

## 99TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2015 and 2016 SB1853

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the Counties Code. Provides that a county with 2 or more adjoining fire protection jurisdictions, or 2 or more adjoining law enforcement jurisdictions (municipal police departments and township enforcement offices), lying wholly within the county's borders may consolidate the adjoining fire protection jurisdictions or the law enforcement jurisdictions by (i) adoption of a resolution by the county board or (ii) filing a petition (subject to the petition requirements of Section 28-3 of the Election Code) with the county board signed by at least 10% of the registered voters of each fire protection or law enforcement jurisdiction. Provides for filing, form, and notice requirements for petitions, resolutions, and referendum. Provides that if a consolidation referendum passes, the fire protection or law enforcement jurisdictions will continue to function as separate entities until a Board of Fire or Police Commissioners are appointed by the county board with the consent of all municipal and township boards. Once the Board of Fire or Police Commissioners is appointed, provides that the new consolidated fire protection or law enforcement jurisdiction shall have all the powers, rights, duties and obligations of the fire protection or law enforcement jurisdictions from which it was consolidated.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Sec. 5-45010. Consolidation of fire protection
- 21 jurisdictions by referendum. In addition to the means of

consolidation provided under the Fire Protection District Act, 1 2 the Regional Fire Protection Agency Act, or any other statute, 3 a county with 2 or more adjoining fire protection jurisdictions 4 lying wholly within the county's borders may consolidate the 5 adjoining fire protection jurisdictions by (i) adoption of a resolution by the county board or (ii) filing a petition 6 7 (subject to the petition requirements of Section 28-3 of the 8 Election Code) with the county board signed by at least 10% of 9 the registered voters of each fire protection jurisdiction. 10 Upon adoption of the resolution or filing of the petition, as 11 the case may be, the county board shall certify the question to 12 the appropriate election officials and the resolution or petition shall be filed with the county clerk not less than 79 13 14 days prior to the general election in which the referendum will 15 appear.

(a) If a petition or a referendum is filed with the county clerk that meets the requirements of Section 5-45010, a referendum, subject to the requirements of Section 16-7 of the Election Code shall, shall be placed on the ballot at the next general election in substantially the following form:

- "Consolidated law enforcement jurisdiction" means the new
- law enforcement jurisdiction created after a passed referendum
- 20 pursuant to Section 5-46015.
- 21 (55 ILCS 5/5-46010 new)
- Sec. 5-46010. Consolidation of law enforcement
- 23 jurisdictions by referendum. In addition to the means of

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consolidation of any law enforcement jurisdiction provided under any other statute, a county with 2 or more adjoining law enforcement jurisdictions lying wholly within the county's borders may consolidate the adjoining law enforcement jurisdictions by (i) adoption of a resolution by the county board or (ii) filing a petition (subject to the petition requirements of Section 28-3 of the Election Code) with the county board signed by at least 10% of the registered voters of each law enforcement jurisdiction. Upon adoption of the resolution or filing of the petition, as the case may be, the county board shall certify the question to the appropriate election officials and the resolution or petition shall be filed with the county clerk not less than 79 days prior to the general election in which the referendum will appear.
