1 HOUSE RESOLUTION WHEREAS, Racial profiling of, and racial discrimination 2 3 against, racial and ethnic minorities by State and local law 4 enforcement agencies are still prevalent in this State; and 5 WHEREAS, Many judges, prosecuting attorneys, and defense 6 attorneys are unaware of the prevalence and extent of that 7 profiling and discrimination; and 8 WHEREAS, Two-hundred and forty six years of slavery in the 9 United States 100 of and years segregation and disenfranchisement laws, often referred to as Jim Crow laws, 10 still have a profound effect on our society; and 11 WHEREAS, We, as a nation, have not fully recovered from 12 13 these past injustices; and 14 WHEREAS, Α version of segregation new and 15 disenfranchisement laws are emerging in this country with voter 16 suppression and the open demonstrations of violent behavior by 17 White supremacists; and WHEREAS, The Illinois Supreme Court established: (1) the 18 19 Code of Judicial Conduct (Supreme Court Rules 61 through 85); (2) Minimum Continuing Legal Education Rules for attorneys 20

- 1 (Supreme Court Rules 790 through 798); and (3) the Illinois
- 2 Rules of Professional Conduct of 2010 governing attorneys'
- 3 conduct; therefore, be it
- 4 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE
- 5 HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the
- 6 House of Representatives urges the Illinois Supreme Court to
- 7 require that judges, prosecuting attorneys, and criminal
- 8 defense attorneys receive periodic training about racial
- 9 profiling and racial discrimination; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this Resolution be
- 11 presented to Chief Justice of the Illinois Supreme Court.
