Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
22-77 as follows:

(105 ILCS 5/22-77 new) 6 7 (Section scheduled to be repealed on July 1, 2014) Sec. 22-77. Young Adults Heroin Use Task Force. 8 9 (a) There is created the Young Adults Heroin Use Task Force to address the growing problem of heroin use in high schools 10 across this State. The Task Force shall consist of all of the 11 12 following members: (1) Four members of the House of Representatives, 13 14 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. (2) Three members of the House of Representatives, 15 appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of 16 17 Representatives. (3) Four members of the Senate, appointed by the 18 19 President of the Senate. (4) Three members of the Senate, appointed by the 20 21 Minority Leader of the Senate. 22 (5) One representative of a statewide association representing school boards, appointed by the Governor. 23

3	Members of the Task Force shall serve without compensation.
4	(b) The Department of Human Services' Division of
5	Alcoholism and Substance Abuse shall provide administrative
6	and other support to the Task Force.
7	(c) The Task Force shall conduct a study on the heroin use
8	problem in high schools and suggest programs for high schools
9	to use to address the problem, which programs may involve local
10	law enforcement agencies.
11	(d) On or before June 30, 2014, the Task Force shall report
12	its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly, by
13	filing copies of its report as provided in Section 3.1 of the
14	General Assembly Organization Act, and to the Governor.
15	(e) The Task Force is abolished and this Section is
16	repealed on July 1, 2014.
