mentoring; reentry services; and tutoring and other school supports that enhance young people's ability to succeed in school, in their community and in life.

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative works through Lead Agencies that are responsible for managing the Initiative in their community and partnering and subcontracting with other community organizations to implement the various program components. Considerable technical assistance and support will be provided to the Lead Agencies and their community partners to assist the communities in implementation of the various program component models.

What has the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative accomplished?

YEAR ONE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- **Twenty-three Lead Agencies** were empowered to build and lead local partnerships that **engaged over 190 community agencies and faith-based groups** in youth development, violence prevention and community-capacity building efforts.
- **Over 3,300 full and part-time jobs were created** that employed youth, parents and community professionals in **jobs within the community**.
- **Over 18,000 children, youth and parents were served** through programs that offered job experience, mentoring, counseling, case management, youth development, parent leadership and reentry services.
- **Funding mechanisms were implemented that promoted accountability** within communities as well as the State for responsible use of resources. Local Advisory Committees and Lead Agencies worked together to select partners, enter into and monitor subcontracts, and oversee the implementation of NRI programs in the community.
- **An on-line NRI Database was launched** which allowed local agencies to begin capturing data. **An evaluation team from the UIC Institute for Juvenile Research was retained** to assist in data analysis and outcome reporting for NRI.
- **Evaluation measures were developed** that allowed for rapid review of the program models.
- **Policy makers and community leaders** have worked together in supporting NRI and are committed to sustain the program over time.

Will NRI continue to exist?

- Yes, funding for NRI program was transferred to ICJIA at the beginning of FY13. The functions of IVPA and its employees will continue under ICJIA.

Audit

Background of the audit

The Auditor General is currently conducting a performance audit of the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative per HR 1110 that was adopted last May.

What if the audit comes back with some horrific finding, who is responsible?

- The NRI staff that are currently at IVPA will move to ICJIA. Any audit findings will inform the ICJIA management and board in its oversight of the NRI program.
- Any audit findings of the NRI program will likely be against IVPA as the agency that administered the program. However, because the program will transfer to ICJIA, ICJIA will likely be responsible for providing a response to the audit findings and explaining how it will resolve the issues identified to avoid future audit findings.

What impact will this have on the audit?

- None that we are aware of. All the staff and records of NRI at IVPA will go to ICJIA.

Who will be accountable for the audit findings?

- Any audit findings of the NRI program will likely be against IVPA as the agency that administered the program. However, because the program will transfer to ICJIA, ICJIA will likely be responsible for providing a response to the audit findings and explaining how it will resolve the issues identified to avoid future audit findings.

Will the audit findings transfer to ICJIA?

- Yes

Is this just an attempt by IVPA to dodge responsibility for the audit?

- IVPA has a good track record of providing grants to communities for over 15 years. They have had good fiscal audits over the course of its 15 year history. The only material finding was that IVPA needed to create grant administrative rules and they did.
- The NRI staff that are currently at IVPA will move to ICJIA. Any audit findings will inform the ICJIA management and board in its management of the NRI program.

NRI Success Stories from North Lawndale: Better Boys Foundation

(this organization decided to not move forward with ICJIA funding. I do not know why. ICJIA may know, if it matters)

Dec 2011:

17 year old male arrested for attempted robbery. Shaquille was engaged in services at Better Boys Foundation, a NRI Lead Agency, in out-of-school time programming at BBF, which is how I actually met him late summer 2011. Clifford Nellis, Lead Attorney and Executive Director, Lawndale Christian Legal Center, had developed a professional connection with Shaquille prior to the arrest, and did not hesitate to agree to represent him in upcoming legal proceedings. Regretfully, Shaquille's photo was displayed, despite his age of 17, and no previous arrests. The BBF Program Director who oversees the out-of-school time program in which Shaquille was involved will speak to his character during the January 26 court appearance. Hopefully, these efforts and Shaquille's commitment will ensure that this is his last adverse encounter with the legal system, including the option for him to elect to participate in the Reentry services we offer as part of the NRI contract (contingent upon results of January 26 court proceedings). We are very fortunate that our NRI established a cohesive continuum of services, permitting rapid identification and mobilization of resources for Shaquille.

March 2012:

The shooting near 1500 S. Pulaski , North Lawndale community in Chicago occurred outside a NRI Lead Agency. NRI agency identified NRI resources for post-incident trauma counseling for the youngsters at the agency's out-of-school time programs, as well as post-trauma counseling training services for direct providers and other staff. Thanks to the NRI, our designated trauma-informed counselor was already prepared to assist us upon notification through the School-Based Counseling program service component. These essential services would not have been available with NRI and the children would not have had this support during this traumatic event.

FAQ for House Bill 3816 as amended

What does HB 3816 do?

Senate Amendment 1 to HB 3816 eliminates government waste and redundancy by consolidating the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority (IVPA) into the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority (ICJIA).

Provisions of Senate Amendment 1 to HB 3816:

- Creates a new “Violence Prevention Section” within ICJIA, with the express purpose of coordinating statewide violence prevention efforts and developing a statewide plan that includes public health and public safety approaches to violence prevention in families, communities, and schools.
- Incorporates the original responsibilities of IVPA into ICJIA’s authorized powers, duties, and responsibilities.
- Adds 2 new members to ICJIA that were previously represented on the IVPA Board: (1) the Director of the Department of Public Health and (2) the Director of The Department of Children and Family Services.
- The ICJIA will create a standing advisory committee, through rules, that will mirror the membership of the current IVPA board.
- Transfers all funds currently available to IVPA into new funds controlled by ICJIA, including placing the violence prevention programs under IVPA under the jurisdiction of ICJIA to avoid duplication.
- Requires that all unexpended balances transferred to ICJIA by this act may only be expended by the Authority for the purpose for which the appropriation was originally made.
- Transfers personnel of IVPA to ICJIA to maintain grant review continuity.

Why is it needed?

Last May, the General Assembly moved GRF funding for the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative to ICJIA for FY 13. The NRI grant comprised nearly 70 % of IVPA appropriation last fiscal year.

As the IVPA, ICJIA, the Attorney General’s and Governor’s offices have been working over the last few months to transfer the NRI staff to ICJIA, a number of logistical issues arose. For instance, the General Assembly appropriated funds to ICJIA for NRI grants but not for staff to oversee the grants, hence there were no dollars to pay grant monitoring staff for the NRI at ICJIA.

After considering an intergovernmental agreement to pay for the NRI staff—with nearly 70% of IVPA’s previous funding already transferred-- the most logical option was to consolidate all the violence prevention programs under ICJIA.

In addition, it did not seem prudent to have two state agencies administer violence prevention programs. It was determined that it would be simpler, would streamline the programming, and create cost savings to eliminate IVPA and move all the funding and staff (NRI plus regular IVPA funds and staff) to ICJIA.

(Footnote: ICJIA is a state agency dedicated to improving the administration of criminal justice. The Authority brings together key leaders from the justice system and the public to identify critical issues facing the criminal justice system in Illinois, and to propose and evaluate policies, programs, and legislation that address those issues. The statutory responsibilities of the Authority fit into four areas: grants administration; research and analysis; policy and planning; and information systems and technology.)

Whose initiative is SB 3816?

The Attorney General’s Office, working with the Governor’s Office

ROLE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

What is the AG’s interest’s in this legislation?

- As co-chair of IVPA and on the board of ICJIA, the AG’s Office has been working with the Governor’s Office and IDPH over the last few months to finalize the transfer of the NRI staff to ICJIA. There were a number of hurdles to accomplish this because of the way the NRI Appropriation to ICJIA was written. It was determined that consolidating all of the violence prevention grant programs into one agency would reduce redundancy in government and create costs savings.
 - o Specific problem was the logistics of having staff from one agency oversee a program funded under another agency.

Was NRI an initiative of the AG?

- NO, but it was carried out by the IVPA, which is co-chaired by the AG and the Director of IDPH

Was the transfer of NRI to ICJIA an initiative of the AG?

- NO. It was initiated by members of the General Assembly during the budget process last session.
- *(Footnote: The House not only initiated the move of NRI funding to ICJIA but it also passed a resolution asking the Auditor General to conduct a performance audit of the NRI program.)*

When/how did the AG initiate the IVPA move to ICJIA?

- Last May, the General Assembly moved the GRF funding for the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative to ICJIA for FY 13. The NRI appropriation comprised nearly 70 % of IVPA appropriation

- last fiscal year.
- As the IVPA, ICJIA, IDPH, the Attorney General's and Governor's offices have been working over the last few months to transfer the NRI staff to ICJIA, a number of logistical issues arose. For instance, the General Assembly appropriated funds to ICJIA for NRI grants but not for staff to oversee the grants, hence there were no dollars to pay grant monitoring staff for the NRI at ICJIA.

IVPA Q & A:

Will IVPA continue to exist?

IVPA will no longer operate as an independent agency, however, IVPA's programs and many of IVPA's employees will continue to implement and monitor violence prevention grant programs in the newly formed violence prevention grants unit within ICJIA.

What is IVPA?

The Illinois Violence Prevention Authority.

Established by the Illinois Violence Prevention Act of 1995:

- Primary role has been grant making to community based agencies across Illinois for violence prevention.
- Developed violence prevention programming such as:
 - o Safe From the Start: serving young children (ages 0—5) exposed to violence such as domestic and community violence
 - o Illinois Health Cares: Improves local health systems' capacities to respond to domestic violence, elder abuse and sexual assault.
 - o Illinois Family Violence Coordinating Councils; 23 judicial circuits in Illinois work on improving the criminal justice and social systems' response to family violence.
 - o Choose Respect: promotes healthy relationship skills for youth in community-based collaborations
 - o Bullying Prevention: supports bullying prevention in schools and communities throughout Illinois.
 - o Collaborative Grants: assists new innovative violence prevention efforts in Illinois
- IVPA grants reach 30-40,000 Illinois children, youth, parents and professionals across Illinois annually.
- IVPA violence prevention grants and technical assistance have supported local communities across that state for the last 15 years.

What is IVPA's budget?

- IVPA's total Appropriation?
 - o FY12 - \$14.6 million (\$14,589,700)/GRF portion \$12.5 million (\$12,512,200)
 - o FY13- \$4.5 million (\$4,476,500)/GRF: \$2.29 million (\$2,286,200)
- IVPA's Total budget: \$XXX

What will happen to the funds that IVPA currently controls?

- The legislation mandates that all IVPA funds, included those originating from federal or other non-state grants, be transferred to ICJIA to be directed to violence prevention.

Will those funds still be used for violence prevention?

- Yes. The legislation requires that all IVPA funds be used only for the purposes for which they were originally intended.

IVPA employees

- IVPA currently has 20 employees. (Head count of 22)
- 5 employees oversee the NRI grants (Head count of 6)
- 2 employees are based in Springfield
(IVPA employees are currently non-union employees, but most will likely be certified into the union at ICJIA.)

Will Springfield-based employees be forced to relocate? NO

Will moving IVPA to ICJIA save money?

- Merging the two agencies will eliminate redundancy. At a minimum, the merger will eliminate the need for an executive director. Barbara Shaw, the only ED that the IVPA has ever had, retired at the end of September and has not yet been replaced. There is at least one other vacant position that might not need to be filled. The combined savings of these two vacant positions (salary and benefits) is estimated at \$XXX,XXX. ICJIA will evaluate staffing needs and overlaps in responsibilities and back office functions. Other administrative efficiencies are expected but won't be known until the merger occurs.

Why should we transfer the remaining IVPA funding to ICJIA, an agency that deals primarily with law enforcement issues?

- The General Assembly has already made the decision to transfer the majority of IVPA violence prevention programs to ICJIA. This legislation updates the ICJIA statute to include the violence prevention programs that were included in the Illinois Violence Prevention Act.

ICJIA has a proven track record in issuing and monitoring grant programs.

- **Are NRI funds currently being spent by ICJIA? If so, what are some examples of what the money has been used for since ICJIA took over the program?**

- . - No funds have yet been vouchered to any of the agencies.
- Since the beginning of FY13, ICJIA has been working to implement NRI. Under guidance from the Governor's office, the plan is to continue three of NRI's four components:
- (i) A combination summer employment and mentoring program for youth; (ii) a parenting segment; and (iii) in 9 of the 23 NRI communities, using different models for the summer jobs program, the mentoring element and the parent program. ICJIA is in the process of completing contracts with the lead agencies in each community which are in turn, contracting with the agencies which will be providing services.
 - o Examples: ICJIA has entered into a contract with the Illinois African American Coalition for Prevention which has been assisting ICJIA in developing the new models for the program and will be coordinating training for all grantees and their sub-grantees as to the various components of the program.
 - o The new model for the Youth Employment Program will be placing youth in subsidized part-time employment with local businesses and companies, governmental agencies and officials and community organizations during the summer of 2013. ICJIA is being assisted in regard to the youth employment component by One Summer Chicago, a combined effort of the City of Chicago and Cook County in placing youth for employment.
 - o ICJIA is receiving technical assistance in regard to the creation of the mentoring portion of the program from Mentoring.org a national organization serving as parent organization to mentoring programs and organizations nationwide. ICJIA is partnering with Be Strong Families to use their Strengthening Families program as a new model to assist parents in promoting protective factors to inhibit criminal behavior by their children.
 - o The reentry component is currently in operation.
 - o The Youth Employment Program and the Parent Program will not become active until April, 2013 but ICJIA is currently in the working with the lead agencies to implement the programs.

Why is ICJIA seeking to use the personnel from IVPA to run the violence prevention programs at ICJIA?

- ICJIA received \$15 million in new GRF funding for grants to community organizations for violence prevention programs and an additional \$5 million for grants to the Chicago Area Project, a lead agency in multiple communities. However, no funding was provided for staff necessary to administer the NRI program and ICJIA's current grant staff is entirely occupied with administering existing federal and state grants. ICJIA is requesting the transfer of IVPA personnel to allow ICJIA to administer the NRI grant funding. The current IVPA personnel are familiar with the programs and under ICJIA's management, will administer the grant funds and allow for the smooth transition of the program from IVPA to ICJIA.

What is the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative?

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative, created by Governor Quinn in the fall of 2010, has accomplished a great deal since its inception. This initiative was developed to help communities respond to the economic and social crises that seed violence.

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative was initiated in twenty (20) communities in the Chicago area and three (3) regions in the South Suburbs. NRI works through local lead agencies in a collaborative way to mitigate the factors that lead to violence in the community.

The goal of the Initiative is to reduce risk factors and promote protective factors associated with violence through:

1. Creation of jobs for community youth, adults and professionals that promote community wellness and healthy behaviors, youth and parent leadership, and healthy, caring community environments.
2. Provision of a wide range of community-based services for youth and young adults including: social, emotional and job skill development; case management, trauma-informed counseling for students in need of early intervention; mentoring; reentry services; and tutoring and other school supports that enhance young people's ability to succeed in school, in their community and in life.

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative works through Lead Agencies that are responsible for managing the Initiative in their community and partnering and subcontracting with other community organizations to implement the various program components. Considerable technical assistance and support will be provided to the Lead Agencies and their community partners to assist the communities in implementation of the various program component models.

What has the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative accomplished?

YEAR ONE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- **Twenty-three Lead Agencies** were empowered to build and lead local partnerships that **engaged over 190 community agencies and faith-based groups** in youth development, violence prevention and community-capacity building efforts.
- **Over 3,300 full and part-time jobs were created** that employed youth, parents and community professionals in **jobs within the community**.
- **Over 18,000 children, youth and parents were served** through programs that offered job experience, mentoring, counseling, case management, youth development, parent leadership and reentry services.
- **Funding mechanisms were implemented that promoted accountability** within communities as well as the State for responsible use of resources. Local Advisory Committees and Lead Agencies worked together to select partners, enter into and monitor subcontracts, and oversee the implementation of NRI programs in the community.

- **An on-line NRI Database was launched** which allowed local agencies to begin capturing data. **An evaluation team from the UIC Institute for Juvenile Research was retained** to assist in data analysis and outcome reporting for NRI.
- **Evaluation measures were developed** that allowed for rapid review of the program models.
- **Policy makers and community leaders** have worked together in supporting NRI and are committed to sustain the program over time.

Will NRI continue to exist?

- Yes, funding for the NRI program was transferred to ICJIA at the beginning of FY13. The functions of IVPA and its employees will continue under ICJIA.

Audit

Background of the audit

The Auditor General is currently conducting a performance audit of the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative per HR 1110 that was adopted last May.

What if the audit comes back with some horrific finding, who is responsible?

- The NRI staff who are currently at IVPA will move to ICJIA. Any audit findings will inform the ICJIA management and board in its oversight of the NRI program.
- Any audit findings of the NRI program will likely be against IVPA as the agency that administered the program. However, because the program will transfer to ICJIA, ICJIA will be responsible for providing a response to the audit findings and explaining how it will resolve the issues identified to avoid future audit findings.

What impact will this have on the audit?

- None that we are aware of. All the staff and records of NRI at IVPA will go to ICJIA.

Who will be accountable for the audit findings?

- Any audit findings of the NRI program will likely be against IVPA as the agency that administered the program. However, because the program will transfer to ICJIA, ICJIA will be responsible for providing a response to the audit findings and explaining how it will resolve the issues identified to avoid future audit findings.

Will the audit findings transfer to ICJIA?

- Yes

Is this just an attempt by IVPA to dodge responsibility for the audit?

- IVPA has a good track record of providing grants to communities for over 15 years. It has had good fiscal audits over the course of its 15 year history. The only material finding was that IVPA needed to create grant administrative rules and they did.
- The NRI staff who are currently at IVPA will move to ICJIA. Any audit findings will inform the ICJIA management and board in its management of the NRI program.

FAQ for House Bill 3816 as amended

What does HB 3816 do?

Senate Amendment 1 to HB 3816 eliminates government waste and redundancy by consolidating the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority (IVPA) into the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority (ICJIA).

Provisions of Senate Amendment 1 to HB 3816:

- Creates a new “Violence Prevention Section” within ICJIA, with the express purpose of coordinating statewide violence prevention efforts and developing a statewide plan that includes public health and public safety approaches to violence prevention in families, communities, and schools.
- Incorporates the original responsibilities of IVPA into ICJIA’s authorized powers, duties, and responsibilities.
- Adds 2 new members to ICJIA that were previously represented on the IVPA Board: (1) the Director of the Department of Public Health and (2) the Director of The Department of Children and Family Services.
- The ICJIA will create a standing committee through rules that will mirror the public membership of the current IVPA board.
- Transfers all funds currently available to IVPA into new funds controlled by ICJIA, including placing the majority of violence prevention programs under IVPA under the jurisdiction of ICJIA to avoid duplication.
- Requires that all unexpended balances transferred to ICJIA by this act may only be expended by the Authority for the purpose for which the appropriation was originally made.
- Transfers personnel of IVPA to ICJIA to maintain grant review continuity.

Why is it needed?

Last May, the General Assembly moved GRF funding for the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative to ICJIA for FY 13. The NRI grant comprised nearly 70 % of IVPA appropriation last fiscal year.

As the IVPA, ICJIA, the Attorney General’s and Governor’s offices have been working over the last few months to transfer the NRI staff to ICJIA, a number of logistical issues arose. For instance, the General Assembly appropriated funds to ICJIA for NRI grants but not for staff to oversee the grants, hence there were no dollars to pay grant monitoring staff for the NRI at ICJIA.

After considering an intergovernmental agreement to pay for the NRI staff, the most logical option was to consolidate all the violence prevention programs under ICJIA.

In addition, it did not seem prudent to have two state agencies administer violence prevention programs. It was determined that it would be simpler, would streamline the programming, and create cost savings to eliminate IVPA and move all the funding and staff (NRI plus regular IVPA funds and staff) to ICJIA.

(Footnote: ICJIA is a state agency dedicated to improving the administration of criminal justice. The Authority brings together key leaders from the justice system and the public to identify critical issues facing the criminal justice system in Illinois, and to propose and evaluate policies, programs, and legislation that address those issues. The statutory responsibilities of the Authority fit into four areas: grants administration; research and analysis; policy and planning; and information systems and technology.)

Whose initiative is SB 3816?

The Attorney General's

ROLE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

What is the AG's interest's in this legislation?

- As co-chair of IVPA and on the board of ICJIA the AG's Office, has been working with the Governor's Office and IDPH over the last few months to finalize the transfer of the NRI staff to ICJIA. There were a number of hurdles to accomplish this because of the way the NRI Appropriation to ICJIA was written. It was determined that consolidating all of the violence prevention grant programs into one agency would reduce redundancy in government and create costs savings.
 - o Specific problem was the logistics of having staff from one agency oversee a program funded under another agency.

Was NRI an initiative of the AG?

- NO

Was the transfer of NRI to ICJIA an initiative of the AG?

- NO. It was initiated by members of the General Assembly during the budget process last session.
- *(Footnote: The House not only initiated the move of NRI funding to ICJIA but it also passed a resolution asking the Auditor General to conduct a performance audit of the NRI program.)*

When/how did the AG initiate the IVPA move to ICJIA?

- Last May, the General Assembly moved the GRF funding for the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative to ICJIA for FY 13. The NRI appropriation comprised nearly 70 % of IVPA appropriation last fiscal year.

- As the IVPA, ICJIA, IDPH, the Attorney General’s and Governor’s offices have been working over the last few months to transfer the NRI staff to ICJIA, a number of logistical issues arose. For instance, the General Assembly appropriated funds to ICJIA for NRI grants but not for staff to oversee the grants, hence there were no dollars to pay grant monitoring staff for the NRI at ICJIA.
- After considering an intergovernmental agreement to pay for the NRI staff, the most logical option was to consolidate all the violence prevention programs under ICJIA.

IVPA Q & A:

Will IVPA continue to exist?

IVPA will no longer operate as an independent agency, however, IVPA’s programs and employees will continue to implement and monitor violence prevention grant programs in the newly formed violence prevention grants unit within ICJIA.

What is IVPA?

The Illinois Violence Prevention Authority.

Established by the Illinois Violence Prevention Act of 1995, the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority (IVPA) is the only state agency dedicated to violence prevention in the United States.

- Primary role has been grant making to community based agencies across Illinois for violence prevention.
- Developed innovative and needed violence prevention programming such as:
 - o Safe From the Start: serving young children (ages 0—5) exposed to violence such as domestic and community violence
 - o Illinois Health Cares: Improves local health systems’ capacities to respond to domestic violence, elder abuse and sexual assault.
 - o Illinois Family Violence Coordinating Councils; 23 judicial circuits in Illinois work on improving the criminal justice and social systems response to family violence.
 - o Choose Respect: promotes healthy relationship skills for youth in community based collaborations
 - o Bullying Prevention: supports bullying prevention in schools and communities throughout Illinois.
 - o Collaborative Grants: assists new innovative violence prevention efforts in Illinois
- IVPA grants reach 30-40,000 Illinois children, youth, parents and professionals across Illinois annually.
- IVPA has a strong track record of good fiscal audits.
- IVPA violence prevention grants and technical assistance have supported local communities across that state for the last 15 years.

What is IVPA's budget?

- IVPA's total Appropriation?
 - o FY12 - \$14.6 million (\$14,589,700)/GRF portion \$12.5 million (\$12,512,200)
 - o FY13- \$4.5 million (\$4,476,500)/GRF: \$2.29 million (\$2,286,200)
- IVPA's Total budget: \$XXX

What will happen to the funds that IVPA currently controls?

- The legislation mandates that all IVPA funds, included those originating from federal or other non-state grants, be transferred to ICJIA to be directed to violence prevention.

Will those funds still be used for violence prevention?

- Yes. The legislation requires that all IVPA funds be used only for the purposes for which they were originally intended.

IVPA employees

- IVPA currently has 20 employees. (Head count of 22)
- 5 employees oversee the NRI grants (Head count of 6)
- 2 employees are based in Springfield
(IVPA employees are currently non-union employees, but most will likely be certified into the union at ICJIA.)

Will Springfield-based employees be forced to relocate? NO

Will moving IVPA to ICJIA save money?

- Merging the two agencies will eliminate redundancy. At a minimum, the merger will eliminate the need for an executive director. Barbara Shaw, the only ED that the IVPA has ever had, retired at the end of September and has not yet been replaced. There is at least one other vacant position that might not need to be filled. The combined savings of these two vacant positions (salary and benefits) is estimated at \$XXX,XXX. Other administrative efficiencies are expected but won't be known until the merger occurs.

Why should we transfer the remaining IVPA funding to ICJIA, an agency that deals primarily with law enforcement issues?

- The General Assembly has already made the decision to transfer the majority of IVPA violence prevention programs to ICJIA. This legislation updates the ICJIA statute to include the violence prevention programs that were included in the Illinois Violence Prevention Act.
- **Are NRI funds currently being spent by ICJIA? If so, what are some examples of what the money has been used for since ICJIA took over the program?**
 - No funds have yet been vouchered to any of the agencies.

- Since the beginning of FY13, ICJIA has been working to implement NRI. Under guidance from the Governor's office, the plan is to continue three of NRI's four components:
- A combination summer employment and mentoring program for youth; a parenting segment and in 9 of the 23 NRI communities, although using different models for the summer jobs program, the mentoring element and the parent program. ICJIA is in the process of completing contracts with the lead agencies in each community which are in turn, contracting with the agencies which will be providing services.
 - o Examples: ICJIA has entered into a contract with the Illinois African American Coalition for Prevention which has been assisting ICJIA in developing the new models for the program and will be coordinating training for all grantees and their sub-grantees as to the various components of the program.
 - o The new model for the Youth Employment Program will be placing youth in subsidized part-time employment with local businesses and companies, governmental agencies and officials and community organizations during the summer of 2013. ICJIA is being assisted in regard to the youth employment component by One Summer Chicago, a combined effort of the City of Chicago and Cook County in placing youth for employment.
 - o ICJIA is receiving technical assistance in regard to the creation of the mentoring portion of the program from Mentoring.org a national organization serving as parent organization to mentoring programs and organizations nationwide. ICJIA is partnering with Be Strong Families to use their Strengthening Families as a new model to assist parents in promoting protective factors to inhibit criminal behavior by their children.
 - o The reentry component is currently in operation.
 - o The Youth Employment Program and the Parent Program will not become active until April, 2013 but ICJIA is currently in the working with the lead agencies to implement the programs.

Why is ICJIA seeking to use the personnel from IVPA to run the violence prevention programs at ICJIA?

- ICJIA received \$15 million in new GRF funding for grants to community organizations for violence prevention programs and an additional \$5 million for grants to the Chicago Area Project, a lead agency in multiple communities. However, no funding was provided for staff necessary to administer the NRI program and ICJIA's current grant staff is entirely occupied with administering existing federal and state grants. ICJIA is requesting the transfer of IVPA personnel to allow ICJIA to administer the NRI grant funding. The current IVPA personnel are familiar with the programs and under ICJIA's management, will administer the grant funds and allow for the smooth transition of the program from IVPA to ICJIA.

What is the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative?

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative, created by Governor Quinn in the fall of 2010, has accomplished a great deal since its inception. This initiative was developed to help communities respond to the economic and social crises that seed violence.

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative was initiated in twenty (20) communities in the Chicago area and three (3) regions in the South Suburbs. NRI works through local lead agencies in a collaborative way to mitigate the factors that lead to violence in the community.

The goal of the Initiative is to reduce risk factors and promote protective factors associated with violence through:

1. Creation of jobs for community youth, adults and professionals that promote community wellness and healthy behaviors, youth and parent leadership, and healthy, caring community environments.
2. Provision of a wide range of community-based services for youth and young adults including: social, emotional and job skill development; case management, trauma-informed counseling for students in need of early intervention; mentoring; reentry services; and tutoring and other school supports that enhance young people's ability to succeed in school, in their community and in life.

The Neighborhood Recovery Initiative works through Lead Agencies that are responsible for managing the Initiative in their community and partnering and subcontracting with other community organizations to implement the various program components. Considerable technical assistance and support will be provided to the Lead Agencies and their community partners to assist the communities in implementation of the various program component models.

What has the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative accomplished?

YEAR ONE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- **Twenty-three Lead Agencies** were empowered to build and lead local partnerships that **engaged over 190 community agencies and faith-based groups** in youth development, violence prevention and community-capacity building efforts.
- **Over 3,300 full and part-time jobs were created** that employed youth, parents and community professionals in **jobs within the community**.
- **Over 18,000 children, youth and parents were served** through programs that offered job experience, mentoring, counseling, case management, youth development, parent leadership and reentry services.
- **Funding mechanisms were implemented that promoted accountability** within communities as well as the State for responsible use of resources. Local Advisory Committees and Lead Agencies worked together to select partners, enter into and monitor subcontracts, and oversee the implementation of NRI programs in the community.
- **An on-line NRI Database was launched** which allowed local agencies to begin capturing data. **An evaluation team from the UIC Institute for Juvenile Research was retained** to assist in data analysis and outcome reporting for NRI.

- **Evaluation measures were developed** that allowed for rapid review of the program models.
- **Policy makers and community leaders** have worked together in supporting NRI and are committed to sustain the program over time.

Will NRI continue to exist?

- Yes, funding for NRI program was transferred to ICJIA at the beginning of FY13. The functions of IVPA and its employees will continue under ICJIA.

Audit

Background of the audit

The Auditor General is currently conducting a performance audit of the Neighborhood Recovery Initiative per HR 1110 that was adopted last May.

What if the audit comes back with some horrific finding, who is responsible?

- The NRI staff that are currently at IVPA will move to ICJIA. Any audit findings will inform the ICJIA management and board in its oversight of the NRI program.
- Any audit findings of the NRI program will likely be against IVPA as the agency that administered the program. However, because the program will transfer to ICJIA, ICJIA will likely be responsible for providing a response to the audit findings and explaining how it will resolve the issues identified to avoid future audit findings.

What impact will this have on the audit?

- None that we are aware of. All the staff and records of NRI at IVPA will go to ICJIA.

Who will be accountable for the audit findings?

- Any audit findings of the NRI program will likely be against IVPA as the agency that administered the program. However, because the program will transfer to ICJIA, ICJIA will likely be responsible for providing a response to the audit findings and explaining how it will resolve the issues identified to avoid future audit findings.

Will the audit findings transfer to ICJIA?

- Yes

Is this just an attempt by IVPA to dodge responsibility for the audit?

- IVPA has a good track record of providing grants to communities for over 15 years. They have had good fiscal audits over the course of its 15 year history. The only material finding was that IVPA needed to create grant administrative rules and they did.
- The NRI staff that are currently at IVPA will move to ICJIA. Any audit findings will inform the

ICJIA management and board in its management of the NRI program.

Mary/Anne:

How has our progress been re: recruiting Senators to testify re: the positive attributes of the NRI program?

Also, we should be prepared to be responsive to questions re: issues raised in the CNN piece: e.g. Bud Billiken parade, election/timing, and how this program is being reworded to include more "traditional" employment and mentoring situations.

Reshma/Jack, correct me if I'm wrong on any of these, but proposed responses are below:

Bud Billiken – The parade took place on a Saturday morning; Saturday is a regularly scheduled work day for the students who participated in that program. Additionally, the students received their paychecks on Saturdays. The students were paid their normal paychecks that day, for the violence prevention work that they performed both on the street and at the parade.

Election/timing – In the summer of 2010, there was a sense that violence and crime were spinning out of control in some of Chicago's hardest hit communities. There were six police officers shot and killed in 2010 - three of these in a period of weeks from May through July. The shocking, video-taped beating death of Fenger High School student Derrion Albert was still on people's minds. Community activists and residents were clamoring for action by their elected leaders. In July of 2010, Governor Pat Quinn heard these cries for action and appointed an Anti-violence Commission to look at the causes of violence and recommend solutions. The group was composed of people who had all personally been victims of violence. After a series of meetings in the affected areas of the City, the Anti-violence Commission recommended creation of a Neighborhood Recovery Initiative (NRI). The program focused on directly helping children and families and took direct aim at the risk factors associated with violence.

NRI success - We know there's still too much violence in our communities. However, if you talk to those involved

in NRI, you can see it's made an impact and given people hope – and just as importantly skills they can build on. And in the last year, we know four fewer school children were killed in Chicago. As Father Michael Pflieger, of the Church of St. Sabina, one of the program's lead agencies, said, the overall success of NRI cannot be measured by Chicago's crime rate. "Let's not say because the NRI can't show evidence of crime being down that it's failed," Pflieger said. "No, I look at the NRI with the boots on the street and within the community that we're helping from getting worse."
