SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

15 ILCS 335/4 15 ILCS 335/12

from Ch. 124, par. 32

Amends the Illinois Identification Card Act. Sets forth procedures for the Secretary of State to issue a standard Illinois Identification Card to a person committed to the Department of Corrections, Department of Juvenile Justice, or a county jail or county department of corrections (rather than the Department of Corrections or Department of Juvenile Justice). Makes conforming changes. Effective immediately.

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AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Identification Card Act is amended
by changing Sections 4 and 12 as follows:

- 6 (15 ILCS 335/4)
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Sec. 4. Identification card.

9 (a) The Secretary of State shall issue a standard Illinois Identification Card to any natural person who is a resident of 10 the State of Illinois who applies for such card, or renewal 11 thereof. No identification card shall be issued to any person 12 13 who holds a valid foreign state identification card, license, 14 or permit unless the person first surrenders to the Secretary of State the valid foreign state identification card, license, 15 16 or permit. The card shall be prepared and supplied by the 17 Secretary of State and shall include a photograph and signature or mark of the applicant. However, the Secretary of 18 19 State may provide by rule for the issuance of Illinois 20 Identification Cards without photographs if the applicant has 21 a bona fide religious objection to being photographed or to 22 display of his or her photograph. the The Illinois Identification Card may be used for identification purposes in 23

any lawful situation only by the person to whom it was issued. As used in this Act, "photograph" means any color photograph or digitally produced and captured image of an applicant for an identification card. As used in this Act, "signature" means the name of a person as written by that person and captured in a manner acceptable to the Secretary of State.

7 (a-5) If an applicant for an identification card has a 8 current driver's license or instruction permit issued by the 9 Secretary of State, the Secretary may require the applicant to 10 utilize the same residence address and name on the 11 identification card, driver's license, and instruction permit 12 records maintained by the Secretary. The Secretary may promulgate rules to implement this provision. 13

14 (a-10) If the applicant is a judicial officer as defined 15 in Section 1-10 of the Judicial Privacy Act or a peace officer, 16 the applicant may elect to have his or her office or work 17 listed on the card instead of the applicant's address residence or mailing address. The Secretary may promulgate 18 19 rules to implement this provision. For the purposes of this subsection (a-10), "peace officer" means any person who by 20 virtue of his or her office or public employment is vested by 21 22 law with a duty to maintain public order or to make arrests for 23 a violation of any penal statute of this State, whether that duty extends to all violations or is limited to specific 24 25 violations.

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(a-15) The Secretary of State may provide for an expedited

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process for the issuance of an Illinois Identification Card. 1 2 The Secretary shall charge an additional fee for the expedited issuance of an Illinois Identification Card, to be set by 3 rule, not to exceed \$75. All fees collected by the Secretary 4 5 for expedited Illinois Identification Card service shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special Services Fund. 6 7 The Secretary may adopt rules regarding the eligibility, 8 process, and fee for an expedited Illinois Identification 9 Card. If the Secretary of State determines that the volume of 10 expedited identification card requests received on a given day 11 exceeds the ability of the Secretary to process those requests 12 in an expedited manner, the Secretary may decline to provide 13 expedited services, and the additional fee for the expedited service shall be refunded to the applicant. 14

15 (a-20) The Secretary of State shall issue a standard 16 Illinois Identification Card to a person committed to the 17 Department of Corrections, or Department of Juvenile Justice, or a county jail or county department of corrections as 18 follows: upon receipt of the person's birth certificate, 19 20 social security card, photograph, proof of residency upon 21 discharge, and an identification card application transferred 22 via a secure method as agreed upon by the Secretary and the 23 Department of Corrections or Department of Juvenile Justice. Illinois residency shall be established by submission of a 24 25 Secretary of State prescribed Identification Card verification 26 form completed by the respective Department.

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1	(1) A committed person who has previously held an
2	Illinois Identification Card or an Illinois driver's
3	license shall submit an Identification Card verification
4	form to the Secretary of State, including a photograph
5	taken by the correctional facility, proof of residency
6	upon discharge, and a social security number, if the
7	committed person has a social security number. If the
8	committed person does not have a social security number
9	and is eligible for a social security number, the
10	Secretary of State shall not issue a standard Illinois
11	Identification Card until the committed person obtains a
12	social security number. If the committed person's
13	photograph and demographic information matches an existing
14	Illinois Identification Card or Illinois driver's license
15	and the Secretary of State verifies the applicant's social
16	security number with the Social Security Administration,
17	the Secretary of State shall issue the committed person a
18	standard Illinois Identification Card. If the photograph
19	or demographic information matches an existing Illinois
20	Identification Card or Illinois driver's license in
21	another person's name or identity, a standard Illinois
22	Identification Card shall not be issued until the
23	committed person submits a certified birth certificate and
24	social security card to the Secretary of State and the
25	Secretary of State verifies the identity of the committed
26	person. If the Secretary of State cannot find a match to an

1 <u>existing Illinois Identification Card or Illinois driver's</u>
2 <u>license, the committed person may apply for a standard</u>
3 <u>Illinois Identification card as described in paragraph</u>
4 (2).

5 (2) A committed person who has not previously held an Illinois Identification Card or Illinois driver's license 6 7 or for whom a match cannot be found as described in 8 paragraph (1) shall submit an Identification Card 9 verification form, including a photograph taken by the 10 correctional facility, a certified birth certificate, 11 proof of residency upon discharge, and a social security 12 number, if the committed has a social security number. If the committed person does not have a social security 13 14 number and is eligible for a social security number, the Secretary of State shall not issue a standard Illinois 15 16 Identification Card until the committed person obtains a social security number. If the Secretary of State verifies 17 the applicant's social security number with the Social 18 19 Security Administration, the Secretary of State shall 20 issue the committed person a standard Illinois 21 Identification Card. 22 The Illinois Identification Card verification form 23 described in this subsection shall be prescribed by the 24 Secretary State. The Secretary of State and correctional

(a-25) The Secretary of State shall issue a limited-term 1 2 Illinois Identification Card valid for 90 days to a committed 3 person upon release on parole, mandatory supervised release, aftercare release, final discharge, or pardon from the 4 5 Department of Corrections, or Department of Juvenile Justice, or a county jail or county department of corrections, if the 6 7 released person does not obtain a standard Illinois 8 Identification Card as described in subsection (a-20) prior to 9 release is unable to present a certified copy of his or her 10 birth certificate and social security card or other documents 11 authorized by the Secretary, but does present a Secretary of 12 State prescribed Identification Card verification form completed by the correctional facility Department 13 ____f 14 Corrections or Department of Juvenile Justice, verifying the released person's date of birth, social security number, if 15 16 the person has a social security number, and his or her 17 Illinois residence address. The verification form must have been completed no more than 30 days prior to the date of 18 application for the Illinois Identification Card. 19

20 Prior to the expiration of the 90-day period of the 21 limited-term Illinois Identification Card, if the released 22 person submits to the Secretary of State a certified copy of 23 his or her birth certificate and his or her social security 24 card or other documents authorized by the Secretary, a 25 standard Illinois Identification Card shall be issued. A 26 limited-term Illinois Identification Card may not be renewed.

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1 This subsection shall not apply to a released person who 2 was unable to obtain a standard Illinois Identification Card 3 because his or her photograph or demographic information 4 matched an existing Illinois Identification Card or Illinois 5 driver's license in another person's name or identity or to a 6 released person who does not have a social security number and 7 is eligible for a social security number.

8 (a-30) The Secretary of State shall issue a standard 9 Illinois Identification Card to a person upon conditional 10 release or absolute discharge from the custody of the 11 Department of Human Services, if the person presents a 12 certified copy of his or her birth certificate, social 13 security card, or other documents authorized by the Secretary, and a document proving his or her Illinois residence address. 14 The Secretary of State shall issue a standard Illinois 15 16 Identification Card to a person prior to his or her 17 conditional release or absolute discharge if personnel from the Department of Human Services bring the person to a 18 Secretary of State location with the required documents. 19 20 Documents proving residence address may include any official document of the Department of Human Services showing the 21 22 person's address after release and a Secretary of State 23 prescribed verification form, which may be executed by personnel of the Department of Human Services. 24

(a-35) The Secretary of State shall issue a limited-term
 Illinois Identification Card valid for 90 days to a person

upon conditional release or absolute discharge from the 1 2 custody of the Department of Human Services, if the person is 3 unable to present a certified copy of his or her birth certificate and social security card or other documents 4 5 authorized by the Secretary, but does present a Secretary of State prescribed verification form completed by the Department 6 7 of Human Services, verifying the person's date of birth and 8 social security number, and a document proving his or her Illinois residence address. The verification form must have 9 10 been completed no more than 30 days prior to the date of 11 application for the Illinois Identification Card. The 12 Secretary of State shall issue a limited-term Illinois 13 Identification Card to a person no sooner than 14 days prior to 14 his or her conditional release or absolute discharge if personnel from the Department of Human Services bring the 15 16 person to a Secretary of State location with the required 17 documents. Documents proving residence address shall include any official document of the Department of Human Services 18 19 showing the person's address after release and a Secretary of State prescribed verification form, which may be executed by 20 personnel of the Department of Human Services. 21

(b) The Secretary of State shall issue a special Illinois Identification Card, which shall be known as an Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card, to any natural person who is a resident of the State of Illinois, who is a person with a disability as defined in Section 4A of this Act,

who applies for such card, or renewal thereof. No Illinois 1 2 Person with a Disability Identification Card shall be issued 3 to any person who holds a valid foreign state identification card, license, or permit unless the person first surrenders to 4 5 the Secretary of State the valid foreign state identification 6 card, license, or permit. The Secretary of State shall charge no fee to issue such card. The card shall be prepared and 7 supplied by the Secretary of State, and shall include a 8 9 photograph and signature or mark of the applicant, a 10 designation indicating that the card is an Illinois Person 11 with a Disability Identification Card, and shall include a 12 comprehensible designation of the type and classification of the applicant's disability as set out in Section 4A of this 13 14 Act. However, the Secretary of State may provide by rule for 15 the issuance of Illinois Person with а Disabilitv 16 Identification Cards without photographs if the applicant has 17 a bona fide religious objection to being photographed or to the display of his or her photograph. If the applicant so 18 requests, the card shall include a description of 19 the 20 applicant's disability and any information about the applicant's disability or medical history which the Secretary 21 22 determines would be helpful to the applicant in securing 23 emergency medical care. If a mark is used in lieu of a signature, such mark shall be affixed to the card in the 24 25 presence of two witnesses who attest to the authenticity of 26 the mark. The Illinois Person with a Disability Identification

Card may be used for identification purposes in any lawful
 situation by the person to whom it was issued.

3 The Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card may be used as adequate documentation of disability in lieu of 4 5 a physician's determination of disability, a determination of disability from a physician assistant, a determination of 6 7 disability from an advanced practice registered nurse, or any 8 other documentation of disability whenever any State law 9 requires that a person with a disability provide such 10 documentation of disability, however an Illinois Person with a 11 Disability Identification Card shall not qualify the 12 cardholder to participate in any program or to receive any 13 benefit which is not available to all persons with like 14 disabilities. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, an 15 Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card, or 16 evidence that the Secretary of State has issued an Illinois 17 Person with a Disability Identification Card, shall not be 18 used by any person other than the person named on such card to 19 prove that the person named on such card is a person with a 20 disability or for any other purpose unless the card is used for 21 the benefit of the person named on such card, and the person 22 named on such card consents to such use at the time the card is 23 so used.

An optometrist's determination of a visual disability under Section 4A of this Act is acceptable as documentation for the purpose of issuing an Illinois Person with a

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1 Disability Identification Card.

2 When medical information is contained on an Illinois 3 Person with a Disability Identification Card, the Office of 4 the Secretary of State shall not be liable for any actions 5 taken based upon that medical information.

The Secretary of State shall provide that each 6 (C) 7 original or renewal Illinois Identification Card or Illinois 8 Person with a Disability Identification Card issued to a 9 person under the age of 21 shall be of a distinct nature from those Illinois Identification Cards or Illinois Person with a 10 11 Disability Identification Cards issued to individuals 21 years 12 age or older. The color designated for Illinois of 13 Identification Cards or Illinois Person with a Disability 14 Identification Cards for persons under the age of 21 shall be 15 at the discretion of the Secretary of State.

16 (c-1) Each original or renewal Illinois Identification 17 Card or Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card 18 issued to a person under the age of 21 shall display the date 19 upon which the person becomes 18 years of age and the date upon 20 which the person becomes 21 years of age.

(c-3) The General Assembly recognizes the need to identify military veterans living in this State for the purpose of ensuring that they receive all of the services and benefits to which they are legally entitled, including healthcare, education assistance, and job placement. To assist the State in identifying these veterans and delivering these vital

services and benefits, the Secretary of State is authorized to 1 2 issue Illinois Identification Cards and Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Cards with the word "veteran" 3 appearing on the face of the cards. This authorization is 4 5 predicated on the unique status of veterans. The Secretary may not issue any other identification card which identifies an 6 7 occupation, status, affiliation, hobby, or other unique characteristics of the identification card holder which is 8 9 unrelated to the purpose of the identification card.

10 (c-5) Beginning on or before July 1, 2015, the Secretary 11 of State shall designate a space on each original or renewal 12 identification card where, at the request of the applicant, 13 the word "veteran" shall be placed. The veteran designation 14 shall be available to a person identified as a veteran under 15 subsection (b) of Section 5 of this Act who was discharged or 16 separated under honorable conditions.

17 (d) The Secretary of State may issue a Senior Citizen discount card, to any natural person who is a resident of the 18 State of Illinois who is 60 years of age or older and who 19 20 applies for such a card or renewal thereof. The Secretary of State shall charge no fee to issue such card. The card shall be 21 22 issued in every county and applications shall be made 23 available at, but not limited to, nutrition sites, senior citizen centers and Area Agencies on Aging. The applicant, 24 25 upon receipt of such card and prior to its use for any purpose, 26 shall have affixed thereon in the space provided therefor his

1 signature or mark.

2 (e) The Secretary of State, in his or her discretion, may designate on each Illinois Identification Card or Illinois 3 Person with a Disability Identification Card a space where the 4 5 card holder may place a sticker or decal, issued by the Secretary of State, of uniform size as the Secretary may 6 7 specify, that shall indicate in appropriate language that the card holder has renewed his or her Illinois Identification 8 9 Card or Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card. 10 (Source: P.A. 102-299, eff. 8-6-21; 103-345, eff. 1-1-24.)

(a-25) The Secretary of State shall issue a limited-term 4 5 Illinois Identification Card valid for 90 days to a committed person upon release on parole, mandatory supervised release, 6 7 aftercare release, final discharge, or pardon from the 8 Department of Corrections, or Department of Juvenile Justice, 9 or a county jail or county department of corrections, if the released person does not obtain a standard Illinois 10 11 Identification Card as described in subsection (a-20) prior to 12 release is unable to present a certified copy of his or her 13 birth certificate and social security card, if the person has 14 a social security number, or other documents authorized by the 15 Secretary, but does present a Secretary of State prescribed 16 Identification Card verification form completed by the 17 correctional facility Department of Corrections or Department of Juvenile Justice, verifying the released person's date of 18 19 birth, social security number, if the person has a social security number, and his or her Illinois residence address. 20 The verification form must have been completed no more than 30 21 22 days prior to the date of application for the Illinois 23 Identification Card.

Prior to the expiration of the 90-day period of the limited-term Illinois Identification Card, if the released person submits to the Secretary of State a certified copy of his or her birth certificate and his or her social security card, if the person has a social security number, or other documents authorized by the Secretary, a standard Illinois Identification Card shall be issued. A limited-term Illinois Identification Card may not be renewed.

6 <u>This subsection shall not apply to a released person who</u> 7 <u>was unable to obtain a standard Illinois Identification Card</u> 8 <u>because his or her photograph or demographic information</u> 9 <u>matched an existing Illinois Identification Card or Illinois</u> 10 <u>driver's license in another person's name or identity or to a</u> 11 <u>released person who does not have a social security number and</u> 12 <u>is eligible for a social security number.</u>

13 (a-30) The Secretary of State shall issue a standard 14 Illinois Identification Card to a person upon conditional 15 release or absolute discharge from the custody of the Department of Human Services, if the person presents a 16 17 certified copy of his or her birth certificate, social security card, if the person has a social security number, or 18 other documents authorized by the Secretary, and a document 19 20 proving his or her Illinois residence address. The Secretary of State shall issue a standard Illinois Identification Card 21 22 to a person prior to his or her conditional release or absolute 23 discharge if personnel from the Department of Human Services bring the person to a Secretary of State location with the 24 25 required documents. Documents proving residence address may 26 include any official document of the Department of Human

Services showing the person's address after release and a
 Secretary of State prescribed verification form, which may be
 executed by personnel of the Department of Human Services.

(a-35) The Secretary of State shall issue a limited-term 4 5 Illinois Identification Card valid for 90 days to a person upon conditional release or absolute discharge from the 6 7 custody of the Department of Human Services, if the person is 8 unable to present a certified copy of his or her birth 9 certificate and social security card, if the person has a 10 social security number, or other documents authorized by the 11 Secretary, but does present a Secretary of State prescribed 12 verification form completed by the Department of Human Services, verifying the person's date of birth and social 13 14 security number, if the person has a social security number, 15 and a document proving his or her Illinois residence address. 16 The verification form must have been completed no more than 30 17 days prior to the date of application for the Illinois Identification Card. The Secretary of State shall issue a 18 limited-term Illinois Identification Card to a person no 19 20 sooner than 14 days prior to his or her conditional release or 21 absolute discharge if personnel from the Department of Human 22 Services bring the person to a Secretary of State location 23 with the required documents. Documents proving residence address shall include any official document of the Department 24 25 of Human Services showing the person's address after release 26 and a Secretary of State prescribed verification form, which

1 may be executed by personnel of the Department of Human 2 Services.

(b) The Secretary of State shall issue a special Illinois 3 Identification Card, which shall be known as an Illinois 4 5 Person with a Disability Identification Card, to any natural person who is a resident of the State of Illinois, who is a 6 7 person with a disability as defined in Section 4A of this Act, 8 who applies for such card, or renewal thereof. However, the Secretary of State may provide by rule for 22 the issuance of Illinois Person with а Disability 23 Identification Cards without photographs if the applicant has a bona fide religious objection to being photographed or to 24 25 the display of his or her photograph. If the applicant so 26 requests, the card shall include a description of the

disability and any information 1 applicant's about the 2 applicant's disability or medical history which the Secretary 3 determines would be helpful to the applicant in securing emergency medical care. If a mark is used in lieu of a 4 5 signature, such mark shall be affixed to the card in the presence of two witnesses who attest to the authenticity of 6 7 the mark. The Illinois Person with a Disability Identification 8 Card may be used for identification purposes in any lawful 9 situation by the person to whom it was issued.

10 The Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card 11 may be used as adequate documentation of disability in lieu of 12 a physician's determination of disability, a determination of 13 disability from a physician assistant, a determination of 14 disability from an advanced practice registered nurse, or any 15 other documentation of disability whenever any State law 16 requires that a person with a disability provide such 17 documentation of disability, however an Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card shall 18 not qualify the 19 cardholder to participate in any program or to receive any 20 benefit which is not available to all persons with like disabilities. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, an 21 22 Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card, or 23 evidence that the Secretary of State has issued an Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card, shall not be 24 25 used by any person other than the person named on such card to 26 prove that the person named on such card is a person with a

disability or for any other purpose unless the card is used for the benefit of the person named on such card, and the person named on such card consents to such use at the time the card is so used.

5 An optometrist's determination of a visual disability 6 under Section 4A of this Act is acceptable as documentation 7 for the purpose of issuing an Illinois Person with a 8 Disability Identification Card.

9 When medical information is contained on an Illinois 10 Person with a Disability Identification Card, the Office of 11 the Secretary of State shall not be liable for any actions 12 taken based upon that medical information.

13 The Secretary of State shall provide that each (C) original or renewal Illinois Identification Card or Illinois 14 15 Person with a Disability Identification Card issued to a 16 person under the age of 21 shall be of a distinct nature from 17 those Illinois Identification Cards or Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Cards issued to individuals 21 years 18 19 age or older. The color designated for Illinois of 20 Identification Cards or Illinois Person with a Disability 21 Identification Cards for persons under the age of 21 shall be 22 at the discretion of the Secretary of State.

(c-1) Each original or renewal Illinois Identification Card or Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card issued to a person under the age of 21 shall display the date upon which the person becomes 18 years of age and the date upon

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1 which the person becomes 21 years of age.

2 (c-3) The General Assembly recognizes the need to identify 3 military veterans living in this State for the purpose of ensuring that they receive all of the services and benefits to 4 5 which they are legally entitled, including healthcare, 6 education assistance, and job placement. To assist the State 7 in identifying these veterans and delivering these vital services and benefits, the Secretary of State is authorized to 8 issue Illinois Identification Cards and Illinois Person with a 9 Disability Identification Cards with the word "veteran" 10 11 appearing on the face of the cards. This authorization is 12 predicated on the unique status of veterans. The Secretary may 13 not issue any other identification card which identifies an 14 occupation, status, affiliation, hobby, or other unique characteristics of the identification card holder which is 15 16 unrelated to the purpose of the identification card.

17 (c-5) Beginning on or before July 1, 2015, the Secretary 18 of State shall designate a space on each original or renewal 19 identification card where, at the request of the applicant, 20 the word "veteran" shall be placed. The veteran designation 21 shall be available to a person identified as a veteran under 22 subsection (b) of Section 5 of this Act who was discharged or 23 separated under honorable conditions.

(d) The Secretary of State may issue a Senior Citizen
discount card, to any natural person who is a resident of the
State of Illinois who is 60 years of age or older and who

applies for such a card or renewal thereof. The Secretary of 1 2 State shall charge no fee to issue such card. The card shall be 3 issued in every county and applications shall be made available at, but not limited to, nutrition sites, senior 4 5 citizen centers and Area Agencies on Aging. The applicant, upon receipt of such card and prior to its use for any purpose, 6 7 shall have affixed thereon in the space provided therefor his 8 signature or mark.

9 (e) The Secretary of State, in his or her discretion, may 10 designate on each Illinois Identification Card or Illinois 11 Person with a Disability Identification Card a space where the 12 card holder may place a sticker or decal, issued by the Secretary of State, of uniform size as the Secretary may 13 14 specify, that shall indicate in appropriate language that the card holder has renewed his or her Illinois Identification 15 16 Card or Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card. 17 (Source: P.A. 102-299, eff. 8-6-21; 103-210, eff. 7-1-24; 103-345, eff. 1-1-24; revised 12-12-23.) 18

An individual, who resides in a veterans home or veterans 9 10 hospital operated by the State or federal government, who makes an application for an Illinois Identification Card to be 11 12 issued at no fee, must submit, along with the application, an affirmation by the applicant on a form provided by the 13 Secretary of State, that such person resides in a veterans 14 15 home or veterans hospital operated by the State or federal 16 government.

The application of a homeless individual for an Illinois Identification Card to be issued at no fee must be accompanied by an affirmation by a qualified person, as defined in Section 4C of this Act, on a form provided by the Secretary of State, that the applicant is currently homeless as defined in Section 1A of this Act.

For the application for the first Illinois Identification Card of a youth for whom the Department of Children and Family Services is legally responsible or a foster child to be issued at no fee, the youth must submit, along with the application, 1 an affirmation by his or her court appointed attorney or an 2 employee of the Department of Children and Family Services on 3 a form provided by the Secretary of State, that the person is a 4 youth for whom the Department of Children and Family Services 5 is legally responsible or a foster child.

6 The fee for any duplicate identification card shall be 7 waived for any person who presents the Secretary of State's 8 Office with a police report showing that his or her 9 identification card was stolen.

10 The fee for any duplicate identification card shall be 11 waived for any person age 60 or older whose identification 12 card has been lost or stolen.

As used in this Section, "active-duty member of the United States Armed Forces" means a member of the Armed Services or Reserve Forces of the United States or a member of the Illinois National Guard who is called to active duty pursuant to an executive order of the President of the United States, an act of the Congress of the United States, or an order of the Governor.
