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Order of Resolutions

- H.J.R. 24 -- Mah - Feigenholtz - Sommer - Ramirez - Gong-Gershowitz --- Supports, as a civil right, automatic citizenship to all qualifying children adopted by a U.S. citizen parent, regardless of the date on which the adoption was finalized. Condemns the deportation of individuals who were adopted into American homes and should have every expectation that their citizenship matches that of their adoptive parents. Welcomes legislation that will provide citizenship for all adult adoptees whose adoptive parents did not complete the naturalization process while they were children. (Adoption & Child Welfare RBA)
- H.R. 20 -- Bennett --- Urges restitution be paid to the victim before any court or law imposed cost, fine, fee, assessment, or other payment by the defendant is paid. (Judiciary - Criminal RBA)
- H.R. 34 -- Davis - Mayfield --- Recognizes the 40th anniversary of the United States Congress's enacting of the Taiwan Relations Act and reiterates support for a closer economic and trade partnership between the United States and Taiwan. (International Trade & Commerce RBA)
- H.R. 50 -- Bennett --- Condemns restrictive speech policies at institutions of higher education and urges those institutions with such policies in place to reverse their decisions. (Higher Education RBA)
- H.R. 57 -- McDermed --- Expresses support for efforts by the federal government and the telecommunication industry to stop the abuse of national telecommunication networks and the defrauding of citizens by deceitful robocalls and scam callers. (Consumer Protection RBA)

Order of Resolutions

H.R. 63 -- McDermed --- Encourages Illinois residents to visit cancerscreenweek.org for cancer screening resources and talk to their healthcare providers about their risk factors for all cancer types. Declares the first week of December 2019 as "Cancer Screen Week". Urges the Illinois General Assembly to take actions to evaluate current levels of funding for cancer screening in state medical assistance, public health, or standalone programs to ensure adequate funding is available for cancer screening and/or treatment services. Urges the Illinois General Assembly to identify and advance policies to increase rates of cancer screening and improve cancer screening awareness. (Health Care Availability & Access RBA)

H.R. 70 -- Villa - Ortiz - Conroy - Mazzochi - Spain --- Declares the month of March 2019 as Social Work Month in the State of Illinois. (Human Services RBA)

H.R. 74 -- Bristow --- States that Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer Program eligibility and funding should be broadened to further reduce barriers to breast screening, detection and treatment for underserved women to improve conditions for women to achieve optimal health, regardless of their race, ethnicity, or economic status. (Human Services RBA)
