# SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

30 ILCS 517/5 30 ILCS 517/10 30 ILCS 517/25

Amends the Procurement of Domestic Products Act. Provides that purchasing agencies shall promote the purchase of and give preference to manufactured articles, materials, and supplies that have been manufactured in Illinois (currently, the United States). Provides that, if the purchasing agency determines that certain conditions apply to a procured product, then, with respect to that procurement, the purchasing agency shall give preference to manufactured articles, materials, and supplies that have been manufactured in the United States. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Procurement of Domestic Products Act is 5 amended by changing Sections 5, 10, and 25 as follows:

6 (30 ILCS 517/5)

7 Sec. 5. Definitions. As used in this Act:

"Component" and "cost of components" have the meanings 8 9 given to those terms in the federal Buy American Act of 1933. 10 "Manufactured in Illinois" means: (1) in the case of products that are not assembled articles, materials, or 11 12 supplies, that the product is mined or produced in Illinois; (2) in the case of assembled articles, materials, or supplies, 13 14 that design, final assembly, processing, packaging, testing, or other process that adds value, quality, or reliability 15 16 occurs in Illinois and the cost of components produced in Illinois exceeds 50% of the cost of all of the components; or 17 (3) that the product is a commercially available off-the-shelf 18 19 item.

20 "Manufactured in the United States" means: (1) in the case
21 of products that are not assembled articles, materials, or
22 supplies, that the product is mined or produced in the United
23 States; (2), in the case of assembled articles, materials, or

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supplies, that design, final assembly, processing, packaging, testing, or other process that adds value, quality, or reliability occurs in the United States <u>and the cost of</u> <u>domestic components exceeds 50% of the cost of all of the</u> <u>components; or (3) that the product is a commercially available</u> off-the-shelf item.

7 "Procured products" means assembled articles, materials,
8 or supplies purchased by a State agency.

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"Purchasing agency" means a State agency.

10 "State agency" means each agency, department, authority, 11 board, or commission of the executive branch of State 12 government, including each university, whether created by 13 statute or by executive order of the Governor.

14 "United States" means the United States and any place 15 subject to the jurisdiction of the United States.

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Sec. 10. <u>Domestic</u> <del>United States</del> products.

19 (a) Each purchasing agency making purchases of procured 20 products shall promote the purchase of and give preference to 21 manufactured articles, materials, and supplies that have been 22 manufactured in <u>Illinois</u> the United States. Procured products 23 manufactured in <u>Illinois</u> the United States shall be specified 24 and purchased unless the purchasing agency determines that any 25 of the following applies: HB4575

1 (1) The procured products are not manufactured in 2 <u>Illinois</u> the United States in reasonably available 3 quantities.

(2) The price of the procured products manufactured in
<u>Illinois</u> the United States exceeds by an unreasonable
amount the price of available and comparable procured
products manufactured outside <u>of Illinois</u> the United
States by 12% or more. To be eligible for an exemption
<u>under this paragraph (2), the purchasing agency must first</u>
<u>obtain a written waiver from the chief procurement officer</u>.

11 (3) The quality of the procured products manufactured 12 in <u>Illinois</u> the United States is substantially less than 13 the quality of the comparably priced, available, and 14 comparable procured products manufactured outside <u>of</u> 15 <u>Illinois</u> the United States.

16 (4) The purchase of the procured products manufactured
17 outside <u>of Illinois</u> the United States better serves the
18 public interest by helping to protect or save life,
19 property, or the environment.

(5) The purchase of the procured products is made in
 conjunction with contracts or offerings of
 telecommunications, fire suppression, security systems,
 communications services, Internet services, or information
 services.

(6) The purchase is of pharmaceutical products, drugs,
 biologics, vaccines, medical devices used to provide

1 medical and health care or treat disease or used in medical 2 or research diagnostic tests, and medical nutritionals 3 regulated by the Food and Drug Administration under the 4 federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act.

5 (b) If the purchasing agency determines that any of paragraphs (1) through (4) of subsection (a) applies to a 6 7 procured product, then, with respect to that procurement, the 8 purchasing agency shall give preference to manufactured 9 articles, materials, and supplies that have been manufactured 10 in the United States. In that case, procured products 11 manufactured in the United States shall be specified and 12 purchased unless the purchasing agency determines that any of 13 the following applies:

14 (1) The procured products are not manufactured in the
 15 United States in reasonably available quantities.

16 (2) The price of the procured products manufactured in 17 the United States exceeds the price of available and 18 comparable procured products manufactured outside the 19 United States by 12% or more. To be eligible for an 20 exemption under this paragraph (2), the purchasing agency 21 must first obtain a written waiver from the chief 22 procurement officer.

(3) The quality of the procured products manufactured
 in the United States is substantially less than the quality
 of the comparably priced, available, and comparable
 procured products manufactured outside the United States.

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1	(4) The purchase of the procured products manufactured
2	outside the United States better serves the public interest
3	by helping to protect or save life, property, or the
4	environment.
5	(5) The purchase of the procured products is made in
6	conjunction with contracts or offerings of
7	telecommunications, fire suppression, security systems,
8	communications services, Internet services, or information
9	services.
10	(6) The purchase is of pharmaceutical products, drugs,
11	biologics, vaccines, medical devices used to provide
12	medical and health care or treat disease or used in medical
13	or research diagnostic tests, and medical nutritionals
14	regulated by the Food and Drug Administration under the
15	federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act.
16	(c) In determining the price of procured products for
17	purposes of this Section, consideration shall be given to the
18	life-cycle cost, including maintenance and repair of those
19	procured products.

22	Sec. 25. Penalties. If a contractor is awarded a contract
23	through the use of a preference under this Act and knowingly
24	supplies procured products under that contract that are not
25	manufactured in <u>Illinois or</u> the United States, <u>as applicable,</u>

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1 then (i) the contractor is barred from obtaining any State 2 contract for a period of 5 years after the violation is 3 discovered by the purchasing agency, (ii) the purchasing agency 4 may void the contract, and (iii) the purchasing agency may 5 recover damages in a civil action in an amount 3 times the 6 value of the preference.
