SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

430 ILCS 66/60

Amends the Firearms Concealed Carry Act. Provides that for a new or renewal concealed carry license, the fee shall be \$100 (rather than \$150), of which \$80 (rather than \$120) shall be apportioned to the State Police Firearm Services Fund, \$15 (rather than \$20) shall be apportioned to the Mental Health Reporting Fund, and \$5 (rather than \$10) shall be apportioned to the State Crime Laboratory Fund. Effective immediately.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Firearm Concealed Carry Act is amended by
5 changing Section 60 as follows:

6 (430 ILCS 66/60)

7 Sec. 60. Fees.

8 (a) All fees collected under this Act shall be deposited as
9 provided in this Section. Application, renewal, and
10 replacement fees shall be non-refundable.

11 (b) An applicant for a new license or a renewal shall
12 submit \$100 ~~\$150~~ with the application, of which \$80 ~~\$120~~ shall
13 be apportioned to the State Police Firearm Services Fund, \$15
14 ~~\$20~~ shall be apportioned to the Mental Health Reporting Fund,
15 and \$5 ~~\$10~~ shall be apportioned to the State Crime Laboratory
16 Fund.

17 (c) A non-resident applicant for a new license or renewal
18 shall submit \$300 with the application, of which \$250 shall be
19 apportioned to the State Police Firearm Services Fund, \$40
20 shall be apportioned to the Mental Health Reporting Fund, and
21 \$10 shall be apportioned to the State Crime Laboratory Fund.

22 (d) A licensee requesting a new license in accordance with
23 Section 55 shall submit \$75, of which \$60 shall be apportioned

1 to the State Police Firearm Services Fund, \$5 shall be
2 apportioned to the Mental Health Reporting Fund, and \$10 shall
3 be apportioned to the State Crime Laboratory Fund.
