 17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
 18 Fund to the Department of Transportation for making a grant
 19 to the Regional Transportation Authority for the funding of
 20 the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) paratransit
 21 services and for other costs and services.

22 Section 20. The sum of \$3,825,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Road Fund to the
2 Department of Transportation for making a grant to the
3 Regional Transportation Authority for the funding of the
4 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) paratransit
5 services and for other costs and services.

6 Section 25. The sum of \$40,000,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Public
8 Transportation Fund to the Department of Transportation for
9 making a grant to the Regional Transportation Authority for
10 Additional State Assistance to be used for its purposes as
11 provided in the "Regional Transportation Authority Act", but
12 in no event shall this amount exceed the amount provided for
13 in Sections 4.09 (c) and 4.09 (d) with respect to Strategic
14 Capital Improvement bonds issued by the Regional
15 Transportation Authority pursuant to the Regional
16 Transportation Authority Act as amended in 1989.

17 Section 30. The sum of \$91,000,000, or so much thereof
18 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Public
19 Transportation Fund to the Department of Transportation for
