- 2 labeling under which it is sold, distributed or used, or if any
- 3 valuable constituent of the pesticide has been wholly or in
- 4 part abstracted.
- 5 4. "Agricultural Commodity" means produce of the land
- 6 including but not limited to plants and plant parts, livestock
- and poultry and livestock or poultry products, seeds, sod,
- 8 shrubs and other products of agricultural origin including the
- 9 premises necessary to and used directly in agricultural
- 10 production. Agricultural commodity also includes aquatic
- 11 products as defined in the Aquaculture Development Act.
- 12 5. "Animal" means all vertebrate and invertebrate species
- including, but not limited to, man and other mammals, bird,
- 14 fish, and shellfish.
- 15 6. "Beneficial Insects" means those insects which during
- their life cycle are effective pollinators of plants, predators
- of pests or are otherwise beneficial.
- 7. "Certified applicator".
- 19 A. "Certified applicator" means any individual who is
- certified under this Act to purchase, use, or supervise the
- 21 use of pesticides which are classified for restricted use.
- B. "Private applicator" means a certified applicator
- who purchases, uses, or supervises the use of any pesticide
- 24 classified for restricted use, for the purpose of producing
- any agricultural commodity on property owned, rented, or
- otherwise controlled by him or his employer, or applied to

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other property if done without compensation other than trading of personal services between no more than 2 producers of agricultural commodities.

- C. "Licensed Commercial Applicator" means a certified applicator, whether or not he is a private applicator with respect to some uses, who owns or manages a business that is engaged in applying pesticides, whether classified for general or restricted use, for hire. The term also applies to a certified applicator who uses or supervises the use of pesticides, whether classified for general or restricted use, for any purpose or on property of others excluding those specified by subparagraphs 7 (B), (D), (E) of Section 4 of this Act.
- D. "Commercial Not For Hire Applicator" means a certified applicator who uses or supervises the use of pesticides classified for general or restricted use for any purpose on property of an employer when such activity is a requirement of the terms of employment and such application of pesticides under this certification is limited to property under the control of the employer only and includes, but is not limited to, the use or supervision of the use of pesticides in a greenhouse setting. "Commercial Not For Hire Applicator" also includes a certified applicator who uses or supervises the use of pesticides classified for general or restricted use as an employee of a state agency, municipality, or other duly constituted

- "Defoliant" means any substance or combination of 2
- substances which cause leaves or foliage to drop from a plant 3
- 4 with or without causing abscission.
- 5 9. "Desiccant" means any substance or combination of
- substances intended for artificially accelerating the drying 6
- 7 of plant tissue.
- 8 10. "Device" means any instrument or contrivance, other
- 9 than a firearm or equipment for application of pesticides when
- 10 sold separately from pesticides, which is intended for
- 11 trapping, repelling, destroying, or mitigating any pest, other
- than bacteria, virus, or other microorganisms on or living in 12
- 13 man or other living animals.
- 11. "Distribute" means offer or hold for sale, sell, 14
- 15 barter, ship, deliver for shipment, receive and then deliver,
- 16 or offer to deliver pesticides, within the State.
- 12. "Environment" includes water, air, land, and all plants 17
- including man, living therein 18 and animals the
- 19 interrelationships which exist among these.
- 20 13. "Equipment" means any type of instruments
- 2.1 contrivances using motorized, mechanical or pressure power
- 22 which is used to apply any pesticide, excluding pressurized
- 23 hand-size household apparatus containing dilute ready to apply
- 24 pesticide or used to apply household pesticides.
- 25 14. "FIFRA" means the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and
- 26 Rodenticide Act, as amended.

- 1 15. "Fungi" any non-chlorophyll bearing means
- thallophytes, any non-chlorophyll bearing plant of a lower 2
- order than mosses or liverworts, as for example rust, smut, 3
- 4 mildew, mold, yeast and bacteria, except those on or in living
- 5 animals including man and those on or in processed foods,
- beverages or pharmaceuticals. 6
- 16. "Household Substance" means any pesticide customarily 7
- 8 produced and distributed for use by individuals in or about the
- 9 household.
- 10 17. "Imminent Hazard" means a situation which exists when
- 11 continued use of a pesticide would likely result
- unreasonable adverse effect on the environment or will involve 12
- unreasonable hazard to the survival of a species declared 13
- 14 endangered by the U.S. Secretary of the Interior or to species
- 15 declared to be protected by the Illinois Department of Natural

- 18. "Inert Ingredient" means an ingredient which is not an 17
- 18 active ingredient.
- 19. "Ingredient Statement" means a statement of the name 19
- 20 and percentage of each active ingredient together with the
- total percentage of inert ingredients in a pesticide and for 2.1
- 22 pesticides containing arsenic in any form, the ingredient
- 23 statement shall include percentage of total and water soluble
- 24 arsenic, each calculated as elemental arsenic. In the case of
- 25 spray adjuvants the ingredient statement need contain only the
- 26 names of the functioning agents and the total percent of those

- 1 constituents ineffective as spray adjuvants.
- 20. "Insect" means any of the numerous small invertebrate 2
- animals generally having the body more or less obviously 3
- 4 segmented for the most part belonging to the class Insects,
- 5 comprised of six-legged, usually winged forms, as for example
- 6 beetles, caterpillars, and flies. This definition encompasses
- other allied classes of arthropods whose members are wingless 7

- 10 21. "Label" means the written, printed or graphic matter on
- 11 or attached to the pesticide or device or any of its containers

- 4 24. "Licensed Operator" means a person employed to apply
- 5 pesticides to the lands of others under the direction of a

- 7 not-for-hire applicator".
- 8 25. "Nematode" means invertebrate animals of the phylum
- 9 nemathelminthes and class nematoda, also referred to as nemas
- or eelworms, which are unsegmented roundworms with elongated
- 11 fusiform or sac-like bodies covered with cuticle and inhabiting
- soil, water, plants or plant parts.
- 13 26. "Permit" means a written statement issued by the
- 14 Director or his authorized agent, authorizing certain acts of

- interim basis prior to normal certification, registration, or

- 18 27. "Person" means any individual, partnership,
- 19 association, fiduciary, corporation, or any organized group of
- 20 persons whether incorporated or not.
- 28. "Pest" means (a) any insect, rodent, nematode, fungus,
- 22 weed, or (b) any other form of terrestrial or aquatic plant or
- 23 animal life or virus, bacteria, or other microorganism,
- 24 excluding virus, bacteria, or other microorganism on or in
- living animals including man, which the Director declares to be
- 26 a pest.

- 1 29. "Pesticide" means any substance or mixture of substances intended for preventing, destroying, repelling, or 2 3 mitigating any pest or any substance or mixture of substances
- 4 intended for use as a plant regulator, defoliant or desiccant.
- 5 30. "Pesticide Dealer" means any person who distributes registered pesticides to the user. 6
- 31. "Plant Regulator" means any substance or mixture of 7 8 substances intended through physiological action to affect the 9 rate of growth or maturation or otherwise alter the behavior of 10 ornamental or crop plants or the produce thereof. This does not 11 include substances which are not intended as plant nutrient elements, nutritional chemicals, plant or 12 seed 13 inoculants or soil conditioners or amendments.
- 32. "Protect Health and Environment" means to guard against 14 15 any unreasonable adverse effects on the environment.
- 16 33. "Registrant" means person who has registered any pesticide pursuant to the provision of FIFRA and this Act. 17
- 18 34. "Restricted Use Pesticide" means any pesticide with one 19 or more of its uses classified as restricted by order of the 20 Administrator of USEPA or the Director, or any pesticide which contains a neonicotinoid as defined in this Section. 2.1
- 22 35. "SLN Registration" means registration of a pesticide 23 for use under conditions of special local need as defined by 24 FIFRA.
- 25 36. "State Restricted Pesticide Use" means any pesticide 26 use which the Director determines, subsequent to public

- 1 hearing, that an additional restriction for that use is needed
- to prevent unreasonable adverse effects. 2
- 37. "Structural Pest" means any pests which attack and 3
- 4 destroy buildings and other structures or which attack
- 5 clothing, stored food, commodities stored at
- manufacturing and processing facilities or manufactured and 6
- 7 processed goods.
- 38. "Unreasonable Adverse Effects on the Environment" 8
- 9 means the unreasonable risk to the environment, including man,
- 10 from the use of any pesticide, when taking into account accrued
- 11 benefits of as well as the economic, social, and environmental
- costs of its use. 12
- 39. "USEPA" means United States Environmental Protection 13
- 14 Agency.
- 40. "Use inconsistent with the label" means to use a 15
- 16 pesticide in a manner not consistent with the
- 17 instruction, the definition adopted in FIFRA as interpreted by
- 18 USEPA shall apply in Illinois.
- 19 41. "Weed" means any plant growing in a place where it is
- 20 not wanted.
- "Wildlife" means all living things, not human, 2.1
- 22 domestic, or pests.
- 43. "Bulk pesticide" means any registered pesticide which 23
- 24 is transported or held in an individual container in undivided
- 25 quantities of greater than 55 U.S. gallons liquid measure or
- 26 100 pounds net dry weight.

"Bulk repackaging" means the transfer of a registered pesticide from one bulk container (containing undivided 2 quantities of greater than 100 U.S. gallons liquid measure or 3 4 100 pounds net dry weight) to another bulk container 5 (containing undivided quantities of greater than 100 U.S. 6 gallons liquid measure or 100 pounds net dry weight) in an unaltered state in preparation for sale or distribution to 7
- 9 45. "Business" means any individual, partnership, 10 corporation or association engaged in a business operation for 11 the purpose of selling or distributing pesticides or providing the service of application of pesticides in this State. 12
- 46. "Facility" means any building or structure and all real 13 property contiguous thereto, including all equipment fixed 14 15 thereon used for the operation of the business.
- 16 47. "Chemigation" means the application of a pesticide through the systems or equipment employed for the primary 17 18 purpose of irrigation of land and crops.
- 48. "Use" means any activity covered by the pesticide label 19 20 including but not limited to application of pesticide, mixing 2.1 and loading, storage of pesticides or pesticide containers, 22 disposal of pesticides and pesticide containers and reentry 23 into treated sites or areas.
- 24 49. "Neonicotinoid" means any pesticide that contains 25 clothianidin, imidacloprid, thiamethoxam, dinotefuran, acetamiprid, thiacloprid, nithiazine, nitenpyram, or other 26

1	neonicotinoid as may be identified by rules adopted by the
2	Department of Agriculture.

6	pesticide containing a neonicotinoid may be used outdoors or
7	any land owned or maintained by the State, except for use in:

9	(b) abatement of non-native insect borers, such as Agrilus
10	planipennis or related or similar insect pests, subject to the
11	<pre>following:</pre>
12	(1) Abatement application is restricted to the
13	<pre>following methods:</pre>
14	(A) Basal bark spray.
15	(B) Basal drench solely at the base of a tree.
16	(C) Soil injection solely at the base of a tree.
17	(D) Systemic root flare or trunk injection.
