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1 SENATE RESOLUTION WHEREAS, Kaskaskia Watershed encompasses 10.2 percent of 2 3 the State and includes all or parts of 22 counties; and 4 WHEREAS, Kaskaskia Watershed starts in Champaign County 5 and ends at the Mississippi River in Randolph County; and 6 WHEREAS, Kaskaskia Watershed includes 13 House Districts 7 and eight Senate Districts of the Illinois General Assembly; 8 and 9 WHEREAS, Kaskaskia Watershed has three authorized Corps projects, Lake Shelbyville, Carlyle Lake, and the Kaskaskia 10 11 Navigation Project; and 12 WHEREAS, The Corps projects generate 7.4 million visitors and over \$167.2 million in visitor spending; and 13 WHEREAS, An estimated 557,837 people are served by public 14 15 water from the Corps project in the watershed; and 16 WHEREAS, The Kaskaskia River provides water for cooling 17 purposes to three power plants, one being in the top five power producing-plants in the world; and 18

- 1 WHEREAS, The Kaskaskia River is degrading by a headcut that
- 2 travels at a rate of one mile per year; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Damages induced by headcutting result in
- 4 increased dredging, loss of private property, and significant
- 5 ecosystem degradation to the riverine environment; the largest
- 6 contiguous stand of bottomland hardwood forest in the State of
- 7 Illinois is also affected; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The United States Congress established the
- 9 Kaskaskia Watershed Restoration Act in 2007 and authorized
- \$20,000,000 for critical projects after a Comprehensive Plan is
- 11 developed; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In 2014, the Army Corps of Engineers funded the
- 13 Watershed Comprehensive Plan with \$1.5 million in federal funds
- 14 with a requirement of a 50 percent match of non-federal funds;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, The Comprehensive Plan is stalled due to the lack
- of financial support from the State of Illinois; the remaining
- \$300,000 in non-federal funds is needed to complete the plan
- and to leverage \$20,000,000 in federal funds; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Time is of the essence in that the federal funds
- 21 will be reprogrammed to other states; failure to move forward

- will eliminate the Kaskaskia Watershed from consideration in
- 2 the future; therefore, be it
- 3 RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL
- 4 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge all four
- 5 caucuses and the Governor to consider the Kaskaskia Watershed
- 6 Comprehensive Plan when creating the upcoming fiscal year
- 7 budget.
