Amends the Board of Higher Education Act. Provides that the Board of Higher Education may not limit the amount of tuition revenue that a public university may waive. Repeals provisions regarding tuition waiver limitations in various Acts relating to the governance of public universities in Illinois.

To be eligible to receive a partial tuition waiver, the child of an employee of an Illinois college or university (i) 6 must be under the age of 25 at the commencement of the academic 7 year during which the partial tuition waiver is to be 8 9 effective, and (ii) must qualify for admission to the 10 University of Illinois under the same admissions requirements, 11 standards and policies which the University of Illinois applies 12 to applicants for admission generally to its respective 13 undergraduate colleges and programs.

(c) Subject to the provisions and limitations of subsection (b), an eligible applicant who has continued to maintain satisfactory academic progress toward graduation may have his or her partial tuition waiver renewed until the time as he or she has expended 4 years of undergraduate partial tuition waiver benefits under this Section.
