

## 93RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2003 and 2004

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

730 ILCS 5/5-4-3a new

Amends the Unified Code of Corrections. Provides that on or before February 1, 2005 and on or before February 1 of each year thereafter, the Department of State Police shall report to the Governor and both houses of the General Assembly the following information: (1) the extent of the backlog of cases awaiting testing or awaiting DNA analysis by that Department; and (2) what measures have been and are being taken to reduce that backlog and the estimated costs or expenditures in doing so. Provides that this information reported shall be made available to the public, at the time it is reported, on the official web site of the Department of State Police. Effective immediately.

- (1) the extent of the backlog of cases awaiting testing 12 or awaiting DNA analysis by that Department, including but 13 not limited to those tests conducted under Section 5-4-3, 14

- (2) what measures have been and are being taken to 16 17 reduce that backlog and the estimated costs or expenditures 18 in doing so.
- 19 (b) The information reported under this Section shall be made available to the public, at the time it is reported, on 20 the official web site of the Department of State Police. 21
