750 ILCS 36/112

Amends the Uniform Child-Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act. Makes a technical change in a Section concerning cooperation between courts and preservation of records.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**  
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Uniform Child-Custody Jurisdiction and  
5 Enforcement Act is amended by changing Section 112 as follows:

6 (750 ILCS 36/112)

7 Sec. 112. Cooperation Between Courts; Preservation Of  
8 Records.

9 (a) A court of this State may request the ~~the~~ appropriate  
10 court of another state to:

11 (1) hold an evidentiary hearing;

12 (2) order a person to produce or give evidence pursuant  
13 to procedures of that state;

14 (3) order that an evaluation be made with respect to  
15 the custody of a child involved in a pending proceeding;

16 (4) forward to the court of this State a certified copy  
17 of the transcript of the record of the hearing, the  
18 evidence otherwise presented, and any evaluation prepared  
19 in compliance with the request; and

20 (5) order a party to a child-custody proceeding or any  
21 person having physical custody of the child to appear in  
22 the proceeding with or without the child.

23 (b) Upon request of a court of another state, a court of  
24 this State may hold a hearing or enter an order described in  
25 subsection (a).

26 (c) Travel and other necessary and reasonable expenses  
27 incurred under subsections (a) and (b) may be assessed against  
28 the parties according to the law of this State.

29 (d) A court of this State shall preserve the pleadings,  
30 orders, decrees, records of hearings, evaluations, and other  
31 pertinent records with respect to a child-custody proceeding  
32 until the child attains 18 years of age. Upon appropriate

1 request by a court or law enforcement official of another  
2 state, the court shall forward a certified copy of those  
3 records.
