1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

6 Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much of thereof
7 as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30, 2013,
8 from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in
9 Section 5 of Article 8 of Public Act 97-0725, is
10 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
11 Office of the Architect of the Capitol for plans,
12 specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the
13 report and recommendations of the architectural, structural,
14 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This
15 is for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol
16 Building.

17 Section 10. The sum of \$548,180, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 8 of Public
21 Act 97-0725, is reappropriated from the Capital Development

1 Fund to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol for
2 remodeling, planning, relocation, permanent equipment, and
3 other related expenses, including architectural and
4 engineering fees associated with construction, for the
5 remodeling of office space and other support areas under the
6 jurisdiction of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

7 Section 15. The sum of \$43,091,520, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
10 made for such purpose in Article 8, Section 15 of Public Act
11 97-0725, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
12 Development Fund to the Office of the Architect of the
13 Capitol for all costs associated with capital upgrades and
14 improvements.

15 Section 20. The following named amounts, or so much
16 thereof as may be necessary, and remain unexpended at the
17 close of business on June 30, 2013, from reappropriations
18 heretofore made for such purposes in Article 8, Section 20 of
19 Public Act 97-0725, as amended, are reappropriated from the
20 Capital Development Fund to the Office of the Architect of
21 the Capitol for the projects hereinafter enumerated:

 21 Capital Development Fund to the Office of the Architect of
 22 the Capitol for the projects hereinafter enumerated:

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SECRETARY OF STATE

Section 5. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Article 9, Section 5 of Public Act 97-0725, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Secretary of State for capital grants to public libraries for permanent improvements.

Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred or any expenditures made from appropriations in this Article until after the purposes and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

ARTICLE 3

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are appropriated to the Department of Agriculture for repairs, maintenance, and capital improvements including construction, reconstruction, improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities, cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services and all other expenses required to complete the work:

13 Section 5. The sum of \$3,483,998, or so much thereof as
 14 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
 15 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
 16 made for such purpose in Article 11, Section 5 of Public Act
 17 97-0725, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
 18 to the Department of Central Management Services for
 19 Information Technology infrastructure expenses including but
 20 not limited to related hardware and equipment.

1 Section 10. The amount of \$6,759,511, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
4 made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 11 of Public
5 Act 97-0725, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
6 Fund to the Department of Central Management Services for
7 infrastructure improvement, hardware and related costs.

1 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

2 Section 5. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
5 made for such purposes in Section 5 of Article 12 of Public
6 Act 97-0725, from the Port Development Revolving Loan Fund to
7 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
8 grants and loans associated with the Port Development
9 Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS 750/9-11.

10 Section 10. The amount of \$17,000,000, or so much
11 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
12 close of business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation
13 heretofore made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 12
14 of Public Act 97-0725, is reappropriated from the Build
15 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
16 Opportunity for grants associated with the redevelopment of
17 brownfield sites.

18 Section 15. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
21 made in Article 12, Section 15 of Public Act 97-0725, is
22 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
23 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants

1 pursuant to 20 ILCS 605/605-332 - Coal Revival Program.

2 Section 20. The sum of \$1,975,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
5 made in Article 12, Section 20 of Public Act 97-0725, is
6 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
7 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
8 associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Act.

9 Section 25. The sum of \$9,750,000, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
11 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
12 made in Article 12, Section 25 of Public Act 97-0725, as
13 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
14 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
15 grant to Argonne National Laboratory for bondable
16 infrastructure improvements to match federal and private
17 funds of equal or greater value.

18 Section 30. The amount of \$2,517,468, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
21 made in Article 12, Section 30 of Public Act 97-0725, is
22 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the

1 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
2 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,
3 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and
4 technical planning and installation of capital facilities
5 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
6 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources
7 within the State.

8 Section 35. The amount of \$5,250,000, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
11 made in Article 12, Section 35 of Public Act 97-0725, is
12 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
13 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
14 to Argonne National Laboratory for the Advanced Protein
15 Crystallization Facility.

16 Section 40. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much
17 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
18 close of business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation
19 heretofore made in Article 12, Section 40 of Public Act 97-
20 0725, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
21 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
22 grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park.

1 Section 45. The amount of \$20,000,000, or so much
2 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
3 close of business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation
4 heretofore made in Article 12, Section 45 of Public Act 97-
5 0725, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
6 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
7 grants associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels
8 Development Act.

9 Section 50. The amount of \$6,000,001, or so much thereof
10 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
11 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
12 made in Article 12, Section 50 of Public Act 97-0725, is
13 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
14 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
15 associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

16 Section 55. The amount of \$16,200,000, or so much
17 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
18 close of business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation
19 heretofore made for such purpose in Article 12, Section 55 of
20 Public Act 97-0725, as amended, is reappropriated from the
21 Coal Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and
22 Economic Opportunity for the specific purpose of acquisition,
23 development, construction, reconstruction, improvement,

1 financing, architectural and technical planning and
2 installation of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
3 structures, durable equipment, and land for the purpose of
4 capital development of coal resources within the State,
5 including but not limited, to a grant for a commercial scale,
6 low emissions project that produces electric power,
7 synthesizes natural gas or chemicals and demonstrates
8 underground storage of at least 1 million metric tons
9 annually of carbon dioxide.

10 Section 60. The sum of \$3,980,704, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
12 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
13 made in Article 12, Section 60 of Public Act 97-0725, as
14 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
15 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
16 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8,
17 Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

18 Section 65. The sum of \$3,130,040, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
21 made for such purpose in Article 12, Section 65 of Public Act
22 97-0725, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
23 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
2 Article 8 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

3 Section 70. The sum of \$2,600,251, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
6 made for such purpose in Article 12, Section 70 of Public Act
7 97-0725, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
8 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
9 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
10 Article 8, Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois
11 Act.

12 Section 75. The sum of \$5,567,122, or so much thereof as

18 Economic Opportunity for grants pursuant but not limited to

22 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
23 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore

2 Act 97-0725, as amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for
3 Illinois' Future to the Department of Commerce and Economic
4 Opportunity for grants to units of government, educational
5 facilities and not-for-profit organizations for education and
6 training, infrastructure improvements and other capital
7 projects including but not limited to planning, construction,
8 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all
9 costs associated with economic development programs,
10 community service programs, public health programs, public
11 safety programs, other programs and activities, and for
12 grants to other State agencies for any capital or operating
13 purposes.

18 grants to units of local government for wastewater
19 facilities, pursuant to provisions of the "Anti-Pollution
20 Bond Act."

22 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
2 made for such purpose in Article 30, Section 35 of Public Act
3 97-0725, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
4 Illinois Bond Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
5 wastewater compliance grants to units of local government or

10 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
11 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore

14 Illinois Bond Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
15 deposit into the Hazardous Waste Fund for use pursuant to
16 Section 22.2 of the Environmental Protection Act.

7 deposit into the Water Revolving Fund.

8 Section 75. The sum of \$1,407,069, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
11 made for such purpose in Article 30, Section 75 of Public Act
12 97-0725, as amended, is reappropriated from the Anti-
13 Pollution Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
14 deposit into the Water Revolving Fund.

15 Section 80. The sum of \$7,858,247, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
17 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
18 made for such purpose in Article 30, Section 80 of Public Act
19 97-0725, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
20 Illinois Bond Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
21 the protection, preservation, restoration and conservation of
22 environmental and natural resources, for deposits into the

1 Water Revolving Fund, and for any other purposes authorized
2 in subsection (d) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
3 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

4 Section 85. The sum of \$16,600,000, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
6 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
7 made for such purpose in Article 30, Section 85 of Public Act
8 97-0725, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
9 Illinois Bond Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
10 the protection, preservation, restoration and conservation of
11 environmental and natural resources, for deposits into the
12 Water Revolving Fund, and for any other purposes authorized
13 in subsection (d) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
14 and for grants to State Agencies for such purposes.

15 Section 90. The sum of \$8,754,849, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
17 business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore
18 made for such purpose in Article 30, Section 100 of Public
19 Act 97-0725, is reappropriated from the Water Revolving Fund
20 to the Environmental Protection Agency for a green
21 infrastructure financial assistance program to address water
22 quality issues.
