#### SB2628

### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 3960/5.3

Amends the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act. Provides that the annual report of capital expenditures submitted to the Health Facilities and Services Review Board by certain health care facilities shall include (i) whether the health care facility administered an affirmative action program for minority-owned, women-owned, veteran-owned, and small business enterprises and (ii) the percentage of the annual capital expenditure that was actually spent on minority-owned, women-owned, veteran-owned, and small business enterprises, respectively. Provides that the Board shall not consider that information when reviewing an application for a permit or exemption under the Act. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act is
amended by changing Section 5.3 as follows:

6 (20 ILCS 3960/5.3)

(Section scheduled to be repealed on December 31, 2019)

8 Sec. 5.3. Annual report of capital expenditures. In 9 addition to the State Board's authority to require reports, the 10 State Board shall require each health care facility to submit an annual report of all capital expenditures in excess of 11 \$200,000 (which shall be annually adjusted to reflect the 12 increase in construction costs due to inflation) made by the 13 14 health care facility during the most recent year. This annual report shall consist of a brief description of the capital 15 16 expenditure, the amount and method of financing the capital 17 expenditure, the certificate of need project number if the project was reviewed, and the total amount of capital 18 19 expenditures obligated for the year. This annual report shall 20 also include (i) whether the health care facility administered 21 an affirmative action program for minority-owned, women-owned, 22 veteran-owned, and small business enterprises and (ii) the percentage of the annual capital expenditure that was actually 23

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spent on minority-owned, women-owned, veteran-owned, and small 1 2 business enterprises, respectively; however, the Board shall not consider the information provided in items (i) and (ii) 3 4 when reviewing an application for a permit or exemption under 5 this Act. Data collected from health care facilities pursuant 6 to this Section shall not duplicate or overlap other data 7 collected by the Department and must be collected as part of the Department's Annual Questionnaires or supplements for 8 9 health care facilities that report these data.
