Makes appropriations for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Department of Military Affairs for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, as follows:

(o) Deposits to other funds.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 ARTICLE 1 Section 1. "Operational expenses" defined. For the 5 purposes of this Act, the term "operational expenses" includes 6 7 the following items: 8 (a) Personal Services; (b) State contributions to Social Security 9 (c) Group Insurances; 10 (d) Contractual Services 11 12 (e) Travel; 13 (f) Commodities; 14 (g) Printing; 15 (h) Equipment; (i) Electronic data processing; 16 (j) Telecommunications services; 17 18 (k) Operation of automotive equipment; 19 (1) Refunds; (m) Employee retirement contributions paid by the employer; 20 21 (n) Permanent improvements;

19	Section 10. The sum of \$16,000,000, or so much thereof as
20	may be necessary, is appropriated from the Federal Support
21	Agreement Revolving Fund to the Department of Military Affairs
22	Facilities Division for expenses related to Army National Guard
23	Facilities operations and maintenance as provided for in the

- 1 Cooperative Funding Agreements, including costs in prior years.
- 2 Section 15. The sum of \$10,000, or so much thereof as may
- 3 be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to
- 4 the Department of Military Affairs Office of the Adjutant
- 5 General Division for expenses related to the care and
- 6 preservation of historic artifacts.
- 7 Section 20. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
- 8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Military Affairs
- 9 Trust Fund to the Department of Military Affairs Office of the
- 10 Adjutant General Division to support youth and other programs,
- 11 provided such amounts shall not exceed funds to be made
- 12 available from public or private sources.
- 13 Section 25. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
- 14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Military
- 15 Family Relief Fund to the Department of Military Affairs Office
- of the Adjutant General Division for the issuance of grants to
- 17 persons or families of persons who are members of the Illinois
- 18 National Guard or Illinois residents who are members of the
- 19 armed forces of the United States and who have been called to
- 20 active duty as a result of the September 11, 2001 terrorist
- 21 attacks, including costs in prior years.

- Section 30. The sum of \$1,350,000, or so much thereof as
- 2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
- 3 to the Department of Military Affairs for deposit into the
- 4 Federal Support Agreement Revolving Fund.
- 5 Section 35. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as may
- 6 be necessary, is appropriated from the U.S.S. Illinois
- 7 Commissioning Fund to the Department of Military Affairs to
- 8 make grants to the U.S.S. Illinois Commissioning Committee.
- 9 Section 99. Effective Date. This Act takes effect July
- 10 1, 2017, if and only if Senate Bill 2063 of the 100th General
- 11 Assembly (the Unbalanced Budget Response Act), as introduced
- in the Illinois Senate, becomes law.
