Constitutional Amendments Second Reading

H.J.R.C.A. 39 -- Ford --- Proposes to amend the Suffrage and Elections Article of the Illinois Constitution. Provides that no voting qualification or prerequisite to voting, or standard, practice, or procedure related to voting, shall be imposed or applied by the State or any political subdivision in a manner which results in a denial or abridgement of the right of any citizen of the State to vote on account of sex, sexual orientation, race, color, or status as a member of a language minority. Effective upon being declared adopted. **Short Debate (Read in Full a First Time)**

H.J.R.C.A. 51 -- Madigan --- Proposes to amend the Revenue Article of the Illinois Constitution. Provides that an additional income tax shall be imposed on individuals in an amount equal to 3% of the portion of the individual's income that is greater than \$1,000,000 for the taxable year. Provides that the revenue collected from the tax shall be distributed to school districts on a per pupil basis. Effective upon being declared adopted. **Short Debate (Read in Full a Third Time)**

Requests that the Department of Transportation erect signs in honor of the designation at the intersections of Cicero Avenue with West Roosevelt Road, West Lexington Street, West Harrison Street, West Jackson Boulevard, West Madison Street, West Washington Boulevard, West Maypole Avenue, West Lake Street, West Ferdinand Street, West Ohio Street, West Chicago Avenue, West Augusta Boulevard, West Division Street, West Hirsch street, West North Avenue, and West Grand Avenue on or before July 18, 2015. (Transportation, Regulation, Roads RBA)

H.R. 765 -- Sente --- Recognizes the 2014 Children's Grief Awareness Day. (Human Services RBA)

H.R. 770 -- Wheeler --- Urges the Illinois Department of Natural Resources to work with boat rental businesses, boating clubs, and other organizations to encourage Illinois boaters to participate in boating safety courses. (Agriculture & Conservation RBA)

H.R. 813 -- Smith --- Urges the Secretary of State to review the current policies regarding meter parking for those with disabilities and to consider options to make it more affordable and accessible. (State Government Administration RBA)

H.R. 881 -- Jackson - Welch --- Designates March 9, 2014 as Marvin E. Wiley Day in the State of Illinois. (State Government Administration RBA)
