SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

15 ILCS 20/50-22 25 ILCS 115/1

from Ch. 63, par. 14

Amends the General Assembly Compensation Act. Provides that beginning in 2018, and for each year thereafter, if the General Assembly fails to pass a balanced budget by June 30th of each year, the compensation to be paid to members of the General Assembly, including the additional sums payable to officers of the General Assembly, shall be withheld until a balanced budget is passed. Amends the State Budget Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. Removes the salary of members of the General Assembly from continuing appropriations provisions. Effective immediately.

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A BILL FOR

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AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The State Budget Law of the Civil Administrative
Code of Illinois is amended by changing Section 50-22 as
follows:

7 (15 ILCS 20/50-22)

8 Sec. 50-22. Funding for salaries of General Assembly
 9 members and judges; legislative operations.

10 (a) Beginning July 1, 2014, the aggregate appropriations 11 available for salaries for members of the General Assembly and 12 judges from all State funds for each State fiscal year shall be 13 no less than the total aggregate appropriations made available 14 for salaries for members of the General Assembly and judges for 15 the immediately preceding fiscal year.

16 (b) Beginning July 1, 2014, the aggregate appropriations available for legislative operations from all State funds for 17 each State fiscal year shall be no less than the total 18 19 aggregate appropriations made available for legislative operations for the immediately preceding fiscal year. For 20 21 purposes of this subsection (b), "legislative operations" 22 means any expenditure for the operation of the Office of the Auditor General, the House of Representatives, the Senate, the 23

Legislative Ethics Commission, the Office of the Legislative
 Inspector General, the Joint Committee on Legislative Support
 Services, and the legislative support services agencies.

4 (c) If for any reason the aggregate appropriations made
5 available are insufficient to meet the levels required by
6 subsections (a) and (b) of this Section, this Section shall
7 constitute a continuing appropriation of all amounts necessary
8 for these purposes. The General Assembly may appropriate lesser
9 amounts by law.

Section 10. The General Assembly Compensation Act is amended by changing Section 1 as follows:

13 (25 ILCS 115/1) (from Ch. 63, par. 14)

14 Sec. 1. Each member of the General Assembly shall receive 15 an annual salary of \$28,000 or as set by the Compensation Review Board, whichever is greater. The following named 16 17 officers, committee chairmen and committee minority spokesmen 18 shall receive additional amounts per year for their services as such officers, committee chairmen and committee minority 19 20 spokesmen respectively, as set by the Compensation Review Board 21 or, as follows, whichever is greater: Beginning the second 22 Wednesday in January 1989, the Speaker and the minority leader 23 of the House of Representatives and the President and the minority leader of the Senate, \$16,000 each; the majority 24

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leader in the House of Representatives \$13,500; 6 assistant 1 2 majority leaders and 5 assistant minority leaders in the 3 Senate, \$12,000 each; 6 assistant majority leaders and 6 assistant minority leaders in the House of Representatives, 4 5 \$10,500 each; 2 Deputy Majority leaders in the House of Representatives \$11,500 each; and 2 Deputy Minority leaders in 6 7 the House of Representatives, \$11,500 each; the majority caucus 8 chairman and minority caucus chairman in the Senate, \$12,000 9 each; and beginning the second Wednesday in January, 1989, the 10 majority conference chairman and the minority conference 11 chairman in the House of Representatives, \$10,500 each; 12 beginning the second Wednesday in January, 1989, the chairman and minority spokesman of each standing committee of the 13 14 Senate, except the Rules Committee, the Committee on 15 Committees, and the Committee on Assignment of Bills, \$6,000 16 each; and beginning the second Wednesday in January, 1989, the 17 chairman and minority spokesman of each standing and select committee of the House of Representatives, \$6,000 each. A 18 19 member who serves in more than one position as an officer, 20 committee chairman, or committee minority spokesman shall receive only one additional amount based on the position paying 21 22 the highest additional amount. The compensation provided for in 23 this Section to be paid per year to members of the General 24 Assembly, including the additional sums payable per year to 25 officers of the General Assembly shall be paid in 12 equal 26 monthly installments. The first such installment is payable on

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January 31, 1977. All subsequent equal monthly installments are 1 2 payable on the last working day of the month. A member who has 3 held office any part of a month is entitled to compensation for an entire month. Beginning in 2018, and for each year 4 5 thereafter, if the General Assembly fails to pass a balanced budget by June 30th of each year, the compensation provided in 6 7 this Section to be paid to members of the General Assembly, including the additional sums payable to officers of the 8 9 General Assembly, shall be withheld until a balanced budget is 10 passed.

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Mileage shall be paid at the rate of 20 cents per mile 11 12 before January 9, 1985, and at the mileage allowance rate in 13 effect under regulations promulgated pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 5707(b)(2) beginning January 9, 1985, for the number of actual 14 15 highway miles necessarily and conveniently traveled by the most 16 feasible route to be present upon convening of the sessions of 17 the General Assembly by such member in each and every trip during each session in going to and returning from the seat of 18 19 government, to be computed by the Comptroller. A member 20 traveling by public transportation for such purposes, however, shall be paid his actual cost of that transportation instead of 21 22 on the mileage rate if his cost of public transportation 23 exceeds the amount to which he would be entitled on a mileage basis. No member may be paid, whether on a mileage basis or for 24 25 actual costs of public transportation, for more than one such 26 trip for each week the General Assembly is actually in session.

Each member shall also receive an allowance of \$36 per day for 1 2 lodging and meals while in attendance at sessions of the General Assembly before January 9, 1985; beginning January 9, 3 1985, such food and lodging allowance shall be equal to the 4 5 amount per day permitted to be deducted for such expenses under the Internal Revenue Code; however, beginning May 31, 1995, no 6 7 allowance for food and lodging while in attendance at sessions 8 is authorized for periods of time after the last day in May of 9 each calendar year, except (i) if the General Assembly is 10 convened in special session by either the Governor or the 11 presiding officers of both houses, as provided by subsection 12 (b) of Section 5 of Article IV of the Illinois Constitution or (ii) if the General Assembly is convened to consider bills 13 14 vetoed, item vetoed, reduced, or returned with specific 15 recommendations for change by the Governor as provided in 16 Section 9 of Article IV of the Illinois Constitution. For 17 fiscal year 2011 and for session days in fiscal years 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, and 2018 only (i) the allowance 18 for lodging and meals is \$111 per day and (ii) mileage for 19 20 automobile travel shall be reimbursed at a rate of \$0.39 per mile. 21

Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, beginning in fiscal year 2012, travel reimbursement for General Assembly members on non-session days shall be calculated using the guidelines set forth by the Legislative Travel Control Board, except that fiscal year 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016,

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2017, and 2018 mileage reimbursement is set at a rate of \$0.39
 per mile.

If a member dies having received only a portion of the amount payable as compensation, the unpaid balance shall be paid to the surviving spouse of such member, or, if there be none, to the estate of such member.
