The Flinn Report is a weekly summary of regulatory actions of State agencies published in the *Illinois Register* and action taken by the Illinois General Assembly's Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR). The Flinn Report honors founding JCAR member Representative Monroe Flinn, and is designed to inform and involve the public in changes taking place in agency administration.

Proposed Rulemakings

NURSING HOMES

The DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH proposed amendments to Skilled Nursing and Intermediate Facilities Code (77 IAC 300; 48 III Reg 13916) and Sheltered Care Facilities Code (77 IAC 330; 48 III Reg 13948) implementing Public Act 102-1095, which generally prohibits the use of latex gloves in long-term care and other healthcare facilities. rulemakings prohibit use of latex gloves in food service or in direct care of residents, unless the facility is experiencing a shortage or supply interruption of non-latex gloves, in which case non-latex gloves will be prioritized for use upon residents who have known latex allergies or who are unable to communicate whether they have a latex allergy. Both rulemakings also implement PA 103-1, which gives DPH greater flexibility in scheduling inspections during a statewide public health emergency. Additionally, the Part 300 rulemaking implements PA

101-116, which requires closed captioning to be activated at all times on TV sets in common areas and resident's rooms unless a resident or visitor specifically requests that it be turned off. The Part 330 amendments also add statutory provisions for DPH surveyors to conduct an exit conference with facility management

after having investigated a complaint; update statutory text concerning issuance of probationary licenses and transfers of ownership; repeal an obsolete Section; and update incorporations by reference.

SALES TAX

The DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE proposed amendments to Retailers' Occupation Tax (86 IAC 130; 48 III Reg 13979) implementing PA 103-9. This rulemaking exempts from sales tax, effective 1/1/24, electrical power generation equipment that is used primarily for production agriculture. This exemption applies only to generating equipment that is used for specialty heating lighting equipment (e.g., incubators, grow lights) and not for general heating, lighting or ventilation. The rulemaking also clarifies how the exemption for farm machinery and equipment aplies to All-Terrain Vehicles (ATVs) and tractors. Other provisions clarify exemptions for farm chemicals, delete outdated terms and provisions, and reformat existing language. Farmers, ranchers, and growers are affected by this rulemaking.

ADOPTED RULES: Rules adopted by agencies this week. **EMERGENCY RULES:** Temporary rules adopted for no more than 150 days. **PROPOSED RULEMAKINGS:** Rules proposed by agencies this week, commencing a First Notice public comment period of at least 45 days. **PEREMPTORY RULES:** Rules adopted without prior public notice or JCAR review as authorized by 5 ILCS 100/5-50.

VEHICLE TRANSPORTERS

The SECRETARY OF STATE proposed amendments to the Part titled Dealers, Wreckers, Transporters and Rebuilders (92 IAC 1020; 48 III Reg 14013) aligning rules for vehicle transporters with those of other vehicle-related businesses under the Illinois Vehicle Code. The rulemaking includes limitations on the issuance, use, and display of in-transit plates; requires transporters to have an established place of business; and implements record keeping and inspection requirements. Businesses that transport vehicles or use the services of transporters are affected.

AIR POLLUTION

The POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD proposed amendments to Air Quality Standards (35 IAC 243; 48 III Reg

13877) updating Illinois air quality requirements to align with recent amendments to the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) adopted by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA). This rulemaking implements stricter standards for particulate matter PM 2.5 (particles small enough to be inhaled, such as dust, smoke, soot and mold) and updates incorporations by reference of the USEPA's federal equivalent method of measuring ozone concentrations. Α public hearing on these amendments will be held by videoconference on Thursday. Nov. 7, at 11:20 a.m. at Room N-505, Bilandic Building, 160 N. LaSalle St., Chicago and at the PCB Hearing Room at IEPA headquarters, 1021 N. Grand Ave. East, Springfield.

WATER TREATMENT

PCB also proposed amendments to Sewer Discharge Criteria (35 IAC 307; 48 III Reg 13890) that are identical in substance to wastewater pretreatment regulations adopted by USEPA during the first half of 2024. These amendments update the federal Clean Water Act effluent limitation guidelines and standards (ELG's) for wastewater discharged from steam electric power plants.

AUDIT REPORTS

The DEPARTMENT OF FINANCIAL AND PROFESSIONAL REGULATION proposed an amendment to the Part titled Student Loan Servicing Rights Act (38 IAC 1010; 48 III Reg 13872) concerning licensed lenders' required annual independent audit reports. Licensees who do not file their reports within 105 days after the end of their fiscal year (as required under existing rule) will incur a late fee of \$50 per day each day that the report is late, for a maximum of 3 months. A licensee's request to extend the report filing deadline must be made in writing, must explain the need for the extension, and must be received by the Director of DFPR's Division of Banking prior to the regular filing deadline. In deciding whether to grant an extension, the Director will consider whether the need for a delay is due to circumstances beyond the licensee's control. The Director may also appoint an independent auditor, at the licensee's expense, any time that an annual audit report has not been timely filed.

AABD BENEFITS

The DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES adopted an amendment to Aid to the Aged, Blind or Disabled (89 IAC 113; proposed at 48 III Reg 4572) effective 9/6/24 at 48 III Reg 14027, raising the asset exemption limit for prepaid funeral/burial costs to \$7,981 (previously, \$7,719) per individual to reflect an annual adjustment for inflation.
