

## 100TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2017 and 2018 HB3692

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

220 ILCS 5/5-117

Amends the Public Utilities Act. Provides that certain supplier diversity goal reporting requirements shall not apply to alternative retail electric suppliers. Provides that alternative retail electric suppliers may satisfy certain reporting requirements by reporting the number of Illinois-based female-owned, minority-owned, veteran-owned, and small business enterprises engaged by the supplier. Provides that an alternative retail electric supplier may submit the required report on a confidential basis. Effective immediately or on the date certain provisions of Public Act 99-906 take effect, whichever is later.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Public Utilities Act is amended by changing

  Section 5-117 as follows:

- 8 Sec. 5-117. Supplier diversity goals.
- 9 (a) The public policy of this State is to collaboratively
  10 work with companies that serve Illinois residents to improve
  11 their supplier diversity in a non-antagonistic manner.
- (b) The Commission shall require all gas, electric, and 12 water companies with at least 100,000 customers under its 13 14 authority to submit an annual report by April 15, 2015 and every April 15 thereafter, in a searchable Adobe PDF format, on 15 16 all procurement goals and actual spending for female-owned, minority-owned, veteran-owned, and small business enterprises 17 in the previous calendar year. These goals shall be expressed 18 19 as a percentage of the total work performed by the entity 20 submitting the report, and the actual spending for all 21 female-owned, minority-owned, veteran-owned, and 22 business enterprises shall also be expressed as a percentage of the total work performed by the entity submitting the report. 23

- (1) an explanation of the plan for the next year to increase participation;
  - (2) an explanation of the plan to increase the goals;
- (3) the areas of procurement each company shall be actively seeking more participation in in the next year;
- (4) an outline of the plan to alert and encourage potential vendors in that area to seek business from the company;
- (5) an explanation of the challenges faced in finding quality vendors and offer any suggestions for what the Commission could do to be helpful to identify those vendors:
- (6) a list of the certifications the company recognizes;
- (7) the point of contact for any potential vendor who wishes to do business with the company and explain the process for a vendor to enroll with the company as a minority-owned, women-owned, or veteran-owned company; and
- (8) any particular success stories to encourage other companies to emulate best practices.
- (d) Each annual report shall include as much State-specific data as possible. If the submitting entity does not submit State-specific data, then the company shall include any national data it does have and explain why it could not submit

- 2 reports, if possible.
- 3 (e) Each annual report shall include the rules,
- 4 regulations, and definitions used for the procurement goals in
- 5 the company's annual report.

- 22 (a) The public policy of this State is to collaboratively
- 23 work with companies that serve Illinois residents to improve
- their supplier diversity in a non-antagonistic manner.
- 25 (b) The Commission shall require all gas, electric, and

water companies with at least 100,000 customers under its
authority, as well as suppliers of wind energy, solar energy,
hydroelectricity, nuclear energy, and any other supplier of
energy within this State, to submit an annual report by April
15, 2015 and every April 15 thereafter, in a searchable Adobe
PDF format, on all procurement goals and actual spending for
female-owned, minority-owned, veteran-owned, and small
business enterprises in the previous calendar year. These goals
shall be expressed as a percentage of the total work performed
by the entity submitting the report, and the actual spending
for all female-owned, minority-owned, veteran-owned, and small
business enterprises shall also be expressed as a percentage of
the total work performed by the entity submitting the report.

- (c) Each participating company in its annual report shall include the following information:
  - (1) an explanation of the plan for the next year to increase participation;
    - (2) an explanation of the plan to increase the goals;
  - (3) the areas of procurement each company shall be actively seeking more participation in in the next year;
  - (4) an outline of the plan to alert and encourage potential vendors in that area to seek business from the company;
  - (5) an explanation of the challenges faced in finding quality vendors and offer any suggestions for what the Commission could do to be helpful to identify those

1 vendors;

- 2 (6) a list of the certifications the company recognizes;
  - (7) the point of contact for any potential vendor who wishes to do business with the company and explain the process for a vendor to enroll with the company as a minority-owned, women-owned, or veteran-owned company; and
  - (8) any particular success stories to encourage other companies to emulate best practices.
  - (d) Each annual report shall include as much State-specific data as possible. If the submitting entity does not submit State-specific data, then the company shall include any national data it does have and explain why it could not submit State-specific data and how it intends to do so in future reports, if possible.
  - (e) Each annual report shall include the rules, regulations, and definitions used for the procurement goals in the company's annual report.
  - (f) The Commission and all participating entities shall hold an annual workshop open to the public in 2015 and every year thereafter on the state of supplier diversity to collaboratively seek solutions to structural impediments to achieving stated goals, including testimony from each participating entity as well as subject matter experts and advocates. The Commission shall publish a database on its website of the point of contact for each participating entity

- 2 each company recognizes from the information submitted in each
- 3 annual report. The Commission shall publish each annual report
- 4 on its website and shall maintain each annual report for at
- 5 least 5 years.
- 6 (g) For a supplier that is an alternative retail electric
- 5 supplier, as defined in Section 16-102 of this Act, subsections
- 8 (c) through (f) of this Section shall not apply. Subsection (b)
- 9 of this Section may be satisfied by an alternative retail
- 10 electric supplier by reporting the number of Illinois-based
- 11 female-owned, minority-owned, veteran-owned, and small
- 12 business enterprises engaged by the supplier. An alternative
- 13 retail electric supplier may submit this report on a
- 14 confidential basis.
