SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT SC0006

Introduced 2/13/2019, by Sen. Paul Schimpf

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

ILCON Art. V, Sec. 2

Proposes to amend the Executive Article of the Illinois Constitution. Provides that beginning with the general election in 2022 and every six years thereafter, the Governor and Lieutenant Governor shall hold office for 6 years (rather than four years). Provides that no person shall be elected to more than one term as Governor. Effective upon being declared adopted.

14	(a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b), these
15	These elected officers of the Executive Branch shall hold
16	office for four years beginning on the second Monday of January
17	after their election and, except in the case of the Lieutenant
18	Governor, until their successors are qualified. They shall be
19	elected at the general election in 1978 and every four years
20	thereafter.
21	(b) Beginning with the general election in 2022 and every

six years thereafter, the Governor and Lieutenant Governor

shall hold office for six years beginning on the second Monday

- of January after their election. No person shall be elected to
- 2 <u>more than one term as Governor.</u>
