The Flinn Report is a weekly summary of regulatory actions of State agencies published in the *Illinois Register* and action taken by the Illinois General Assembly's Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR). The Flinn Report honors founding JCAR member Representative Monroe Flinn, and is designed to inform and involve the public in changes taking place in agency administration.

Proposed Rulemakings

DRIVERS' LICENSES

The SECRETARY OF STATE proposed an amendment to Issuance of Licenses (92 IAC 1030; 48 III Reg 14087) implementing Public Act 103-933. The PA and this rulemaking authorize SOS to place a Gold Star Family designation on the driver's licenses or ID cards of qualifying individuals who request the designation. surviving widow/widower, parent, child (biological or adopted), stepchild, brother, sister, half-brother or halfsister of a person who lost their life while serving in the U.S. Armed Forces in peacetime or war may request this designation. The request form must include the deceased service member's name, date of birth, date of death, and branch of service. The applicant must sign the form under penalty of perjury stating that they are eligible for the Gold Star designation. No fee will be charged for this designation, but other fees such as the

regular license/ID renewal fee will apply.

DOC MAIL

The DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS proposed an amendment to the Part titled Rights and Privileges (20 IAC 525; 48 Ill Reg 14067) allowing appeals of decisions by corrections facility officials to prohibit a committed person from receiving certain items or portions of incoming mail. The sender must be notified of the proposed decision, the reasons for this decision, and of their right to appeal. Sender

appeals must be submitted within 21 days after receiving notification. The Chief Administrative Officer of the facility or their designee must make a final decision and notify the sender of the decision within 60 days after receiving an appeal from a sender. Committed persons who wish to appeal a decision to withhold mail may use the grievance procedures outlined in 20 IAC 504.

ADOPTED RULES: Rules adopted by agencies this week. **EMERGENCY RULES:** Temporary rules adopted for no more than 150 days. **PROPOSED RULEMAKINGS:** Rules proposed by agencies this week, commencing a First Notice public comment period of at least 45 days. **PEREMPTORY RULES:** Rules adopted without prior public notice or JCAR review as authorized by 5 ILCS 100/5-50.

• - Designates rules of special interest to small businesses, small municipalities and/or non-profit organizations. Agencies must consider comments from these groups and attempt to minimize regulatory burdens on them.

amendments to the Part titled Registration and Operator Requirements for Radiation Installations (32 IAC 320; 48 III Reg 14073) that: include a Purpose and Scope section to clarify that all locations or facilities with machines producing ionizing radiation are regulated under this Part; add relevant definitions; add provisions for radiation machines brought to Illinois temporarily (no more than 180 days per year) from out of State; and align technology of radiation machines and their associated radiation hazards with the annual registration fees (which are unchanged). Radiation installations must ensure registration is updated prior to the annual billing of fees. The Agency is

also exempting from registration requirements any machines that are provided only for temporary use or that have been claimed by a financial institution in a bankruptcy, foreclosure or other legal process. Businesses that operate regulated radiation machines are affected.

UNIVERSITY EMPLOYMENT

The STATE UNIVERSITIES CIVIL SERVICE SYSTEM proposed amendments to the Part titled State Universities Civil Service System (80 IAC 250; 48 III Reg 14096) that add "Audit definitions οf Charter" (document adopted by the SUCSS Merit Board on 8/17/16, and any later amendments, that establishes SUCSS'

authority to conduct audits) and "Notice of Convening of Hearing" (notice to parties of record in matters of discharge or demotion of the date, time and place of the hearing) and amend the definition of "Employer" to places of employment approved by the Merit Board. Other provisions require that the Executive Director be notified within 3 working days of any notice of layoff or suspension of an employee; clarify other discharge procedures; and clarify how a Designated Employer Representative (DER) is appointed or replaced, or grants or withdraws signature authorization to a designee.

UNCLAIMED PROPERTY

The OFFICE OF THE TREASURER adopted amendments to the Part titled Revised Uniform Unclaimed Property Act (74 IAC 760; proposed at 48 III Reg 8047) effective 9/10/24 at 48 Ill Reg 14162, implementing PA 103which requires enhanced outreach efforts by the State Treasurer for unclaimed property where the apparent owner is a State agency or a unit of local government. Claim forms for property worth more than \$5,000 (previously, \$2,000) must be either notarized or completed electronically at the Treasurer's website under penalty of perjury. (Formerly, only notarized claim forms were accepted.) The Treasurer may, require however, а notarized signature for claims submitted via the website if needed to establish ownership of the property. The PA and the rulemaking also include as unclaimed property reportable to the State Treasurer missing heir funds and property tax overpayments currently reported to county treasurers. Other provisions address virtual currency that cannot be liquidated, owner interest, reporting, filing of claims, securities, and examinations. Small businesses and small municipalities with unclaimed property are affected.

DENTISTS

The DEPARTMENT OF FINANCIAL AND PROFESSIONAL REGULATION adopted amendments to the Part titled Illinois Dental Practice Act (68 IAC 1220; proposed at 47 III Reg 17316), effective 9/10/24 at 48 III Reg 14138, that add provisions for a specialty in dental anesthesiology (in addition to existing specialties such as pediatric dentistry, periodontics, orthodontics) and requirements for licensure in that specialty. The rulemaking also updates references to standardized licensure examinations and accepts advanced clinical training in pediatric dentistry, periodontics, endodontics, orthodontics, oral/maxillofacial surgery (formerly, only prosthodontics) toward licensure of graduates from dental schools outside of the U.S. or Canada. Since 1st DFPR has removed all Notice. proposed amendments Sec. to 1220.510 concerning moderate (conscious) sedation permits and has clarified how previous residency requirements (in effect prior to 7/1/93

and 7/1/18) apply to dental anesthesiologists. Dentists and dental students are affected by this rulemaking.

ELECTROLOGISTS

DFPR also adopted amendments to the Part titled Electrologist Licensing Act (68 IAC 1246; proposed at 48 III Reg 6718) effective 9/10/24 at 48 III Reg 14154, that allow continuing education courses to be offered by any electrology school approved by the Board of Higher Education, which recently added two new schools to its list. Other provisions remove the fee for a wall certificate showing licensure update incorporations reference for sterilization/sanitation standards standards and of professional conduct. Electrologists (persons who perform hair removal by electrolysis) and their employers are affected.
