The Department of Public Health Powers and 4 Duties Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is 5 amended by adding Section 2310-730 as follows: 6 7 (20 ILCS 2310/2310-730 new) 8 Sec. 2310-730. Nonopioid alternatives pamphlet. The Department of Public Health shall develop and publish on its 9 10 website an educational pamphlet regarding the use of nonopioid 11 alternatives for the treatment of acute nonoperative, acute 12 perioperative, subacute, or chronic pain. The pamphlet shall, 13 at a minimum, conform with the most current CDC Clinical

Practice Guideline for Prescribing Opioids for Pain published

by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and shall

- 12 on page 9, line 25, by replacing "105" with "15"; and
- by replacing lines 16 on page 10 through line 12 on page 11 13

- 15 "shall ensure that nonopioid drugs preferred on the
- 16 Departments preferred drug list, and approved by the U.S. Food
- and Drug Administration, for the treatment or management of 17
- 18 pain shall not be disadvantaged or discouraged with respect to
- coverage relative to any opioid or narcotic drug for the 19
