SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/14-1.02

from Ch. 122, par. 14-1.02

Amends the Children with Disabilities Article of the School Code. Provides that a student whose 22nd birthday occurs during the school year is eligible for special education services through the end of the school year (rather than being eligible for services only until the day before his or her 22nd birthday). Effective immediately.

AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
14-1.02 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/14-1.02) (from Ch. 122, par. 14-1.02)

7 Sec. 14-1.02. Children with disabilities. "Children with disabilities" means children between the ages of 3 and 21 for 8 9 whom it is determined, through definitions and procedures described in the Illinois Rules and Regulations to Govern the 10 Organization and Administration of Special Education, that 11 special education services are needed. An eligible student who 12 requires continued public school educational experience to 13 14 facilitate his or her successful transition and integration into adult life is eligible for such services through age 21, 15 16 inclusive, which, for purposes of this Article, means the day 17 before the student's 22nd birthday, unless his or her 22nd birthday occurs during the school year, in which case he or she 18 is eligible for such services through the end of the school 19 20 year. An individualized education program must be written and 21 agreed upon by appropriate school personnel and parents or 22 their representatives for any child receiving special education. 23
