### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

755 ILCS 5/18-1.1

from Ch. 110 1/2, par. 18-1.1

Amends the Probate Act of 1975. Provides that a statutory custodial claim against the estate of a deceased disabled person made by a close relative of the disabled person who cared for the disabled person by living with and personally caring for the disabled person for at least 3 years is based on the degree of the person's disability, as follows: 100% disability \$180,000 (at present, \$100,000); 75% disability \$135,000 (at present, \$75,000); 50% disability \$90,000 (at present, \$50,000); and 25% disability \$45,000 (at present, \$25,000).

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Probate Act of 1975 is amended by changing
Section 18-1.1 as follows:

7 18-1.1. Statutory custodial claim. Any Sec. spouse, 8 parent, brother, sister, or child of a disabled person who 9 dedicates himself or herself to the care of the disabled person by living with and personally caring for the disabled person 10 for at least 3 years shall be entitled to a claim against the 11 estate upon the death of the disabled person. The claim shall 12 into consideration the claimant's 13 take lost employment 14 opportunities, lost lifestyle opportunities, and emotional distress experienced as a result of personally caring for the 15 16 disabled person. The claim shall be in addition to any other 17 claim, including without limitation a reasonable claim for nursing and other care. The claim shall be based upon the 18 19 nature and extent of the person's disability and, at a minimum 20 but subject to the extent of the assets available, shall be in 21 the amounts set forth below:

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1. 100% disability, \$180,000 <del>\$100,000</del>

23 2. 75% disability, <u>\$135,000</u> <del>\$75,000</del>

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- 1 3. 50% disability, <u>\$90,000</u> <del>\$50,000</del>
- 2 4. 25% disability, <u>\$45,000</u> <del>\$25,000</del>
