1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 4658 2 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend House Bill 4658 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following: 3 "Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Sections 4 10-22.39 and 34-18.7 as follows: 5 6 (105 ILCS 5/10-22.39) 7 Sec. 10-22.39. In-service training programs. (a) To conduct in-service training programs for teachers. 8 (b) In addition to other topics at in-service training 9 programs, at least once every 2 years, licensed school 10 personnel and administrators school guidance counselors, 11 12 teachers, school social workers, and other school personnel who work with pupils in kindergarten grades 7 through grade 12 13 shall be trained to identify the warning signs of mental 14

illness and suicidal behavior in youth adolescents and teens

and shall be taught appropriate intervention and referral

1 techniques.

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- (c) School guidance counselors, nurses, teachers and other 2 3 school personnel who work with pupils may be trained to have a 4 basic knowledge of matters relating to acquired 5 immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS), including the nature of the 6 disease, its causes and effects, the means of detecting it and preventing its transmission, and the availability of 7 8 appropriate sources of counseling and referral, and any other 9 information that may be appropriate considering the age and 10 grade level of such pupils. The School Board shall supervise 11 such training. The State Board of Education and the Department of Public Health shall jointly develop standards for such 12 13 training.
 - (d) In this subsection (d):
- "Domestic violence" means abuse by a family or household member, as "abuse" and "family or household members" are defined in Section 103 of the Illinois Domestic Violence Act of 18 1986.
- "Sexual violence" means sexual assault, abuse, or stalking
 of an adult or minor child proscribed in the Criminal Code of
 1961 or the Criminal Code of 2012 in Sections 11-1.20, 11-1.30,
 11-1.40, 11-1.50, 11-1.60, 12-7.3, 12-7.4, 12-7.5, 12-12,
 12-13, 12-14, 12-14.1, 12-15, and 12-16, including sexual
 violence committed by perpetrators who are strangers to the
 victim and sexual violence committed by perpetrators who are

known or related by blood or marriage to the victim.

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At least once every 2 years, an in-service training program for school personnel who work with pupils, including, but not limited to, school and school district administrators, teachers, school guidance counselors, school social workers, school counselors, school psychologists, and school nurses, must be conducted by persons with expertise in domestic and sexual violence and the needs of expectant and parenting youth and shall include training concerning (i) communicating with and listening to youth victims of domestic or sexual violence and expectant and parenting youth, (ii) connecting youth victims of domestic or sexual violence and expectant and parenting youth to appropriate in-school services and other agencies, programs, and services as needed, implementing the school district's policies, procedures, and with regard to such vouth, including confidentiality. At a minimum, school personnel must be trained to understand, provide information and referrals, and address issues pertaining to youth who are parents, expectant parents, or victims of domestic or sexual violence.

- (e) At least every 2 years, an in-service training program for school personnel who work with pupils must be conducted by persons with expertise in anaphylactic reactions management.
- 24 (f) At least once every 2 years, a school board shall 25 conduct in-service training on educator teacher-student conduct, and school employee-student conduct 26

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     for all personnel.

Sec. 34-18.7. Youth Adolescent and teen mental illness and suicide detection and intervention. At least once every 2 years, licensed school personnel and administrators School quidance counselors, teachers, school social workers, and other school personnel who work with pupils in kindergarten grades 7 through grade 12 shall be trained to identify the warning signs of mental illness and suicidal behavior in youth adolescents and teens and shall be taught various intervention techniques. Such training shall be provided within the framework of existing in-service training programs offered by the Board or as part of the professional development activities required under Section 21-14 of this Code.
