Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

2 Section 15. The amounts appropriated for repairs and 3 maintenance, and other capital improvements in Section 10 for repairs and maintenance, roof repairs and/or replacements and 4 5 miscellaneous capital improvements at the Department's various institutions to include 6 are construction, reconstruction, improvements, repairs and installation of 7 8 capital facilities, costs of planning, supplies, materials 9 and all other expenses required for roof and other types of 10 repairs and maintenance, capital improvements, and purchase of land. 11

No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred for repairs and maintenance and other capital improvements from appropriations made in Section 10 of this Article until after the purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

Section 20. The sum of \$31,300, or so much thereof as 17 18 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Juvenile Justice from the General Revenue Fund for costs and 19 20 expenses associated with payment of statewide 21 hospitalization.

- Section 25. The amount of \$234,300, or so much thereof 1 2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Juvenile Justice for the purposes 3 investigating complaints, evaluating policies 5 procedures, and securing the rights of the youth committed to 6 the Department of Juvenile Justice, including youth released 7 on Aftercare before final discharge.
- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 8
- 2014. 9
