2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 2501 on page 1,
3	line 15, by replacing " <u>employer</u> " with " <u>taxpayer</u> "; and
4	on page 1, immediately below line 17, by inserting the
5	following:
6	"If the taxpayer is a partnership or Subchapter S
7	corporation, the credit shall be allowed to the partners or
8	shareholders in accordance with the determination of income and
9	distributive share of income under Sections 702 and 704 and
10	Subchapter S of the Internal Revenue Code."; and
11	by replacing everything from line 20 on page 1 through line 17
12	on page 2 with the following:
13	"(c) The taxpayer shall provide the Department such
14	information as the Department may require, including but not
15	limited to: (i) the name, age, and taxpayer identification
16	number of each qualifying apprentice employed by the taxpayer

1	during the taxable year; (ii) the amount of qualified education
2	expenses incurred with respect to each qualifying apprentice;
3	and (iii) the name of the school at which the qualifying
4	apprentice is enrolled and the qualified education expenses are
5	incurred.
6	(d) For purposes of this Section:
7	"Employer" means an Illinois taxpayer who is the employer
8	of the qualifying apprentice.
9	"Qualifying apprentices" means individuals who (i) are
10	residents of the State of Illinois, (ii) are between the ages
11	of 16 and 30 years old at the close of the school year for which
12	a credit is sought, (iii) during the school year for which a
13	credit is sought were full-time apprentices enrolled in an
14	apprenticeship program which is registered with the United
15	States Department of Labor, Office of Apprenticeship, and (iv)
16	are employed in Illinois by the taxpayer who is the employer.
17	"Qualified education expense" means the amount incurred on
18	behalf of a qualifying apprentice not to exceed \$3,500 for
19	tuition, book fees, and lab fees at the school or community
20	college in which the apprentice is enrolled during the regular
21	school year.
22	"School" means any public or nonpublic secondary school in
23	Illinois that is: (i) an institution of higher education that
24	provides a program that leads to an industry-recognized
25	postsecondary credential or degree; (ii) an entity that carries
26	out programs registered under the federal National

- 1 Apprenticeship Act; or (iii) another public or private provider
- 2 of a program of training services, which may include a joint
- 3 labor-management organization.".
