SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

30 ILCS 605/7

from Ch. 127, par. 133b10

Amends the State Property Control Act. Provides that any State Police Officer, with the approval of the administrator, may purchase upon retirement, by reason of length of service or disability, the service pistol and badge carried by that State Police Officer immediately prior to retirement. Requires that the purchase price for the service pistol and badge shall be equal to the replacement cost thereof. Effective immediately.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning finance.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The State Property Control Act is amended by
5 changing Section 7 as follows:

6 (30 ILCS 605/7) (from Ch. 127, par. 133b10)

7 Sec. 7. Disposition of transferable property.

8 (a) Except as provided in subsection (c), whenever a
9 responsible officer considers it advantageous to the State to
10 dispose of transferable property by trading it in for credit on
11 a replacement of like nature, the responsible officer shall
12 report the trade-in and replacement to the administrator on
13 forms furnished by the latter. The exchange, trade or transfer
14 of "textbooks" as defined in Section 18-17 of the School Code
15 between schools or school districts pursuant to regulations
16 adopted by the State Board of Education under that Section
17 shall not constitute a disposition of transferable property
18 within the meaning of this Section, even though such exchange,
19 trade or transfer occurs within 5 years after the textbooks are
20 first provided for loan pursuant to Section 18-17 of the School
21 Code.

22 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), whenever it is
23 deemed necessary to dispose of any item of transferable

1 property, the administrator shall proceed to dispose of the
2 property by sale or scrapping as the case may be, in whatever
3 manner he considers most advantageous and most profitable to
4 the State. Items of transferable property which would
5 ordinarily be scrapped and disposed of by burning or by burial
6 in a landfill may be examined and a determination made whether
7 the property should be recycled. This determination and any
8 sale of recyclable property shall be in accordance with rules
9 promulgated by the Administrator.

10 When the administrator determines that property is to be
11 disposed of by sale, he shall offer it first to the
12 municipalities, counties, and school districts of the State and
13 to charitable, not-for-profit educational and public health
14 organizations, including but not limited to medical
15 institutions, clinics, hospitals, health centers, schools,
16 colleges, universities, child care centers, museums, nursing
17 homes, programs for the elderly, food banks, State Use
18 Sheltered Workshops and the Boy and Girl Scouts of America, for
19 purchase at an appraised value. Notice of inspection or viewing
20 dates and property lists shall be distributed in the manner
21 provided in rules and regulations promulgated by the
22 Administrator for that purpose.

23 Any State Police Officer, with the approval of the
24 administrator, may purchase upon retirement, by reason of
25 length of service or disability, the service pistol and badge
26 carried by that State Police Officer immediately prior to

1 retirement. The purchase price for the service pistol and badge
2 shall be equal to the replacement cost thereof.

3 Electronic data processing equipment purchased and charged
4 to appropriations may, at the discretion of the administrator,
5 be sold, pursuant to contracts entered into by the Director of
6 Central Management Services or the heads of agencies exempt
7 from "The Illinois Purchasing Act". However such equipment
8 shall not be sold at prices less than the purchase cost thereof
9 or depreciated value as determined by the administrator. No
10 sale of the electronic data processing equipment and lease to
11 the State by the purchaser of such equipment shall be made
12 under this Act unless the Director of Central Management
13 Services finds that such contracts are financially
14 advantageous to the State.

15 Disposition of other transferable property by sale, except
16 sales directly to local governmental units, school districts,
17 and not-for-profit educational, charitable and public health
18 organizations, shall be subject to the following minimum
19 conditions:

20 (1) The administrator shall cause the property to be
21 advertised for sale to the highest responsible bidder,
22 stating time, place, and terms of such sale at least 7 days
23 prior to the time of sale and at least once in a newspaper
24 having a general circulation in the county where the
25 property is to be sold.

26 (2) If no acceptable bids are received, the

1 administrator may then sell the property in whatever manner
2 he considers most advantageous and most profitable to the
3 State.

4 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, an
5 agency covered by this Act may transfer books, serial
6 publications, or other library materials that are transferable
7 property, or that have been withdrawn from the agency's library
8 collection through a regular collection evaluation process, to
9 any of the following entities :

10 (1) Another agency covered by this Act located in
11 Illinois.

12 (2) A State supported university library located in
13 Illinois.

14 (3) A tax-supported public library located in
15 Illinois, including a library established by a public
16 library district.

17 (4) A library system organized under the Illinois
18 Library System Act or any library located in Illinois that
19 is a member of such a system.

20 (5) A non-profit agency, located in or outside
21 Illinois.

22 A transfer of property under this subsection is not subject
23 to the requirements of subsection (a) or (b).

24 In addition, an agency covered by this Act may sell or
25 exchange books, serial publications, and other library
26 materials that have been withdrawn from its library collection

1 through a regular collection evaluation process. Those items
2 may be sold to the public at library book sales or to book
3 dealers or may be offered through exchange to book dealers or
4 other organizations. Revenues generated from the sale of
5 withdrawn items shall be retained by the agency in a separate
6 account to be used solely for the purchase of library
7 materials; except that in the case of the State Library,
8 revenues from the sale of withdrawn items shall be deposited
9 into the State Library Fund to be used for the purposes stated
10 in Section 25 of the State Library Act.

11 For purposes of this subsection (c), "library materials"
12 means physical entities of any substance that serve as carriers
13 of information, including, without limitation, books, serial
14 publications, periodicals, microforms, graphics, audio or
15 video recordings, and machine readable data files.
