(a) To conduct in-service training programs for teachers. 8 (b) At least once every 2 years at an in-service training 9 program or at another appropriate time when school personnel 10 are scheduled to be in attendance and in addition to other 11 12 topics covered at training throughout the school year, In 13 addition to other topics at in-service training programs, 14 school guidance counselors, teachers, school social workers,

and other school personnel who work with pupils in grades

kindergarten 7 through 12 and are employed by the school

- district shall be trained to identify the warning signs of 1
- mental illness and suicidal behavior in youth adolescents and 2
- 3 teens and shall be taught appropriate intervention and referral
- 4 techniques.
- 5 (c) School guidance counselors, nurses, teachers and other
- 6 school personnel who work with pupils may be trained to have a
- 7 knowledge of matters relating to acquired
- immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS), including the nature of the 8
- 9 disease, its causes and effects, the means of detecting it and
- 10 preventing its transmission, and the availability of
- 11 appropriate sources of counseling and referral, and any other
- information that may be appropriate considering the age and 12
- 13 grade level of such pupils. The School Board shall supervise
- 14 such training. The State Board of Education and the Department
- 15 of Public Health shall jointly develop standards for such

- "Domestic violence" means abuse by a family or household 18
- member, as "abuse" and "family or household members" are 19

- 23 of an adult or minor child proscribed in the Criminal Code of
- 24 1961 or the Criminal Code of 2012 in Sections 11-1.20, 11-1.30,
- 25 11-1.40, 11-1.50, 11-1.60, 12-7.3, 12-7.4, 12-7.5, 12-12,
- 12-13, 12-14, 12-14.1, 12-15, and 12-16, including sexual 26

violence committed by perpetrators who are strangers to the victim and sexual violence committed by perpetrators who are known or related by blood or marriage to the victim.

At least once every 2 years, an in-service training program for school personnel who work with pupils, including, but not limited to, school and school district administrators, teachers, school guidance counselors, school social workers, school counselors, school psychologists, and school nurses, must be conducted by persons with expertise in domestic and sexual violence and the needs of expectant and parenting youth and shall include training concerning (i) communicating with and listening to youth victims of domestic or sexual violence and expectant and parenting youth, (ii) connecting youth victims of domestic or sexual violence and expectant and parenting youth to appropriate in-school services and other agencies, programs, and services as needed, and implementing the school district's policies, procedures, and youth, protocols with regard to such including confidentiality. At a minimum, school personnel must be trained to understand, provide information and referrals, and address issues pertaining to youth who are parents, expectant parents, or victims of domestic or sexual violence.

(e) At least every 2 years, an in-service training program for school personnel who work with pupils must be conducted by persons with expertise in anaphylactic reactions and management.
