2 WHEREAS, African Americans have had a rich history in 3 Rockford and in Illinois and have made significant 4 contributions to our communities; and

5 WHEREAS, The Colored Soldiers Club under War Camp Community 6 Services was founded and led by Dr. Richard S. Grant and his 7 wife, Lelia, during World War I; and

8 WHEREAS, The club was chartered and converted into a 9 community center named the Booker Washington Association in 10 1919; and

11 WHEREAS, Throughout its history, the African-American 12 Resource Center at Booker has provided consistent access to 13 resources, programing, and services to uplift the community; 14 and

15 WHEREAS, The African-American Resource Center at Booker is 16 the oldest African-American community center in Illinois and 17 gained historical landmark status in 2015; and
