Expiration of driver's license. (a) Except as provided elsewhere in this Section, every 9 10 driver's license issued under the provisions of this Code shall expire 4 years from the date of its issuance, or at such later 11

date, as the Secretary of State may by proper rule and

regulation designate, not to exceed 12 calendar months; in the

event that an applicant for renewal of a driver's license fails

to apply prior to the expiration date of the previous driver's

license, the renewal driver's license shall expire 4 years from

1 the expiration date of the previous driver's license, or at such later date as the Secretary of State may by proper rule 2 3 and regulation designate, not to exceed 12 calendar months.

The Secretary of State may, however, issue to a person not previously licensed as a driver in Illinois a driver's license which will expire not less than 4 years nor more than 5 years from date of issuance, except as provided elsewhere in this Section.

- (a-5) Every driver's license issued under this Code to an applicant who is not a United States citizen or permanent resident shall be marked "Limited Term" and shall expire on whichever is the earlier date of the following:
- 13 (1) as provided under subsection (a), (f), (q), or (i) 14 of this Section; or
 - (2) on the date the applicant's authorized stay in the United States terminates; or
 - (3) if the applicant's authorized stay is indefinite and the applicant is applying for a Limited Term REAL ID compliant driver's license, one year from the date of issuance of the license.
 - (b) Before the expiration of a driver's license, except those licenses expiring on the individual's 21st birthday, or 3 months after the individual's 21st birthday, the holder thereof may apply for a renewal thereof, subject to all the provisions of Section 6-103, and the Secretary of State may require an examination of the applicant. A licensee whose driver's license

- expires on his 21st birthday, or 3 months after his 21st 1
- 2 birthday, may not apply for a renewal of his driving privileges
- 3 until he reaches the age of 21.
- 4 (c) The Secretary of State shall, 30 days prior to the
- 5 expiration of a driver's license, forward to each person whose
- license is to expire a notification of the expiration of said 6
- license which may be presented at the time of renewal of said 7
- 8 license.
- 9 There may be included with such notification information
- 10 explaining the anatomical gift and Emergency Medical
- 11 Information Card provisions of Section 6-110. The format and
- text of such information shall be prescribed by the Secretary. 12
- There shall be included with such notification, for a 13
- period of 4 years beginning January 1, 2000 information 14
- 15 regarding the Illinois Adoption Registry and
- 16 Information Exchange established in Section 18.1 of the
- 17 Adoption Act.
- (d) The Secretary may defer the expiration of the driver's 18
- license of a licensee, spouse, and dependent children who are 19
- 20 living with such licensee while on active duty, serving in the
- Armed Forces of the United States outside of the State of 2.1
- 22 Illinois, and 120 days thereafter, upon such terms and
- 23 conditions as the Secretary may prescribe.
- 24 The Secretary may defer the expiration of
- 25 driver's license of a licensee, or of a spouse or dependent
- children living with the licensee, serving as a civilian 26

- 1 employee of the United States Armed Forces or the United States
- Department of Defense, outside of the State of Illinois, and 2
- 120 days thereafter, upon such terms and conditions as the 3
- 4 Secretary may prescribe.
- 5 (e) The Secretary of State may decline to process a renewal
- 6 of a driver's license of any person who has not paid any fee or
- tax due under this Code and is not paid upon reasonable notice 7
- 8 and demand.
- (f) The Secretary shall provide that each original or 9
- 10 renewal driver's license issued to a licensee under 21 years of
- 11 age shall expire 3 months after the licensee's 21st birthday.
- Persons whose current driver's licenses expire on their 21st 12
- 13 birthday on or after January 1, 1986 shall not renew their
- driver's license before their 21st birthday, and their current 14
- 15 driver's license will be extended for an additional term of 3
- 16 months beyond their 21st birthday. Thereafter, the expiration
- and term of the driver's license shall be governed by 17
- subsection (a) hereof. 18
- 19 (q) (Blank). The Secretary shall provide that each original
- 20 or renewal driver's license issued to a licensee 81 years of
- age through age 86 shall expire 2 years from the date of 2.1
- 22 issuance, or at such later date as the Secretary may by rule
- and regulation designate, not to exceed an additional 12 23
- calendar months. The Secretary shall also provide that each 24
- 25 original or renewal driver's license issued to a licensee 87
- 26 years of age or older shall expire 12 months from the date of

- 1 issuance, or at such later date as the Secretary
- and regulation designate, not to exceed an additional 12 2
- calendar months. 3
- 4 (h) The Secretary of State shall provide that each special 5 restricted driver's license issued under subsection (g) of
- 6 Section 6-113 of this Code shall expire 12 months from the date
- of issuance. The Secretary shall adopt rules defining renewal 7
- 8 requirements.
- 9 (i) The Secretary of State shall provide that each driver's
- 10 license issued to a person convicted of a sex offense as
- 11 defined in Section 2 of the Sex Offender Registration Act shall
- expire 12 months from the date of issuance or at such date as 12
- 13 the Secretary may by rule designate, not to exceed an
- additional 12 calendar months. The Secretary may adopt rules 14
- 15 defining renewal requirements.
