2 WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of 3 Representatives wish to congratulate Stanley D. Banash "Tex" on 4 the publication of his third book, Roadside History of Illinois 5 (Mountain Press, 2013); and

6 WHEREAS, Roadside History of Illinois is the first book in 7 more than 30 years to focus on the history of the State; and

8 WHEREAS, Roadside History of Illinois is designed to 9 educate and guide motorists and tourists along old U.S. 10 highways, State roadways, and county roads to the people, 11 places, and events that contributed to the State's historic 12 development; and

13 WHEREAS, Roadside History of Illinois highlights the 7 14 regions of the State - Southern Illinois: Between the Great 15 Rivers; Western Illinois: Utopia on the Prairie; Central 16 Illinois: Lincoln's Legacy; Eastern Illinois: More than You 17 Expect; Northern Illinois: Rock River and Beyond; Greater 18 Chicagoland: Metropolitan Diversity; and Chicago: City of 19 Neighborhoods; and

2 WHEREAS, Roadside History of Illinois includes a special 3 introduction by the late Dee Brown, author of the 4 internationally acclaimed book, Bury My Heart at Wounded Knee, 5 and a former agriculture librarian at the University of 6 Illinois at Champaign-Urbana; and

7 WHEREAS, Roadside History of Illinois has been praised by 8 former U.S. Senator Adlai E. Stevenson III and Chief Deputy 9 Director of the Illinois State Archives Wayne C. Temple, Ph.D.; 10 and

11 WHEREAS, Stan Banash retains a great love of Illinois, 12 Civil War, and Old West history that began at an early age and 13 continues to this day; and

14 WHEREAS, Stan Banash served 4 years in the United States 15 Air Force (Strategic Air Command), graduated from Northwestern University with a Bachelor of Philosophy degree in Political 16 Science (1968), and graduated from Roosevelt University with a 17 18 Master of Arts degree in Urban Studies (1972), and owned and 19 home-based public relations, association operated а management, and political consulting business (1972-2014); and 20

2 and served as Executive Director of the Illinois Law Revision
3 Commission (1976-1984); and

WHEREAS, Stan Banash authored more than 10 feature articles
for various national and local publications and reviewed more
than 30 books for national publications; and

7 WHEREAS, Stan Banash authored 2 earlier books - Best of Dee
8 Brown's West (Clear Light, 1998) and Dee Brown's Civil War
9 Anthology (Clear Light, 1998); and

10 Banash became knowledgeable WHEREAS, Stan about а life-saving maneuver after attending a private luncheon with 11 12 Dr. Henry Heimlich, who devised the Heimlich Maneuver to save a 13 person's life when choking and brought the maneuver to the 14 attention of State Rep. Ralph C. Capparelli, who authored the legislation in 1976 and again in 1977 to make it mandatory for 15 16 all eating establishments in Illinois to display a poster that explains the life-saving procedure on choking victims as 17 18 devised by Dr. Henry Heimlich; the legislation became law on 19 January 1, 1978 and, since then, Stan Banash has been called 20 upon to use the Heimlich Maneuver 3 times, thereby, saving the lives of 3 people; and 21

WHEREAS, Stan Banash wrote the speech delivered by Billy

Williams of the Chicago Cubs during his induction into the
National Baseball Hall of Fame at Cooperstown, New York on July
26, 1987; and

4 WHEREAS, The speech also included the previously unknown 5 information that former Baseball Commissioner Albert Β. "Happy" Chandler overruled the league's 15 owners who earlier 6 7 opposed the entry of Jackie Robinson into the National League, 8 to bring Jackie Robinson up to the Brooklyn Dodgers; if 9 Commissioner Chandler had not taken the action when he did, 10 Jackie Robinson would not have broken the color barrier in 11 1947; and

12 WHEREAS, Stan Banash has been an active member of his 13 community, serving as Secretary (1985-1987) and President 14 (1988-1994) of the Edison Park Chamber of Commerce, Chairperson 15 of the 41st Ward Zoning Advisory Board (1993-2011), established 16 by 41 Ward Aid. Brian Doherty, and Sheriff of the 17 Westerners-Chicago Corral (1996-2001); and

18 WHEREAS, Stan Banash is a member of the Western Writers of 19 America, Society of Midland Authors, Western History 20 Association, Westerners-Chicago Corral, Westerners 21 International, and American Legion Edison Park Post 541; 22 therefore, be it
