- b) Documentation that the applicant has passed a national certifying examination from the National Commission for the Surgical Assistant Association on the Certification of Surgical Assistants; the Liaison Council on Certification for Surgical Technologists as a certified first assistant; or the American Board of Surgical Assistants;
