- 1 entities in the State for the purposes set out in the
- 2 Charitable Trust Stabilization Act.

3 ARTICLE 41

- 4 Section 5. The sum of \$62,622,000, or so much thereof as
- 5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Education
- 6 Assistance Fund to the Teachers' Retirement System of the
- 7 State of Illinois for deposit into the Teacher Health
- 8 Insurance Security Fund as the state's contribution for
- 9 teachers' health insurance.

- 11 Section 999. Effective date. This Act takes effect July
- 12 1, 2013.
