1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 1549

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 1549, AS AMENDED, by
3 replacing everything after the enacting clause with the
4 following:

5 "Section 5. The Good Samaritan Act is amended by changing
6 Sections 10 and 12 as follows:

7 (745 ILCS 49/10)

8 Sec. 10. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation; exemption from
9 civil liability for emergency care. Any person trained
10 ~~currently certified~~ in basic cardiopulmonary resuscitation who
11 has successfully completed training in accordance with the
12 standards of the American Red Cross or the American Heart
13 Association and ~~complies with generally recognized standards,~~
14 ~~and~~ who in good faith, not for compensation, provides emergency
15 cardiopulmonary resuscitation in accordance with his or her
16 training to a person who is an apparent victim of acute

1 cardiopulmonary insufficiency shall not, as the result of his
2 or her acts or omissions in providing resuscitation, be liable
3 for civil damages, unless the acts or omissions constitute
4 willful and wanton misconduct.

7 Sec. 12. Use of an automated external defibrillator;
8 exemption from civil liability for emergency care. As provided
9 in Section 30 of the Automated External Defibrillator Act, any
10 automated external defibrillator user who has successfully
11 completed training in accordance with the standards of the
12 American Red Cross or the American Heart Association and who in
13 good faith and without fee or compensation renders emergency
14 medical care involving the use of an automated external
15 defibrillator in accordance with his or her training is not
16 liable for any civil damages as a result of any act or
17 omission, except for willful and wanton misconduct, by that
18 person in rendering that care.
