Licensure as a barber; qualifications. A person 8 9 is qualified to receive a license as a barber if that person has applied in writing on forms prescribed by the Department, 10 11 has paid the required fees, and: a. Is at least 16 years of age; and 12 b. Has a certificate of graduation from a school providing 13 14 secondary education, or the recognized equivalent of such a

certificate, or persons who are beyond the age of compulsory

- 1 school attendance; and
- 2 c. Has graduated from a school of barbering or school of
- 3 cosmetology approved by the Department, having completed a
- 4 total of 1500 hours in the study of barbering extending over a
- 5 period of not less than 9 months nor more than 3 years. A
- 6 school of barbering may, at its discretion, consistent with the
- 7 rules of the Department, accept up to 500 hours of cosmetology
- 8 school training at a recognized cosmetology school toward the
- 9 1500 hour course requirement of barbering. Time spent in such
- 10 study under the laws of another state or territory of the
- 11 United States or of a foreign country or province shall be
- 12 credited toward the period of study required by the provisions
- of this paragraph; and
- d. Has passed an examination caused to be conducted by the
- 15 Department or its designated testing service to determine
- 16 fitness to receive a license as a barber; and
- 17 e. Has met all other requirements of this Act.

- 21 Sec. 2-4. Licensure as a barber teacher; qualifications.
- 22 (1) A person is qualified to receive a license as a barber
- 23 teacher if that person files an application on forms provided
- 24 by the Department, pays the required fee, and:
- a. Is at least 18 years of age;

1	b. Has graduated from high school or its equivalent;
2	c. Has a current license as a barber or cosmetologist;
3	d. Has graduated from a barber school or school of
4	<pre>cosmetology approved by the Department having either:</pre>
5	(1) completed a total of 500 hours in barber
6	teacher training extending over a period of not less
7	than 3 months nor more than 2 years and has had 3 years
8	of practical experience as a licensed barber; or
9	(2) completed a total of 1,000 hours of barber
10	teacher training extending over a period of not less
11	than 6 months nor more than 2 years; or and
12	(3) completed the cosmetology teacher training as
13	specified in paragraph (4) of subsection (a) of Section
14	3-4 of this Act; and
15	e. Has passed an examination authorized by the
16	Department to determine fitness to receive a license as a
17	barber teacher or a cosmetology teacher; and
18	f. Has met any other requirements set forth in this
19	Act.
20	An applicant who is issued a license as a Barber Teacher is
21	not required to maintain a barber license in order to practice
22	barbering as defined in this Act.
23	(2) A person is qualified to receive a license as a barber
24	clinic teacher if he or she has applied in writing on forms
25	provided by the Department, has paid the required fees, and:
26	(A) is at least 18 years of age;

- 1 (B) has graduated from high school or its equivalent;
- 2 (C) has a current license as a barber;
 - (D) has (i) completed a program of 250 hours of clinic teacher training in a licensed school of barbering or (ii) within 5 years preceding the required examination, has obtained a minimum of 2 years of practical experience working at least 30 full-time hours per week as a licensed barber and has completed an instructor's institute of 20 hours, as prescribed by the Department, prior to submitting an application for examination;
 - (E) has passed an examination authorized by the Department to determine eligibility to receive a license as a barber teacher; and
 - (F) has met any other requirements of this Act.

The Department shall not issue any new barber clinic teacher licenses after January 1, 2009. Any person issued a license as a barber clinic teacher before January 1, 2009, may renew the license after that date under this Act and that person may continue to renew the license or have the license restored during his or her lifetime, subject only to the renewal or restoration requirements for the license under this Act; however, such licensee and license shall remain subject to the provisions of this Act, including, but not limited to, provisions concerning renewal, restoration, fees, continuing education, discipline, administration, and enforcement.

- Sec. 2-9. Degree in barbering at a cosmetology school. A
- 3 school of cosmetology may offer a degree in barbering, as
- 4 defined by this Act, provided that the school of cosmetology
- 5 complies with subsections (c), (d), and (e) of Section 2-2 of
- 6 this Act; utilizes barber teachers properly licensed under
- 7 paragraph (1) of Section 2-4 of this Act; and complies with
- 8 <u>Sections 2A-7 and 3B-10 of this Act.</u>
- 9 (225 ILCS 410/2A-1)
- 10 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2016)
- 11 Sec. 2A-1. Application. The provisions of this Article IIA
- are applicable only to barber or cosmetology schools regulated
- 13 under this Act.
