2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 1123 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
5	21B-30 as follows:
6	(105 ILCS 5/21B-30)
7	Sec. 21B-30. Educator testing.
8	(a) This Section applies beginning on July 1, 2012.
9	(b) The State Board of Education, in consultation with the
10	State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board, shall design
11	and implement a system of examinations, which shall be required
12	prior to the issuance of educator licenses. These examinations
13	and indicators must be based on national and State professional
14	teaching standards, as determined by the State Board of
15	Education, in consultation with the State Educator Preparation
16	and Licensure Board. The State Board of Education may adopt

such rules as may be necessary to implement and administer this
Section.

(c) Applicants seeking a Professional Educator License or 3 4 an Educator License with Stipulations shall be required to pass 5 a test of basic skills before the license is issued, unless the 6 endorsement the individual is seeking does not require passage of the test or unless the applicant meets the criteria 7 enumerated in subsection (c-5) of this Section. All applicants 8 completing Illinois-approved, teacher education or school 9 10 service personnel preparation programs shall be required to 11 pass the State Board of Education's recognized test of basic skills prior to starting their student teaching or starting the 12 13 final semester of their internship, unless required earlier at the discretion of the recognized, Illinois institution in which 14 15 they are completing their approved program or unless the 16 applicant meets the criteria enumerated in subsection (c-5) of this Section. An individual who passes a test of basic skills 17 does not need to do so again for subsequent endorsements or 18 other educator licenses. 19

20 <u>(c-5) An applicant who (i) receives a total score</u> 21 <u>percentile ranking of at least 90% on the test of basic skills</u> 22 <u>or a composite score percentile ranking of at least 90% on the</u> 23 <u>ACT or SAT college admissions test, which is accepted in lieu</u> 24 <u>of passing the test of basic skills, and (ii) has a cumulative</u> 25 <u>grade point average of 3.25 or higher on a 4.0 scale in all</u> 26 <u>coursework taken at the time the Illinois institution in which</u> 10000SB1123sam002 -3- LRB100 07570 NHT 26583 a

the applicant is completing his or her approved program requires the test of basic skills to be taken is not required to pass the test of basic skills before issuance of the license or prior to starting student teaching or the final semester of his or her internship.

6 (d) All applicants seeking a State license shall be 7 required to pass a test of content area knowledge for each area 8 of endorsement for which there is an applicable test. There 9 shall be no exception to this requirement. No candidate shall 10 be allowed to student teach or serve as the teacher of record 11 until he or she has passed the applicable content area test.

12 (e) (Blank). and completing their student teaching 13 experience no later than August 31, 2015 Prior to September 1, 14 2015, passage The APT shall be available through August 31, 15 2020.

16 (f) Except as otherwise provided in this Article, beginning on September 1, 2015, all candidates completing teacher 17 18 preparation programs in this State and all candidates subject to Section 21B-35 of this Code are required to pass an 19 20 evidence-based assessment of teacher effectiveness approved by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State 21 22 Educator Preparation and Licensure Board. All recognized 23 institutions offering approved teacher preparation programs 24 must begin phasing in the approved teacher performance 25 assessment no later than July 1, 2013.

1 the assessment of professional teaching shall be the tests that from time to time are designated by the State Board of 2 3 Education, in consultation with the State Educator Preparation 4 and Licensure Board, and may be tests prepared by an 5 educational testing organization or tests designed by the State 6 Board of Education, in consultation with the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board. The areas to be covered by a 7 8 test of basic skills shall include reading, language arts, and 9 mathematics. The test of content area knowledge shall assess 10 content knowledge in a specific subject field. The tests must 11 be designed to be racially neutral to ensure that no person taking the tests is discriminated against on the basis of race, 12 13 color, national origin, or other factors unrelated to the 14 person's ability to perform as a licensed employee. The score 15 required to pass the tests shall be fixed by the State Board of 16 Education, in consultation with the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board. The tests shall be administered not fewer 17 18 than 3 times a year at such time and place as may be designated by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State 19 20 Educator Preparation and Licensure Board.

The State Board shall implement a test or tests to assess the speaking, reading, writing, and grammar skills of applicants for an endorsement or a license issued under subdivision (G) of paragraph (2) of Section 21B-20 of this Code in the English language and in the language of the transitional bilingual education program requested by the applicant. 10000SB1123sam002 -5- LRB100 07570 NHT 26583 a

(h) Except as provided in Section 34-6 of this Code, the
provisions of this Section shall apply equally in any school
district subject to Article 34 of this Code.

(i) The rules developed to implement and enforce the 4 5 testing requirements under this Section shall include without 6 limitation provisions governing test selection, test determination of 7 validation and а passing score, administration of the tests, frequency of administration, 8 9 applicant fees, frequency of applicants taking the tests, the 10 years for which a score is valid, and appropriate special 11 accommodations. The State Board of Education shall develop such rules as may be needed to ensure uniformity from year to year 12 13 in the level of difficulty for each form of an assessment.
