2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 2397 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The University of Illinois Hospital Act is
5	amended by adding Section 7.1 as follows:
6	(110 ILCS 330/7.1 new)
7	Sec. 7.1. Infection preventionists.
8	(a) For the purposes of this Section, "infection
9	preventionist" means a person designated by the University of
10	Illinois Hospital to identify infectious disease processes,
11	conduct surveillance and epidemiologic investigations, and
12	develop plans to prevent and control the transmission of
13	infectious agents within the University of Illinois Hospital.
14	(b) A person shall not function as an infection
15	preventionist at the University of Illinois Hospital, and the
16	University of Illinois Hospital shall not employ or contract

1	for the services of an infection preventionist, unless the
2	person meets one of the following requirements:
3	(1) The person has successfully passed an exam from a
4	nationally accredited infection prevention and
5	epidemiology accrediting organization and holds and
6	maintains certification in infection prevention and
7	control from a nationally accredited infection prevention
8	and epidemiology certification organization.
9	(2) The person provides evidence that he or she was
10	employed or otherwise contracted to provide services as an
11	infection preventionist in a hospital for a cumulative
12	period of one year within the 4 years immediately preceding
13	the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 101st
14	General Assembly. Any contractor or employer of an
15	infection preventionist on the effective date of this
16	amendatory Act of the 101st General Assembly shall confirm
17	in a writing to each infection preventionist of the
18	infection preventionist's contract or employment in that
19	capacity.
20	(3) The person is a student or intern performing the
21	functions of an infection preventionist, is under the
22	direct supervision of an infection preventionist
23	appropriately certified under paragraph (1) of this
24	subsection, and is functioning within the scope of a
25	student's or intern's training.
26	(c) A person who functions as an infection preventionist as

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provided in paragraph (2) of subsection (b) shall have 3 years 1 from the date of hire to obtain the infection preventionist 2 credentials outlined in paragraph (1) of subsection (b). 3 4 (d) The University of Illinois Hospital may employ or 5 contract with a person who does not meet the requirements under subsection (b) as an infection preventionist if: 6 7 (1) after a diligent and thorough effort has been made, the University of Illinois Hospital is unable to employ or 8 9 contract with a sufficient number of infection 10 preventionists who meet the requirements under subsection 11 (b); and (2) the University of Illinois Hospital makes a written 12 13 record of its efforts to employ or contract with a 14 sufficient number of infection preventionists who meet the 15 requirements under subsection (b) and retains those 16 records at the University of Illinois Hospital. The person must meet the requirements under paragraph (1) 17 of subsection (b) within 3 years after the start of employment 18 19 or contracting as an infection preventionist. 20 (e) If the University of Illinois Hospital employs or contracts with an infection preventionist, the University of 21 22 Illinois Hospital shall, upon request of another hospital or an infection preventionist employed by, formerly employed by, or 23 24 contracted to perform as an infection preventionist at the 25 University of Illinois Hospital, verify the dates of employment 26 or contract of the infection preventionist.

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1	(f) Nothing in this Section shall prohibit any person from
2	performing an infection preventionist's tasks or functions if
3	the person is acting within the scope of his or her practice.
4	Nothing in this Section shall be construed to prevent or
5	restrict the practice, provision of services, or activities of
6	any person licensed or registered in this State under any other
7	law from engaging in the profession or occupation for which he
8	or she is licensed or registered.
9	(g) The Department of Public Health may adopt rules to
10	implement and administer this Section.
11	Section 10. The Hospital Licensing Act is amended by adding
12	Section 6.23b as follows:

14	Sec. 6.23b. Infection preventionists.
15	(a) For the purposes of this Section, "infection
16	preventionist" means a person designated by a hospital to
17	identify infectious disease processes, conduct surveillance
18	and epidemiologic investigations, and develop plans to prevent
19	and control the transmission of infectious agents within the
20	hospital.
21	(b) A person shall not function as an infection
22	preventionist at a hospital, and a hospital shall not employ or
23	otherwise contract for the services of an infection
24	preventionist, unless the person meets one of the following

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	requirements:

2	(1) The person has successfully passed an exam from a
3	nationally accredited infection prevention and
4	epidemiology accrediting organization and holds and
5	maintains certification in infection prevention and
6	control from a nationally accredited infection preventior
7	and epidemiology certification organization.

8 (2) The person provides evidence that he or she was 9 employed or otherwise contracted to provide services as an 10 infection preventionist in a hospital for a cumulative period of one year within the 4 years immediately preceding 11 the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 101st 12 13 General Assembly. Any contractor or employer of an 14 infection preventionist on the effective date of this 15 amendatory Act of the 101st General Assembly shall confirm in a writing to each infection preventionist of the 16 infection preventionist's contract or employment in that 17 18 capacity.

19 <u>(3) The person is a student or intern performing the</u> 20 <u>functions of an infection preventionist, is under the</u> 21 <u>direct supervision of an infection preventionist</u> 22 <u>appropriately certified under paragraph (1) of this</u> 23 <u>subsection, and is functioning within the scope of a</u> 24 <u>student's or intern's training.</u>

25 (c) A person who functions as an infection preventionist as
26 provided in paragraph (2) of subsection (b) shall have 3 years

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1 from the date of hire to obtain the infection preventionist credentials outlined in paragraph (1) of subsection (b). 2 (d) A hospital may employ or contract with a person who 3 4 does not meet the requirements under subsection (b) as an 5 infection preventionist if: (1) after a diligent and thorough effort has been made, 6 the hospital is unable to employ or contract with a 7 sufficient number of infection preventionists who meet the 8 9 requirements under subsection (b); and 10 (2) the hospital makes a written record of its efforts 11 to employ or contract with a sufficient number of infection 12 preventionists who meet the requirements under subsection 13 (b) and retains those records at the hospital. 14 The person must meet the requirements under paragraph (1) 15 of subsection (b) within 3 years after the start of employment 16 or contracting as an infection preventionist. (e) If a hospital employs or contracts with an infection 17 preventionist, the hospital shall, upon request of another 18 19 hospital or an infection preventionist employed by, formerly 20 employed by, or contracted to perform as an infection preventionist at the hospital, verify the dates of employment 21 22 or contract of the infection preventionist. 23 (f) Nothing in this Section shall prohibit any person from 24 performing an infection preventionist's tasks or functions if 25 the person is acting within the scope of his or her practice.
