## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 50. The amount of \$500,000, or so much thereof as

- 5 Section 55. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof as
- 6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Private College
- 7 Academic Quality Assurance Fund to the Board of Higher
- 8 Education as supplemental support for costs and expenses
- 9 associated with the administration and enforcement of 110 ILCS
- 10 1005.
- 11 Section 60. The amount of \$550,000, or so much thereof as
- may be necessary, is appropriated from the Private Business and
- 13 Vocational Schools Quality Assurance Fund to the Board of
- 14 Higher Education as supplemental support for costs and expenses
- 15 associated with the administration and enforcement of the
- Private Business and Vocational Schools Act of 2012.
- 17 Section 65. The sum of \$5,500,000, or so much thereof as
- 18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the BHE Federal Grants
- 19 Fund to the Board of Higher Education to be expended under the
- 20 terms and conditions associated with the federal contracts and
- 21 grants moneys received.
