The Charitable Games Act is amended by changing 4 Section 2 as follows: 5 6 (230 ILCS 30/2) (from Ch. 120, par. 1122) 7 Sec. 2. Definitions. For purposes of this Act, the 8 following definitions apply: "Charitable games" means the 14 games of chance involving 9 cards, dice, wheels, random selection of numbers, and gambling 10 tickets which may be conducted at charitable games events 11 listed as follows: roulette, blackjack, poker, pull tabs, 12 13 craps, bang, beat the dealer, big six, gin rummy, five card stud poker, chuck-a-luck, keno, hold-em poker, and merchandise 14

"Charitable games event" or "event" means the type of

- 1 fundraising event authorized by the Act at which participants
- 2 pay to play charitable games for the chance of winning cash or
- 3 noncash prizes. "Charitable games event" or "event" includes a
- 4 poker run.
- 5 "Charitable organization" means an organization or
- 6 institution organized and operated to benefit an indefinite
- 7 number of the public.
- 8 "Chips" means scrip, play money, poker or casino chips, or
- 9 any other representations of money, used to make wagers on the
- 10 outcome of any charitable game.
- "Department" means the Department of Revenue.
- 12 "Educational organization" means an organization or
- 13 institution organized and operated to provide systematic
- instruction in useful branches of learning by methods common to
- schools and institutions of learning which compare favorably in
- their scope and intensity with the course of study presented in
- 17 tax-supported schools.
- "Fraternal organization" means an organization of persons
- 19 having a common interest that is organized and operated
- 20 exclusively to promote the welfare of its members and to
- 21 benefit the general public on a continuing and consistent
- 22 basis, including but not limited to ethnic organizations.
- "Labor organization" means an organization composed of
- 24 labor unions or workers organized with the objective of
- 25 betterment of the conditions of those engaged in such pursuit
- and the development of a higher degree of efficiency in their

- 1 respective occupations.
- 2 "Licensed organization" means a qualified organization
- 3 that has obtained a license to conduct a charitable games event
- 4 in conformance with the provisions of this Act.
- 5 "Non-profit organization" means an organization or
- 6 institution organized and conducted on a not-for-profit basis
- 7 with no personal profit inuring to anyone as a result of the
- 8 operation.
- 9 "Organization": A corporation, agency, partnership,
- 10 association, firm, business, or other entity consisting of 2 or
- more persons joined by a common interest or purpose.
- "Person" means any natural individual, corporation,
- 13 partnership, limited liability company, organization as
- 14 defined in this Section, qualified organization, licensed
- organization, licensee under this Act, or volunteer.
- 16 "Poker run" means an event organized by a sponsoring
- 17 organization in which participants travel to 5 or more
- 18 predetermined locations, drawing a playing card or equivalent
- 19 item at each location, in order to assemble a facsimile of a
- 20 poker hand or other numeric score. "Poker run" includes dice
- 21 runs, marble runs, or other events where the objective is to
- build the best hand or highest score by obtaining an item at
- each location.
- "Premises" means a distinct parcel of land and the
- 25 buildings thereon.
- 26 "Provider" means the person or organization owning,

- 1 leasing, or controlling premises upon which any charitable games event is to be conducted. 2
- "Qualified organization" means: 3
- 4 a charitable, religious, fraternal, veterans, 5 labor, or educational organization, or or other institution organized and conducted on a not-for-profit 6 basis with no personal profit inuring to anyone as a result 7 of the operation and which is exempt from federal income 8 9 taxation under Sections 501(c)(3), 501(c)(4), 501(c)(5), 10 501(c)(8), 501(c)(10) or 501(c)(19) of the Internal 11 Revenue Code:
 - (b) a veterans organization as defined in Section 1.1 of the "Bingo License and Tax Act"organized and conducted on a not-for-profit basis with no personal profit inuring to anyone as a result of the operation; or
- 16 auxiliary organization of a veterans (C) An 17 organization.
- "Religious organization" means any church, congregation, 18 19 society, or organization founded for the purpose of religious 20 worship.
- "Sponsoring organization" means a qualified organization 2.1 22 that has obtained a license to conduct a charitable games event 23 in conformance with the provisions of this Act.
- 24 "Supplier" means any person, firm, or corporation that 25 sells, leases, lends, distributes, or otherwise provides to any 26 organization licensed to conduct charitable games events in

- 1 Illinois any charitable games equipment.
- 2 "Veterans' organization" means an organization comprised
- 3 of members of which substantially all are individuals who are
- 4 veterans or spouses, widows, or widowers of veterans, the
- 5 primary purpose of which is to promote the welfare of its
- 6 members and to provide assistance to the general public in such
- 7 a way as to confer a public benefit.
- 8 "Volunteer" means a person recruited by a licensed
- 9 organization who voluntarily performs services at a charitable
- 10 games event, including participation in the management or
- operation of a game, as defined in Section 8.

- 13 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 14 becoming law.".
