HOUSE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, 94% of school boards around the country are 3 elected; of the 10 largest school districts in the country, 4 only three, including Chicago Public Schools (CPS), have 5 appointed boards; and

6 WHEREAS, The City of Chicago is the only city in Illinois 7 who by law is required to appoint their school board; an 8 elected school board would represent the diverse viewpoints of 9 members' constituencies the same way any legislative body does; 10 and

11 WHEREAS, Having an appointed board has weakened CPS over 12 the years; millions of dollars have been cut from district 13 school budgets and numerous CPS schools have been closed or 14 phased-out since 2012; and

15 WHEREAS, In 2015, Chicago overwhelmingly voted for a 16 non-binding referendum pushed by leaders of the Chicago 17 Teachers Union, who called the absence of an elected school 18 board the "most pressing civil rights issue" in Chicago; and

WHEREAS, The people of Chicago are in desperate need of a
board who represents their communities; therefore, be it
