| 13 | subsection (f) of Section 8 and the rules adopted by the |
| 14 | Department, must first obtain a temporary license from the |
| 15 | Department. A temporary license may be issued by the Department |
| 16 | only to an applicant pursuing licensure as a speech-language |
| 17 | pathologist in this State. A temporary license shall be issued |
| 18 | to an applicant upon receipt of the required fee as set forth |
| 19 | by rule and documentation on forms prescribed by the Department |
| 20 | certifying that his or her professional experience will be |
| 21 | supervised by a licensed speech-language pathologist. A |
| 22 | temporary license shall be issued for a period of 12 months and |

curriculum required to receive a master's degree in 1 speech-language pathology, as minimally required under 2 3 subsection (d) of Section 8 of this Act for a license to practice speech-language pathology, but who has not yet been 4 5 been conferred the master's degree, may make application to the Department for a temporary license under this Section and may 6 7 begin his or her supervised professional experience as a speech-language pathologist without a temporary license for 8 120 days from the date of application or until disposition of 9 10 the license application by the Department, whichever is sooner.
