16 reappropriations heretofore made in Article 35, Section 30 of
17 Public Act 98-0679 is reappropriated from the Federal HOME
18 Investment Trust Fund to the Department of Revenue for the
19 Illinois HOME Investment Partnerships Program administered by
20 the Illinois Housing Development Authority.

21 Section 25. The sum of \$8,500,000, or so much thereof as
22 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Foreclosure

1 Prevention Program Fund to the Department of Revenue for
2 administration by the Illinois Housing Development Authority,
3 for grants and administrative expenses pursuant to the
4 Foreclosure Prevention Program.

5 Section 30. The sum of \$11,000,000, or so much thereof

18 ARTICLE 996

19 Section 996. No appropriation authority granted in this
20 Act shall be used for personal services, state contribution
21 for employee group insurance, contractual services, travel,

1 commodities, equipment, permanent improvements, land,
2 electronic data processing, operation of automotive
3 equipment, or telecommunications services, as those terms are
4 defined in Section 13 of the State Finance Act.

5 ARTICLE 997

6 Section 997. All appropriation authority granted in this
7 Act shall be used only for costs for services for which
8 spending authority has not been authorized for fiscal year
9 2016 by any order of any court.

10 ARTICLE 998

11 Section 998. The appropriation authority granted in this
12 Act shall be valid for costs incurred prior to July 1, 2016.

13 ARTICLE 999

14 Section 999. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
15 becoming law.
