Amends the Wildlife Code. Provides that except as provided in the Code, it is unlawful to have in his or her possession the green hides of fur bearing mammals without a valid hunting or trapping license. Provides that the annual fee for each resident fur buyer's permit (rather than a resident retail or wholesale fur buyer's permit) shall be \$50.00 (rather than \$25.00 for a resident retail fur buyer's permit or \$125.00 for a resident wholesale fur buyer's permit). Provides that all fur buyers and non-resident auction participants shall maintain records of the receipt, collection, purchase, and sale of green hides of fur-bearing mammals. Provides that a record of each transaction shall be created at the time it is executed specifying the date, numbers, and kinds of green hides purchased, sold, or transferred, price paid for each green hide, if any, and the name, address, and Department customer identification number of the other party. Provides that a person who holds a fur tanner's permit is exempt from provisions for a resident fur buyer permit holder as long as the person is not engaged in the business of receiving green hides for the purpose of buying or selling the hides, whether green, dressed, processed, or tanned and the hides which have been tanned or processed are returned to the person who submitted the hides for processing or tanning. Repeals a provision regarding the receiving, collecting, or buying of green hides of fur-bearing or game mammals. Makes other conforming changes. Effective January 1, 2018.

# A BILL FOR

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AN ACT concerning wildlife.

# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Wildlife Code is amended by changing
Sections 2.35, 3.4, 3.11, 3.14, 3.15, 3.16, 3.16a, 3.18, 3.19,
and 3.20 as follows:

7 (520 ILCS 5/2.35) (from Ch. 61, par. 2.35)

8 Sec. 2.35. <u>Wild game birds or mammals.</u> (a) Migratory game 9 birds, or any part or parts thereof, may be possessed only in 10 accordance with the regulations of the Federal Government.

(b) Except as provided in Sections 3.21, 3.23, 3.27, 3.28 and 3.30 it is unlawful to possess wild game birds or wild game mammals or any parts thereof in excess of the legally established daily limit or possession limit, whichever applies.

(c) Except as provided in <u>this Code</u> Sections 3.11, 3.12,
3.15, 3.18, 3.21 and 3.25, it is unlawful to have in possession
the green hides of fur-bearing mammals <u>without a valid hunting</u>
<u>or trapping license</u> <u>during the period within which it is</u>
<u>unlawful to take such fur-bearing mammals in the State where</u>
<u>taken, except during the open season provided and for an</u>
additional 20 days next succeeding such open season.

23 (d) Failure to establish proof of the legality of the

possession in another state or country and of importation into <u>this State</u> the State of Illinois, shall be prima facie evidence that migratory game birds and game birds or any parts thereof, and fur-bearing mammals or any parts thereof, were taken within this State the State of Illinois.

6 (e) For all those species to which a daily or possession 7 limit shall apply, each hunter shall maintain his bag of such 8 species separately and distinctly from those of all other 9 hunters.

10 (f) No person shall receive or have in custody any 11 protected species belonging to another person, except in the 12 personal abodes of the donor or <u>recipient</u> donee, unless such 13 protected species are tagged <u>in accordance with Section 2.30b</u> 14 <u>of this Code or tagged</u> with the hunter's <u>or trapper's</u> name, <del>his</del> 15 address, <del>the</del> total number of species, and the date such species 16 were taken.

Sec. 3.4. <u>Trapping licenses.</u> Before a trapping license shall be issued to any person, such person shall make application to the Department or any county, city, village, township or incorporated town clerk or his <u>or her</u> duly designated agent upon an application form provided by the Department. This application shall be executed and sworn to and shall set forth the name and description of the applicant and

1 his or her place of residence.

The fee for a trapping license for a resident of <u>this State</u>
the State of Illinois shall be \$10.00.

The Department may provide for non-resident trapping bicense provided that any non-resident shall be charged a fee of \$175, and if the state in which the applicant resides does not provide for trapping mammals by Illinois residents, then the fee shall be \$250.

9 Every person trapping mammals shall make a report properly 10 sworn to, to the Department, upon blanks supplied by the 11 Department for such purpose, of all hides of mammals taken, 12 sold, shipped or dealt in, during the open seasons for mammals 13 together with the names and addresses of the parties to whom 14 the same were sold or shipped. Such report shall be made to the 15 Department within 15 days after the close of the trapping 16 season. Failure to report or filing false reports shall subject 17 the person to the penalties provided in Section 3.5. Further, the Department may refuse to issue a trapping license for the 18 19 following year to any person who has failed to file such a 20 report.

21 All trapping licenses shall expire on March 31 of each 22 year.

25 Sec. 3.11. <u>Resident fur buyer permits.</u> Any individual who

is a resident of this State the State of Illinois, who, within 1 this State the State of Illinois, receives, collects or buys, 2 or who acts as an agent or broker in the receipt, collection or 3 purchase of the green hides of fur-bearing mammals, protected 4 5 by this Act, except an individual who is a resident retail fur 6 buyer as defined in Section 3.12, shall be a resident wholesale fur buyer in the meaning of this Act. Resident wholesale fur 7 8 buyer's permits shall be issued by the Department. The annual 9 fee for each resident wholesale fur buyer's permit shall be 10 \$50.00 <del>\$125.00</del>. All resident <del>wholesale</del> fur buyer permits shall 11 expire on April 30 of each year. A holder of a valid resident 12 wholesale fur buyer permit may buy, sell, possess, transport, 13 and ship the green hides of any legally taken fur-bearing 14 mammals from May 1 through April 30 next thereafter; provided, 15 however, that failure to establish proof of the legality or 16 origin of the green hides of fur-bearing mammals shall be prima 17 facie evidence that such green hides of fur-bearing mammals are contraband within the State of Illinois. Nothing in this 18 19 Section shall exempt any permittee from complying with to any 20 federal laws, rules or regulations which may apply to the green hides of fur-bearing mammals. A person who holds a fur tanner's 21 22 permit under Section 3.16 of this Code is exempt under this 23 Section if the person is not engaged in the business of 24 receiving green hides for the purpose of buying or selling the hides, whether green, dressed, processed, or tanned and the 25 hides which have been tanned or processed are returned to the 26

#### 1 person who submitted the hides for processing or tanning.

3 (520 ILCS 5/3.14) (from Ch. 61, par. 3.14)

4 Sec. 3.14. Record keeping; fur buyers and non-resident 5 auction participants. All fur buyers and non-resident auction 6 participants shall maintain records of the receipt, 7 collection, purchase, and sale of green hides of fur-bearing 8 mammals. A record of each transaction shall be created at the 9 time it is executed specifying the date, numbers, and kinds of 10 green hides purchased, sold, or transferred, the price paid for 11 each green hide, if any, and the name, address, and Department customer identification number of the other party. Records of 12 13 transactions with non-residents may substitute the Department customer identification number with an equivalent identifier 14 15 such as a license or permit number from the person's place of 16 residence. Records of transactions shall be retained for 2 years from the date of execution and shall be presented for 17 18 inspection at any reasonable time a request is made by authorized employees of the Department or any sheriff, deputy 19 sheriff, or peace officer. Failure to produce records of 20 21 transactions for green hides shall be prima facie evidence that 22 the green hides are contraband in this State. A numbered 23 receipt shall be issued to the other party when purchasing 24 green hides of fur-bearing mammals. The receipt shall specify 25 the name and address of the person selling the green hides, the

numbers and kinds of green hides sold, the price paid for each 1 2 green hide, the date of the transaction, and the name of the 3 fur buyer or non-resident auction participant. Any person receiving, collecting or buying green hides of fur-bearing or 4 5 game mammals from a licensed resident retail, resident wholesale or non resident fur buyer, fur bearing mammal 6 breeder or other fur vendor shall be furnished with a 7 certificate by such buyer, breeder or vendor showing the number 8 9 and kinds of such green hides received, collected or purchased, 10 the date of the transaction, the name and address of the buyer, 11 breeder, or vendor, the name and address of the person 12 receiving, collecting or buying such green hides from such buyer breeder, or vendor, and any other information which 13 the Department may require. The certificate, or certificates shall 14 be immediately presented for inspection to officers and 15 authorized employees of the Department, any sheriff, deputy 16 17 sheriff, or any other peace officer when request is made for same. An invoice or export permit covering green hides of 18 19 fur bearing or game mammals originating in other states may be 20 accepted in lieu of the certificates. Failure to produce such certificate, invoice or export permit shall be prima facie 21 22 evidence that such green hides are contraband within the State of Illinois. 23 (Source: P.A. 81-382.) 24

Sec. 3.15. Purchase of green hides. Any manufacturer, 1 2 converter, or consumer who purchases or receives green hides of 3 fur-bearing or game mammals for the purpose of dressing and fabricating them into fur garments or products, shall purchase 4 5 such green hides from a duly licensed fur buyer or fur-bearing 6 mammal breeder, and shall demand from the buyer or breeder an 7 invoice covering such purchases, indicating thereon the date of the transaction, the name and address of the fur buyer or 8 9 fur-bearing mammal breeder, and the number and kinds of green 10 hides so purchased. Such invoices shall be presented for inspection to officers and authorized employees of 11 the 12 Department, any sheriff, deputy sheriff, or any other peace 13 officer when request is made for same. Failure to produce such invoice shall be prima facie evidence that such green hides are 14 15 contraband within this State the State of Illinois.

16 Such purchases of green hides of fur-bearing or game 17 mammals shall be made for converting or manufacturing purposes 18 only, and green hides so bought shall not be offered for resale 19 in the green or raw condition.

20 Such a manufacturer, converter or consumer may have the 21 green hides of any legally taken fur-bearing or game mammals 22 purchased from a licensed fur buyer or fur-bearing mammal 23 breeder, in his possession at any time during the year, 24 provided such green hides were purchased and are used for 25 manufacturing purposes only.

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#### (520 ILCS 5/3.16) (from Ch. 61, par. 3.16)

Sec. 3.16. Fur tanner permits. Any individual, who for 2 3 other individuals, engages in the business of dressing, dyeing 4 or tanning the green hides of fur-bearing or game mammals, 5 protected by this Act, shall be a fur tanner in the meaning of this Act. Before any individual shall engage in the business of 6 7 dressing, dyeing, or tanning green hides of fur-bearing or game 8 mammals, for any other individual, he or she shall first 9 procure a fur tanner permit. Fur tanner permits shall be issued 10 by the Department. The annual fee for each fur tanner's permit 11 shall be \$25.00. All fur tanner permits shall expire on March 12 31st of each year. Any fur tanner who receives or collects green hides shall require an affidavit from the shipper or 13 14 consignor, stating that said green hides were taken according 15 regulations of the state where they were taken, a to 16 certificate of purchase as provided for in Section 3.14 or an invoice as provided for in Section 3.15. The Such affidavit, 17 certificate of purchase, or invoice shall show the name and 18 address of the individual from whom the green hides were 19 20 received or collected and the such records shall be kept by the 21 fur tanner for a minimum period of one year following the date 22 of receipt or collection. The Such affidavit, certificate of purchase, or invoice shall be immediately presented for 23 24 inspection to officers and authorized employees of the 25 Department, any sheriff, deputy sheriff, or any other peace

officer upon when request is made for same. Failure to produce 1 2 such affidavit, certificate of purchase, or invoice shall be 3 prima facie evidence that such green hides are contraband within this State the State of Illinois. Upon receipt by the 4 5 fur tanner of any green hide not accompanied by an affidavit, certificate of purchase or invoice, the fur tanner shall notify 6 7 the shipper or consignor in writing of the requirement. The fur 8 tanner shall then hold green hides until an affidavit, 9 certificate of purchase, or invoice is received. The Such green 10 hides shall be labeled with the name and address of the shipper 11 or consignor, date of receipt, and the date notification was 12 sent to the shipper or consignor. If the shipper or consignor shall fail to furnish the said affidavit, certificate of 13 14 purchase, or invoice within 30 days from the date of receipt of 15 the green hides, the fur tanner shall notify the Department and 16 green hides shall be disposed of in accordance with 17 Department. Additional instructions from the Federal regulations may apply to the hides of certain endangered 18 19 species.

22 Sec. 3.16a. Non-resident auction participation permit; 23 fee. Any individual who is not a resident of <u>this State</u> <del>the</del> 24 <del>State of Illinois</del> and does not possess a non-resident fur buyer 25 permit must obtain a non-resident auction participation permit

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to receive, collect, buy, or act as an agent or broker in the 1 2 receipt, collection, or purchase of the green hides of fur-bearing mammals at auctions organized for these purposes 3 within this State the State of Illinois. Non-resident auction 4 5 participation permits shall be issued by the Department. The 6 annual fee for each non-resident auction participation permit 7 is \$50. Non-resident auction participation permits expire on 8 30. A holder of а valid non-resident April auction 9 participation permit may receive, collect, buy, possess, 10 transport, or act as an agent or broker in the receipt, 11 collection, or purchase of legally taken fur-bearing mammals 12 from May 1 through the next April 30. Failure to establish proof of legality or origin of the green hides of fur-bearing 13 14 mammals, however, is prima facie evidence that the green hides 15 are contraband within this State the State of Illinois. Nothing 16 in this Section exempts any permittee from complying with any 17 federal laws, rules, or regulations that may apply to the green hides of fur-bearing mammals. 18

Sec. 3.18. <u>Non-resident fur buyers.</u> Any individual not a resident of <u>this State</u> the State of Illinois, who, within <u>this</u> the State of Illinois, receives, collects or buys, or who acts as an agent or broker in the receipt, collection or purchase of the green hides of fur-bearing mammals, protected by this Act,

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shall be a non-resident fur buyer in the meaning of this Act. 1 2 Non-resident fur buyer permits shall be issued by the Department. Non-resident fur buyers must obtain a non-resident 3 fur buyer permit before receiving, collecting, or purchasing 4 5 the green hides of fur-bearing mammals within this State except that a non-resident fur buyer permit shall not be required for 6 7 purchasing the green hides of fur-bearing mammals from resident 8 wholesale fur buyers and resident retail fur buyers as defined in Sections 3.11 and 3.12. The annual fee for each nonresident 9 10 fur buyer permit shall be \$250.00. All non-resident fur buyer 11 permits shall expire on April 30 of each year. A nonresident 12 fur buyer may buy, sell, possess, transport and ship the green 13 hides of any legally taken fur-bearing mammals from May 1 through April 30 next thereafter; provided, however, that 14 15 failure to establish proof of the legality of or origin of the 16 green hides of fur-bearing mammals shall be prima facie 17 evidence that such green hides of fur-bearing mammals are contraband within this State the State of Illinois. Nothing in 18 this Section shall be construed to remove such permittee from 19 20 responsibility for the observance of any federal laws, rules or 21 regulations which may apply to the green hides of fur-bearing 22 mammals.

25 Sec. 3.19. <u>Permit requirements.</u> Each <del>resident retail fur</del>

buyer, resident wholesale fur buyer, nonresident fur buyer, 1 non-resident auction participant, fur bearing mammal breeder, 2 or fur tanner shall have his or her permit in his or her 3 possession when receiving, collecting, buying, selling, or 4 5 offering for sale, the green hides of fur-bearing  $\frac{\partial r}{\partial r}$ 6 mammals or accepting the same for dressing, dyeing, or tanning, 7 and shall immediately produce the same when requested to do so 8 by an officer or authorized employees of the Department, any 9 sheriff, deputy sheriff or any other peace officer. Persons 10 conducting organized and established auction sales or the green 11 hides of fur-bearing or game mammals, protected by this Act, 12 shall be exempt from the provisions of this Section.

15 Sec. 3.20. Reporting; fur buyers and non-resident auction 16 participants. All fur buyers and non resident auction 17 participants, shall, upon purchasing any green hide of any 18 fur bearing mammal, protected by this Act, issue a numbered 19 receipt to the hunter, trapper, fur buyer, fur-bearing mammal 20 breeder or other person from whom he purchased such hides, 21 setting forth the number and kinds of green hides, the date of 22 purchase, the price paid for each hide, the name and address of the hunter, trapper, fur buyer, fur-bearing mammal breeder or 23 24 other person from whom he purchased such hides, and the 25 appropriate license number or stamp number of the hunter,

trapper, fur buyer, fur-bearing mammal breeder or other person from whom the hides were purchased, if applicable. The original receipt shall be retained by the fur buyer for a minimum of 2 years from the date of purchase listed on the receipt. A duplicate receipt shall be given to the hunter, trapper, fur buyer, fur bearing mammal breeder or other person from whom the green hides were purchased at the time of purchase.

8 All fur buyers and non-resident auction participants shall 9 submit a report to the Department on forms provided by the 10 Department showing the number and kinds of all green hides of 11 fur-bearing mammals received, collected or purchased, and the 12 average price, if any, paid therefore and such other 13 information as required by the Department. This report shall be made on or before May 10 of each year and shall include all 14 operations for the 12 months preceding May 1 of the current 15 year. All such receipts, reports, and records required by this 16 17 Section shall be available for inspection by any officer or authorized employee of the Department, any sheriff, deputy 18 sheriff, or any other peace officer at any reasonable time when 19 20 request is made for same. Failure to comply with the provisions of this Section shall bar the permittee from obtaining a fur 21 22 buyer or non-resident auction participant permit for the 23 following year.
