

## 100TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2017 and 2018 SB3395

Introduced 2/16/2018, by Sen. Pamela J. Althoff

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

225 ILCS 75/13 from Ch. 111, par. 3713 225 ILCS 90/11 from Ch. 111, par. 4261

Amends the Illinois Occupational Therapy Practice Act and the Illinois Physical Therapy Act. Provides that the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation may issue an occupational therapist, occupational therapy assistant, physical therapist, or physical therapist assistant license to an applicant who is licensed under another jurisdiction upon filing an application, paying the required fee, and meeting requirements established by rule (rather than if the requirements for licensure in that jurisdiction were, at the date of licensure, substantially equivalent to the requirements in force in this State on that date or equivalent to the requirements of this Act). Provides that an applicant for endorsement shall meet the requirements for endorsement upon filing the application, paying the required fee, and showing proof of licensure in another jurisdiction for at least 10 consecutive years without discipline by certified verification of licensure by the jurisdiction. Effective immediately.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Occupational Therapy Practice Act is amended by changing Section 13 as follows:
- 6 (225 ILCS 75/13) (from Ch. 111, par. 3713)
- 7 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2024)
- 8 13. Endorsement. The Department may, its 9 discretion, license occupational therapist as an or occupational therapy assistant, without examination, 10 on payment of the required fee, an applicant who 11 12 occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant licensed under the laws of another jurisdiction, upon filing of 13 14 an application on forms provided by the Department, paying the required fee, and meeting such requirements as are established 15 by rule. The Department may adopt rules governing recognition 16 of education and legal practice in another jurisdiction, 17 requiring additional education, and determining when an 18 19 examination may be required. if the requirements for licensure in that jurisdiction were, at the date of his licensure, 20 21 substantially equivalent to the requirements in force in this 22 State on that date or equivalent to the requirements of this

- An applicant for endorsement shall meet the requirements for licensure by endorsement upon filing an application on forms provided by the Department, paying the required fee, and showing proof of licensure in another jurisdiction for at least 10 consecutive years without discipline by certified verification of licensure from the jurisdiction in which the applicant practiced.
- Applicants have 3 years from the date of application to complete the application process. If the process has not been completed in 3 years, the application shall be denied, the fee forfeited and the applicant must reapply and meet the requirements in effect at the time of reapplication.

- Section 10. The Illinois Physical Therapy Act is amended by changing Section 11 as follows:

- 17 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2026)
- 18 Sec. 11. Endorsement. The Department may, without 19 examination, grant a license under this Act to an applicant who 20 is licensed as a in its discretion, license as a physical 21 physical therapist assistant, therapist or examination, on payment of the required fee, an applicant for a 22 23 license who is a physical therapist or physical therapist assistant, as the case may be, licensed under the laws of 24

another jurisdiction upon filing of an application on forms provided by the Department, paying the required fee, and meeting such requirements as are established by rule. The Department may adopt rules governing recognition of education and legal practice in another jurisdiction, requiring additional education, and determining when an examination may be required. state if the requirements for a license of physical therapists or physical therapist assistant in the state in which the applicant was licensed were at the date of his or her licensure substantially equal to the requirements in force in this State on that date.

An applicant for endorsement shall meet the requirements for licensure by endorsement upon filing an application on forms provided by the Department, paying the required fee, and showing proof of licensure in another jurisdiction for at least 10 consecutive years without discipline by certified verification of licensure from the jurisdiction in which the applicant practiced.

The Department may waive the English proficiency examination by rule.

Applicants have 3 years from the date of application to complete the application process. If the process has not been completed in 3 years, the application shall be denied, the fee forfeited and the applicant must reapply and meet the requirements in effect at the time of reapplication.
