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Section 1030.1 Definitions

Unless otherwise noted, the following definitions shall apply to this Part.

"Acceptable Medical Certificate" – a current medical examiner's certificate that has been completed in its entirety and does not require additional information.

"Adjudication of Disability" – an order by a court of competent jurisdiction declaring a person unable to fully manage one's own person or estate because of mental deterioration, physical incapacity, mental illness, or developmental disability, pursuant to Sections 11a-1, 11a-2, and 11a-3 of the Probate Act of 1975 [755 ILCS 5/11a-1, 11a-2 and 11a-3].

"Adult Driver Education Course" – six-hour classroom or online course of driver education for persons agedage 18, 19 or 20, offered by an adult driver education course provider.

"Adult Driver Education Course Provider" or "Provider" – an entity certified by the Secretary of State to provide an adult driver education course, either in a classroom setting or online.

"Agri-Chemical Business" – any individual, partnership, corporation or association engaged in a business operation for the purpose of selling or distributing agricultural pesticides and/or fertilizers or providing the service of application of these substances in this State.

"Applicant" – a person applying for an Illinois driver's license, permit or identification card.

"Approved Driver Education Course" –

a course of driver education approved by the State Board of Education, offered by public or private schools maintaining grades 9 through 12, and meeting at least the minimum requirements of the Driver Education Act [105 ILCS 5/27-24 through 27-24.8]; or

a course of driver education offered by a school licensed to give driver education instructions under the Vehicle Code that meets at least the minimum educational requirements of the Driver Education Act and is approved by the State Board of Education; or

259 *Education Activity school that is approved by the Department of Defense*
260 *Education Activity and taught by an adult driver education instructor or*

263 *a course of driver education given in another state to an Illinois resident*

267 "Armed Forces" – the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps or
268 Coast Guard; Illinois National Guard; service in the Merchant Marine that
269 constitutes active duty under Section 401 of the Federal Public Law 95-202 (38
270 U.S.C. 106) shall also be considered service in the Armed Forces of the United
271 States.

273 "Authorized Secretary of State Employee" – a Secretary of State employee with a
274 supervisory position.

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299 "Binocular Visual Acuity" – a visual reading obtained utilizing both eyes at the
300 same time.

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"Branch Facility" – a separate training/testing facility operated and directly supervised by a third-party certifying entity at a location different from the principal location of the third-party certifying entity.

"Business Day" – any day on which the Office of the Secretary of State is open; generally, Monday through Saturday, excluding State holidays.

"CDL Skills Test" – a test given to an applicant who is attempting to obtain a Commercial Driver's License (CDL).

"CDLIS Driver Record" – the electronic record of the individual CDL driver's status and history stored by the State-of-Record as part of the Commercial Driver's License Information System, or CDLIS, established under 49 U.S.C. 31309. [625 ILCS 5/6-500(5.3)]

"CDLIS Motor Vehicle Record" or "CDLIS MVR" – a report generated from the CDLIS driver record meeting the requirements for access to CDLIS information and provided by states to users authorized in 49 CFR 384.225(e)(3) and (4) (2014), subject to the provisions of the Driver Privacy Protection Act (18 U.S.C. 2721-2725). [625 ILCS 5/6-500(5.5)]

"Cancellation" – the annulment or termination by formal action of the Secretary of a person's driver's license or permit because of some error or defect in the license or because the licensee is no longer entitled to such license or permit, but, with the exception of Sections 6-107, 6-108 and 6-201, the cancellation of a license or permit is without prejudice and application for a new license or permit may be made at any time after such cancellation [625 ILCS 5/1-110 and 5/6-206(c)(3) and 6-201].

"Central Issuance" – the process of printing and mailing a driver's license to an applicant from a secure central production facility.

"Certificate of Completion" – a certificate of completion issued by the Office of the Secretary of State if the student has successfully completed a driver education course at an approved commercial driver training school as provided in IVC Chapter 6, Art. IV and 92 Ill. Adm. Code 1060.

"Charter Bus Driver Endorsement" – an indicator on the driver's license that the driver is qualified to transport a group of persons with a common purpose, under a single contract at a fixed rate for their exclusive use of that motor vehicle.

343 "Cheating on Written Tests" – the receipt or use of unauthorized assistance in the
344 taking of any portion of a written test. This includes, but is not limited to, the use
345 of any notes, books or written information.

346
347 "Cited Driver" – a driver who has been requested by the Secretary of State to
348 appear for re-test.

349
350 "Civilian Employee Deferral Card" – a card issued at the expiration of a driver's
351 license to extend the expiration of the driver's license for 120 days while, as a
352 result of employment, a civilian employee of the United States Armed Services or
353 of the United States Department of Defense and the civilian employee's spouse
354 and/or dependent children who are living with the civilian employee is residing
355 outside the State of Illinois.

356
357 "Classification" – a designation as to the kind and type of vehicle a driver is
358 entitled to operate, as outlined in Sections 1030.30 and 1030.40.

359
360 "Classroom Instruction" – the part of an approved driver education course
361 consisting of learning experiences in the classroom. This instruction must be of
362 the type to satisfy the 30 clock hours of instruction specified in Section 27-23 of
363 the School Code [105 ILCS 5/27-23].

364
365 "Cleared Miscellaneous Suspension" – a suspension for safety responsibility,
366 financial responsibility, warrant parking/traffic, auto emissions, failure to appear,
367 curfew, mandatory conviction, tollway, family financial responsibility, automated
368 traffic law violation, nighttime driving restriction, or unsatisfied judgment.

369
370 "Commercial Driver's License" or "CDL" – *a license issued to an individual by a*
371 *state or other jurisdiction of domicile, in accordance with the standards contained*
372 *in 49 CFR 383 (October 1, 2014), that authorizes the individual to operate a*
373 *certain class of commercial motor vehicle [625 ILCS 5/1-111.6].*

374
375 "*Commercial Driver's License Downgrade*" – *a state:*

376
377 *allows the driver to change the driver's self-certification to interstate, but*
378 *operating exclusively in transportation or operation excepted from 49*
379 *CFR 391 (October 1, 2014), as provided in 49 CFR 390.3(f), 391.2,*
380 *391.68 or 398.3 (October 1, 2014);*

381
382 *allows the driver to change the driver's self-certification to intrastate only,*
383 *if the driver qualifies under that state's physical qualification*
384 *requirements for intrastate only;*
385

386 *allows the driver to change the driver's self-certification to intrastate, but*
387 *operating exclusively in transportation or operations excepted from all or*
388 *part of the state driver qualification requirements; or*

389
390 *removes the CDL privilege from the driver's license. [625 ILCS*
391 *5/6-500(5.7)]*

392
393 "Commercial Driver's License Information System" or "CDLIS" – the
394 information system established pursuant to the Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety
395 Act of 1986 (CMVSA) to serve as a clearinghouse for locating information
396 related to the licensing and identification of commercial motor vehicle drivers.

397
398 "Commercial Learner's Permit" or "CLP" – a permit issued to an individual by a
399 state or other jurisdiction of domicile, in accordance with the standards contained
400 in 49 CFR 383 (October 1, 2014), which, when carried with a valid driver's
401 license issued by the same state or jurisdiction of domicile, authorizes the
402 individual to operate a class of commercial motor vehicle when accompanied by a
403 holder of a valid CDL for purposes of behind-the-wheel training. When issued to
404 a CDL holder, a CLP serves as authorization for accompanied behind-the-wheel
405 training in a commercial motor vehicle for which the holder's current CDL is not
406 valid.

407
408 "*Commercial Motor Vehicle*" or "*CMV*" – *a motor vehicle or combination of*
409 *motor vehicles used in commerce designed to transport passengers or property if*
410 *the motor vehicle:*

411
412 *has a gross combination weight rating or gross combination weight of*
413 *11,794 kilograms or more (26,001 pounds or more), whichever is greater,*
414 *inclusive of any towed unit with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than*
415 *4,536 kilograms (10,000 pounds), whichever is greater; or*

416
417 *has a gross vehicle weight rating or gross vehicle weight of 11,794 or*
418 *more kilograms (26,001 pounds) or more, whichever is greater; or*

419
420 *is designed to transport 16 or more passengers, including the driver; or*

421
422 *is of any size and is used in transporting hazardous materials as defined in*
423 *49 CFR 383.5 (October 1, 2014).*

424
425 *Commercial Motor Vehicle does not include:*

426
427 *recreational vehicles, when operated primarily for personal use;*

428

429 *vehicles owned by or operated under the direction of the United States*
430 *Department of Defense or the United States Coast Guard only when*
431 *operated by non-civilian personnel. This includes any operator on active*
432 *military duty; members of the Reserves; National Guard; personnel on*
433 *part-time training; and National Guard military technicians (civilians*
434 *who are required to wear military uniforms and are subject to the Code*
435 *of Military Justice); or*

436
437 *firefighting, police, and other emergency equipment (including, without*
438 *limitation, equipment owned or operated by a HazMat or technical*
439 *rescue team authorized by a county board under Section 5-1127 of the*
440 *Counties Code [55 ILCS 5]), with audible and visual signals, owned or*
441 *operated by or for a governmental entity, which is necessary to the*
442 *preservation of life or property or the execution of emergency*
443 *governmental functions which are normally not subject to general traffic*
444 *rules and regulations. [625 ILCS 5/6-500(6)]*

445
446 *"Commuter Van" – a motor vehicle designed for the transportation of not less*
447 *than seven or more than 16 passengers, that is used in a ridesharing arrangement*
448 *[625 ILCS 5/1-111.9].*

449
450 *"Competent Medical Specialist" – a person licensed under the Medical Practice*
451 *Act [225 ILCS 60], or similar law of another jurisdiction, to practice medicine in*
452 *all of its branches.*

453
454 *"Confirmed Medical Emergency" – documented medical emergency from a*
455 *licensed physician specifying the cited driver is unable to appear during the 30*
456 *day re-testing period. This includes, but is not necessarily limited to, the*
457 *following conditions: hospitalization, serious illness, broken limbs.*

458
459 *"Consular Identification Document" – an official identification card issued by a*
460 *foreign government that meets the criteria set forth in Section 5 of the Consular*
461 *Identification Document Act [5 ILCS 230/5] and the issuing consulate has filed*
462 *with the Department of State Police a copy of the consular identification*
463 *document and a certification of the procedures that are used to satisfy Sections 2*
464 *and 3 of the Consular Identification Document Act.*

465
466 *"Conviction" – A final adjudication of guilty by a court of competent jurisdiction*
467 *after a bench trial, trial by jury, plea of guilty, order of forfeiture, or default [625*
468 *ILCS 5/6-100(b)].*

469
470 *"Conviction-CLP Holder" or "Conviction-CDL Holder" – an unvacated*
471 *adjudication of guilt or a determination that a person has violated or failed to*

472 *comply with the law in a court of original jurisdiction or by an authorized*
 473 *administrative tribunal; an unvacated forfeiture of bail or collateral deposited to*
 474 *secure the person's appearance in court; a plea of guilty or nolo contendere*
 475 *accepted by the court; the payment of a fine or court cost regardless of whether*
 476 *the imposition of sentence is deferred and ultimately a judgment dismissing the*
 477 *underlying charge is entered; or a violation of a condition of release without bail,*
 478 *regardless of whether or not the penalty is rebated, suspended or probated [625*
 479 *ILCS 5/6-500(8)].*

480
 481 "Cooperative Driver Certificate" – a certificate prescribed by the Secretary of
 482 State indicating a successfully-completed road test, subject to spot check by the
 483 Secretary of State, was administered to a driver education student, who has
 484 successfully completed driver training by an Illinois State Board of Education
 485 approved driver education instructor.

486
 487 "Cooperative Driver Testing Program" – a program offered by the Department to
 488 local school boards with accredited driver education courses and teen-accredited
 489 commercial driver training schools, allowing students who receive a grade of A or
 490 B in a high school ~~the~~ driver education course or who has obtained an overall
 491 score of 80% or more in a commercial driver training school driver education
 492 course and who pass a road test administered by a Department certified high
 493 school or commercial driver training school driver education instructor to be
 494 exempted from a road test administered by the Department.

495
 496 "Court Documents" – the items issued by a court, such as reports, notices,
 497 summonses, subpoenas, orders and transcripts.

498
 499 "Criminal Justice Agencies" – the federal and state courts, a governmental agency
 500 or sub-unit that performs the duties of the detection, apprehension or detention of
 501 accused persons or criminal offenders pursuant to a statute.

502
 503 "Current Medical Report" – any medical report completed within 90 days after
 504 receipt by the Department that is signed and dated by a competent medical
 505 specialist.

506
 507 "Current Telescopic Lens Vision Specialist Report" – any vision specialist report
 508 completed for a telescopic lens user that has been completed within six months
 509 prior to receipt by the Department and is signed and dated by a licensed vision
 510 specialist.

511
 512 "Current Vision Specialist Report" – any vision specialist report completed for a
 513 driver that has been completed within six months prior to receipt by the
 514 Department and is signed and dated by a vision specialist.

515
516 "Custom Harvester" – any individual, partnership, corporation or association
517 engaged in a business operation for the purpose of harvesting agricultural
518 commodities other than their own on a contract basis.
519
520 "Dangerous Action" – an act by the applicant that could endanger a person or
521 property.
522
523 "Day" – a calendar day.
524
525 "Denial" – any entry on a person's driving record by the Department indicating a
526 driver may not renew the driver's license or privileges until the conditions set
527 forth by the Department are met (see IVC Section 6-103).
528
529 "Denial of Driver's License" – the act of prohibiting or disallowing the privilege
530 to obtain a driver's license while allowing the privilege to obtain an instructional
531 permit and limiting privileges to that of an instructional permit if a driver's license
532 has previously been issued (see IVC Section 6-107(c) and (d)).
533
534 "Denial of Driving Privilege" – the act of prohibiting or disallowing the privilege
535 to obtain a driver's license or permit and/or the privilege to operate a motor
536 vehicle (see IVC Sections 6-103, 6-107(c), 6-108.1).
537
538 "Department" – the Department of Driver Services within the Office of the
539 Secretary of State.
540
541 "Department of Administrative Hearings" – the Department of Administrative
542 Hearings of the Office of the Secretary of State.
543
544 "Determination of No Security Threat" – an administrative determination by TSA
545 that an individual does not pose a security threat warranting denial of a Hazardous
546 Material Endorsement.
547
548 "Disabled Person Identification Card" – a standard identification card as defined
549 in Section 4A of the Illinois Identification Card Act [15 ILCS 335/4A] issued for
550 no fee to persons who meet the definition of disabled (see IVC Section 1-159.1).
551
552 "*Disability*" – *an individual's physical or mental impairment that substantially*
553 *limits one or more of the major life activities; a record of such impairment, or*
554 *when the individual is regarded as having such impairment [625 ILCS*
555 *5/6-117.2(f)].*
556
557 "*Disqualification*" – *a disqualification means any of the following three actions:*

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the suspension, revocation, or cancellation of a CLP or CDL by the state or jurisdiction of issuance;

any withdrawal of a person's privileges to drive a commercial motor vehicle by a state or other jurisdiction as a result of a violation of state or local law relating to motor vehicle traffic control (other than parking, vehicle weight or vehicle defect violations);

a determination by FMCSA that a person is not qualified to operate a commercial motor vehicle under 49 CFR 391 (October 1, 2014). [625 ILCS 5/1-115.3]

"Disseminating Agency" – an agency authorized by the Secretary of State to distribute or share an image received from the Secretary of State for purposes of secondary dissemination.

"Drive" – operate or be in physical control of a motor vehicle [625 ILCS 5/4-115.8].

"Driver" – every person who drives or is in actual physical control of a vehicle [625 ILCS 5/1-116].

"Driver Applicant" – a person who applies to a state or other jurisdiction to obtain, transfer, upgrade or renew a CDL or to obtain or renew a CLP.

"Driver's License Test" – a test administered by the Secretary of State that consists of a vision test, written test and/or road test.

"Driver's License Issuance Error" – any act or omission by a Secretary of State employee that results in the driver being not qualified to hold the license as it is classified, restricted and/or endorsed.

"Driver's License Record" – a file maintained by the Secretary of State on each driver in Illinois pursuant to IVC Section 6-117.

"Driver Rehabilitation Specialist" – a person who possesses an undergraduate degree in rehabilitation, education, health, safety, therapy or related profession (or equivalent of eight years of experience in driver rehabilitation); possesses a current Association of Driver Educators for the Disabled (ADED) Certification as a Driver Rehabilitation Specialist (consisting of successful completion of 100 clock hours of educational experience, in combination with safety and medical

600 aspects of disabilities; a minimum of 30 hours must be gained from attending
601 ADED approved courses or workshops).

602
603 "Driver Remedial Education Course" – an organized remedial activity approved
604 by the Driver Services Department for improving the driving habits of certain
605 suspended drivers. The course shall consist of individual counseling and/or group
606 sessions of instruction and shall not exceed two sessions or a total of nine hours of
607 instruction.

608
609 "Driver Services Facility" – the offices located throughout Illinois for the purpose
610 of issuing driver's licenses and providing to the public other necessary services
611 connected with the Secretary of State's Office.

612
613 "Driver Services Facility Representative" – an employee of the Department of
614 Driver Services of the Office of Secretary of State.

615
616 "Driving Abstract" – a record kept by the Department of Driver Services
617 containing all information required under IVC Section 6-106(b) and all records of
618 violations of traffic laws and administrative actions pertaining to driving
619 privileges.

620
621 "Driving Evaluation" – an assessment by a driver education specialist at a
622 rehabilitation institution of an applicant's ability to safely operate a motor vehicle.

623
624 "Driving Skills" – the ability of an applicant to perform maneuvers to be
625 demonstrated during a road test.

626
627 "Employer" – any individual, corporation, partnership or association that employs
628 charter bus drivers licensed under IVC Section 6-508.

629
630 "Employer Certification" – a form submitted by the employer, as prescribed by
631 the Secretary of State, certifying an applicant has met all conditions for
632 application, or that a driver who is no longer eligible for a charter bus driver
633 endorsement has been removed from service.

634
635 "Endorsement" – an authorization to an individual's CLP or CDL required to
636 permit the individual to operate certain types of commercial motor vehicles.

637
638 "Enrolled in a Driver Education Course" – active participation in, and the 30 days
639 immediately preceding, the start of regularly scheduled classroom instruction of
640 an approved driver education course.

641

642 *"Entry-level driver training"—the training an entry-level driver receives from an*
643 *entity listed on the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's Training*
644 *Provider Registry prior to: (i) taking the CDL skills test required to receive the*
645 *Class A or Class B CDL for the first time; (ii) taking the CDL skills test required*
646 *to upgrade to a Class A or Class B CDL; or (iii) taking the CDL skills test*
647 *required to obtain a passenger or school bus endorsement for the first time or the*
648 *CDL knowledge test required to obtain a hazardous materials endorsement for*
649 *the first time. [625 ILCS 5/6-500(15.2)]. The Training Provider Registry can be*
650 *accessed at <https://tpr.fmcsa.dot.gov>.*

651
652 "Examiner" – an employee of the Secretary of State who is qualified to administer
653 all driver's license tests.

654
655 *"Excepted Interstate" or "EI" – a person who operates or expects to operate in*
656 *interstate commerce, but engages exclusively in transportation or operations*
657 *excepted under 49 CFR 390.3(f), 391.2, 391.69 or 398.3 (October 1, 2014) from*
658 *all or part of the qualification requirements of 49 CFR 391 (October 1, 2014) and*
659 *is not required to obtain a medical examiner's certificate by 49 CFR 391.45*
660 *(October 1, 2014). [625 ILCS 5/6-500(15.3)]*

661
662 *"Excepted Intrastate" or "EA" – a person who operates in intrastate commerce*
663 *but engages exclusively in transportation or operations excepted from all or parts*
664 *of the state driver qualification requirements. [625 ILCS 5/6-500 (15.5)]*

665
666 "Facility-Administered Road Test" – an actual demonstration of the applicant's
667 ability to exercise ordinary and reasonable control of the operation of a motor
668 vehicle administered by a Driver Services Facility employee.

669
670 "Farm" – structures and lands used primarily for the raising of agricultural or
671 horticultural commodities, including livestock, poultry, fur-bearing animals, fruit,
672 vegetables, flowers and other plants; "farm" includes ranches, nurseries,
673 greenhouses, orchards, etc.

674
675 "Farm Retail Outlet and/or Supplier" – any individual, partnership, corporation or
676 association engaged in a business operation for the purpose of selling or
677 distributing agricultural commodities.

678
679 "Favorable Medical Report" – a current medical report that has been completed in
680 its entirety and does not require additional information and/or clarification or is
681 not medically questionable. A favorable medical report specifies a professional
682 opinion from the competent medical specialist that the driver is medically/
683 mentally fit to safely operate a motor vehicle.

684

685 "Favorable Vision Specialist Report" – a current vision specialist report that has
686 been completed in its entirety that does not require additional information and/or
687 clarification.

688
689 "Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration" or "FMCSA" – a separate
690 administration within the U. S. Department of Transportation dedicated to
691 improving the safety of commercial motor vehicles and saving lives.

692
693 "Felony" – an offense under state or federal law that is punishable by death or
694 imprisonment for a term of one year or more.

695
696 "Final Determination of Threat Assessment" – a final administrative
697 determination by TSA, including the resolution of related appeals, that an
698 individual poses a security threat warranting denial of a Hazardous Material
699 Endorsement.

700
701 "Fingerprint Process" – a method by which an applicant's fingerprints are taken
702 for the purpose of a criminal background investigation for a charter bus driver
703 endorsement and submitted to the Illinois Department of State Police (ISP) and
704 the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).

705
706 *"First Division Vehicle" – any motor vehicle designed to carry not more than 10*
707 *persons [625 ILCS 5/1-217].*

708
709 *"Foreign Jurisdiction" – a sovereign jurisdiction that does not fall within the*
710 *definition of "state" [625 ILCS 5/6-500(B)(17)].*

711
712 ~~"Foreign National" – a non-citizen of the United States of America who has been~~
713 ~~granted temporary, legal entry into this country by the U.S. Citizenship and~~
714 ~~Immigration Services (USCIS), who is temporarily residing in this State and is~~
715 ~~ineligible to obtain a social security number through the Social Security~~
716 ~~Administration, and who is not required to obtain a driver's license issued by the~~
717 ~~U.S. Department of State, Office of Foreign Missions.~~

718
719 "Foreign Speaking Applicant" – any applicant unable to understand oral
720 directions given by the examiner.

721
722 *"For-Profit Ridesharing Arrangement" – the transportation by motor vehicle of*
723 *not more than 16 persons, including the driver, for which a fee is charged in*
724 *accordance with Section 6 of the Ride Sharing Arrangements Act [625 ILCS*
725 *30/6]. [625 ILCS 5/1-122.7]*

726

727 "Fraud" – includes anything calculated to deceive, whether it be a single act or
728 combination of circumstances, whether the suppression of truth or the suggestion
729 of what is false, whether it be by direct falsehood or by innuendo, by speech or by
730 silence.

731
732 "Functional Ability" – the degree of cognitive, mental, or emotional sensor motor,
733 and sensory capability in performing activities of daily living, including safely
734 performing driving tasks.

735
736 "Good Cause" – examples of dangerous driving or of a physical or mental
737 condition that interferes with safe driving or a situation in which a Secretary of
738 State Driver Services Facility supervisor fails to give a required test or section of
739 a test.

740
741 *"Gross Combination Weight Rating" or "GCWR" – the value specified by the*
742 *manufacturer as the loaded weight of a combination (articulated) vehicle. In the*
743 *absence of a value specified by the manufacturer, GCWR will be determined by*
744 *adding the GVWR of the power unit and the total weight of the towed unit and any*
745 *load thereon as specified in 49 CFR 383.5 (October 1, 2014). [625 ILCS*
746 *5/1-124.5]*

747
748 *"Gross Vehicle Weight Rating" or "GVWR" – the value specified by the*
749 *manufacturer or manufacturers as the maximum loaded weight of a single*
750 *vehicle. The GVWR of a combination of vehicles (commonly referred to as the*
751 *"Gross Combination Weight Rating" or "GCWR") is the GVWR of the power unit*
752 *plus the GVWR of the towed unit or units. In the absence of a value specified by*
753 *the manufacturer, GCWR is determined by adding the GVWR of the power unit*
754 *and the total weight of the towed unit and any load on the unit [625 ILCS*
755 *5/1-124.5].*

756
757 "Hazardous Material Endorsement" or "HME" – an indicator on the driver's
758 license that the driver is qualified to transport hazardous materials that require
759 placarding.

760
761 "Hazardous Materials" – any material that has been designated as hazardous under
762 49 U.S.C. 5103 and is required to be placarded under subpart F of 49 CFR 172
763 (October 1, 2014) or any quantity of a material listed as a select agent or toxin in
764 42 CFR 73 (October 1, 2014).

765
766 "High School Student" – a student who attends a public or private secondary
767 school accredited by the Illinois State Board of Education.
768

769 "Identification Card Verification Form" – a Secretary of State promulgated form
770 completed by the Illinois Department of Corrections (IDOC) or Illinois
771 Department of Juvenile Justice (IDJJ) and issued to a committed person upon
772 release on parole, mandatory supervised release, aftercare release, final discharge
773 or pardon, or to an adult transition center, from the IDOC or IDJJ that verifies the
774 committed person's address and indicates whether the committed person's date of
775 birth and social security number have been verified by IDOC or IDJJ.

776
777 *"Illinois Medical Advisory Board" or "Board" – a panel consisting of at least*
778 *nine physicians appointed by the Secretary [625 ILCS 5/6-902].*

779
780 "Illinois Vehicle Code" or "Vehicle Code" or "IVC" – 625 ILCS 5.

781
782 "Image" – the digital photo and signature captured in the process of issuing an
783 Illinois driver's license or identification card and retrieved from the Secretary of
784 State database.

785
786 "Immediate Family Member" – a parent, child, sibling, grandparent, step-parent,
787 step-child, step-sibling or step-grandparent.

788
789 "Immediate Farm Family Member" – a member of the farmer's family is a natural
790 or in-law, spouse, child, parent, or sibling as provided in IVC Section 6-507(c).

791
792 *"Imminent Hazard" – the existence of:*

793
794 *any condition of a vehicle, employee, or commercial motor vehicle*
795 *operations that substantially increases the likelihood of serious injury or*
796 *death if not discontinued immediately; or*

797
798 *a condition relating to hazardous material that presents a substantial*
799 *likelihood that death, serious illness, severe personal injury, or a*
800 *substantial endangerment to health, property, or the environment may*
801 *occur before the reasonably foreseeable completion date of a formal*
802 *proceeding begun to lessen the risk of that death, illness, injury or*
803 *endangerment. [625 ILCS 5/6-500(20.5)]*

804
805 "Incomplete Medical Report" – a medical report that has not been completed in
806 its entirety, or a medical agreement that has not been signed and dated by the
807 driver.

808
809 "Incomplete Telescopic Lens Vision Specialist Report" – a telescopic lens vision
810 specialist report that has not been completed in its entirety. Examples of an
811 incomplete report include, but are not limited to, omission of name, address,

812 signature or professional license number of the vision specialist or date or one that
813 contains illegible information or fails to answer any of the questions contained
814 within the report.

815
816 "Initial Determination of Threat Assessment" – an initial administrative
817 determination by TSA that an individual poses or may pose a security threat
818 warranting denial of a Hazardous Material Endorsement.

819
820 "In Loco Parentis" – a person who is acting in place of a minor's parent with a
821 parent's rights, duties and authority.

822
823 "Instruction Permit" – a driving permit issued to operate a motor vehicle pursuant
824 to the requirements of IVC Section 6-105 or 6-107.

825
826 "Invalidate" – to render invalid any driver's license, permit or driving privileges.

827
828 "Invalidation" – the withdrawal, by consent, court order, death of the holder or
829 holder's failure to complete a driver remedial education course of the validation,
830 of a person's license, permit and/or driving privilege under IVC Chapter 6.

831
832 "Judicial Driving Permit" – a permit issued granting a driver limited driving
833 privileges as provided in IVC Section 6-206.1.

834
835 "Law Enforcement Official" – a federal, state or local police officer, sheriff,
836 coroner, municipal prosecutor, state's attorney or U.S. attorney.

837
838 "LEADS" – the Illinois Law Enforcement Agencies Data System.

839
840 "Limited Term Identification Card" – An Illinois Identification Card issued by the
841 Secretary of State for a period of 90 days to persons released from Illinois
842 Department of Corrections/Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice.

843
844 "*Limited Term Real ID Compliant Driver's License*" – A Real ID compliant
845 driver's license that is issued to persons who are not permanent residents or
846 citizens of the United States, or an individual who has an approved application
847 for asylum in the United States or has entered the United State in refugee status
848 and is marked "Limited Term" on the face of the card [15 ILCS 335/1A].

849
850 "*Limited Term Real ID Compliant Identification Card*" – a Real ID compliant
851 identification card this is issued to persons who are not permanent residents or
852 citizens of the United States, or an individual who has an approved application
853 for asylum in the United States or has entered the United States in refugee status,
854 and is marked "Limited Term" on the face of the card [15 ILCS 335/1A].

855
856 "Livestock" – any animals such as cattle, sheep, swine, buffalo, cañalo, cattalo,
857 domestic deer, domestic elk, domestic antelope, domestic reindeer, water buffalo
858 and goats.

859
860 "Livestock Feeder" – any individual, partnership, corporation or association
861 engaged in a business operation for the purpose of producing livestock.

862
863 "Mandatory Insurance" – The insurance requirements under IVC Chapter 7,
864 Article VI.

865
866 "Mandatory Liability Insurance Policy" – a liability insurance policy issued in
867 amounts no less than the minimum amounts set for bodily injury or death and for
868 destruction of property (see IVC Section 7-203), and issued in accordance with
869 the requirements of Sections 143a and 143a-2 of the Illinois Insurance Code [215
870 ILCS 5/143a and 143a-2]. This definition does not include vehicles subject to the
871 provisions of IVC Chapter 18 or 18a, Article III or IVC Section 7-609, 12-607 or
872 12-707.01; vehicles required to file proof of liability insurance with the Illinois
873 Commerce Commission; vehicles covered by a certificate of self-insurance (see
874 IVC Section 7-502); vehicles owned by the United States Government, State of
875 Illinois or any political subdivision, municipality or local mass transit district;
876 implements of husbandry (see IVC Section 1-130), other vehicles complying with
877 laws that require insurance in amounts meeting or exceeding the minimum
878 amounts required under the IVC; and inoperable or stored vehicles that are not
879 operated.

880
881 "Mandatory Law Enforcement Report" – an unsigned message directed to the
882 Department electronically from law enforcement containing the same information
883 as the form designed by the Department.

884
885 "Mechanical Aid" – a device added to a motor vehicle that would enhance the
886 operator's ability to safely operate the vehicle.

887
888 "Medical Agreement" – an agreement signed and dated by the driver, maintained
889 as part of the medical report, and including the following conditions and/or
890 information:

891
892 a condition that the driver remain under the care of a competent medical
893 specialist;

894
895 a condition that the driver adhere to the treatment and/or medication;

896

897 authorization by the driver to the competent medical specialist to report
898 any change in the driver's condition that would impair the driver's ability
899 to operate a motor vehicle;

900
901 possible consequences for failing to abide by any or all of the conditions
902 contained in the medical agreement.

903
904 *"Medical Examiner" – a person who is licensed, certified, or registered in*
905 *accordance with applicable state laws and regulations to perform physical*
906 *examinations. The term includes but is not limited to doctors of medicine, doctors*
907 *of osteopathy, physician assistants, advanced practice nurses, and doctors of*
908 *chiropractic. [625 ILCS 5/6-500(21.1)]*

909
910 *"Medical Examiner's Certificate" – a document prescribed or approved by the*
911 *Secretary of State that is issued by a medical examiner to a driver to medically*
912 *qualify the driver to drive. [625 ILCS 5/6-500(21.2)]*

913
914 "Medical Exemption" – temporary regulatory relief for up to two years from one
915 or more Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations given to a person, by FMCSA,
916 subject to the regulations, or a person who intends to engage in an activity that
917 would be subject to the regulations in accordance with 49 CFR 381.300 (October
918 1, 2014).

919
920 "Medical Professional" – a person licensed under the Medical Practice Act [225
921 ILCS 60], or similar law of another jurisdiction, a physician assistant who has
922 been delegated the authority to make the required determination by a supervising
923 physician, or an advanced practice nurse who has a written collaborative
924 agreement with a collaborating physician that authorizes the advanced practice
925 nurse to make the determination.

926
927 "Medical Report" – a confidential medical questionnaire directed to the
928 Department and approved by the Illinois Medical Advisory Board, or a statement
929 on letterhead made by a competent medical specialist containing the same
930 information as the form designed by the Department.

931
932 "Medical Restriction Card" – a card designed and issued by the Department that
933 describes and explains the limitations and/or conditions noted in the restriction
934 area of a person's driver's license.

935
936 "Medical Waiver" – temporary regulatory relief for up to three months from one
937 or more Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations given to a person, by FMCSA,
938 subject to the regulations, or a person who intends to engage in an activity that

939 would be subject to the regulations in accordance with 49 CFR 381.200 (October
940 1, 2014).

941
942 *"Medical Variance" – a driver has received one of the following from FMCSA,*
943 *which allows the driver to be issued a medical certificate:*

944
945 *an exemption letter permitting operation of a CMV pursuant to 49 CFR*
946 *381 (October 1, 2014), subpart C or 49 CFR 391.64 (October 1, 2014); or*

947
948 *a skilled performance evaluation (SPE) certificate permitting operation of*
949 *a CMV pursuant to 49 CFR 391.49 (October 1, 2014). [625 ILCS 5/6-500*
950 *(21.5)]*

951
952 *"Mental or Physical Disorder or Disability" – a scientifically recognized condition*
953 *that may medically impair a person's mental and/or physical health to the extent*
954 *of being unable to safely operate a motor vehicle.*

955
956 *"Military Deferral Card" – a card issued at the expiration of the driver's license to*
957 *extend the expiration while in the military, of the license of the licensee, spouse*
958 *and dependent children who are living with the licensee while on active duty*
959 *serving in the Armed Forces of the United States outside the State of Illinois.*

960
961 *"Minor" – a person under 18 years of age.*

962
963 *"Miscellaneous Suspension" – a suspension for safety responsibility, financial*
964 *responsibility, warrant parking/traffic, auto emissions, failure to appear, curfew,*
965 *mandatory conviction, tollway, family financial responsibility, automated traffic*
966 *law violation, nighttime driving restriction or unsatisfied judgment.*

967
968 *"Monocular Vision Acuity" – a visual acuity reading obtained utilizing each*
969 *individual eye.*

970
971 *"Moped" – a motor-driven cycle, with or without optional power derived from*
972 *manually operated pedals, whose speed attainable in one mile is at least 20 m.p.h.*
973 *but not greater than 30 m.p.h., and is equipped with a motor that produces 2*
974 *brake horsepower or less. If an internal combustion engine is used, the*
975 *displacement shall not exceed 50 cubic centimeter displacement and the power*
976 *drive system shall not require the operator to shift gears. [625 ILCS 5/1-148.2]*

977
978 *"Motorcycle" – every motor vehicle having a seat or saddle for use of the rider*
979 *and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground,*
980 *but excluding a tractor [625 ILCS 5/1-147].*

981

982 "Motorcycle Rider Safety Training Course" – a course of instruction in the use and
983 operation of motorcycles and/or motor-driven cycles, including instruction in the
984 safe on-road operation of motorcycles and/or motor-driven cycles, the rules of the
985 road and the laws of this State relating to motor vehicles, which course must meet
986 the requirements set out in 92 Ill. Adm. Code 455.101.

987
988 *"Motor-Driven Cycle" – every motorcycle and every motor scooter with less than*
989 *150 cubic centimeter piston displacement, including motorized pedalcycles [625*
990 *ILCS 5/1-145.001].*

991
992 *"Motor Vehicle" – every vehicle that is self-propelled and every vehicle that is*
993 *propelled by electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires, but not*
994 *operated upon rails, except for vehicles moved solely by human power and*
995 *motorized wheelchairs. Motor vehicles are divided into two divisions:*

996
997 *First Division: Those motor vehicles that are designed for the carrying of*
998 *not more than 10 persons.*

999
1000 *Second Division: Those motor vehicles that are designed for carrying*
1001 *more than 10 persons, those motor vehicles designed or used for living*
1002 *quarters, those motor vehicles that are designed for pulling or carrying*
1003 *freight, cargo or implements of husbandry, and those motor vehicles of the*
1004 *First Division remodeled for use and used as motor vehicles of the Second*
1005 *Division. [625 ILCS 5/1-146]*

1006
1007 "Motor Vehicle Departments of Foreign States" – the departments in other states
1008 that issue driver's licenses.

1009
1010 *"Motor Vehicle Record" – a report of the driving status and history of a driver*
1011 *generated from the driver record provided to users, such as drivers or employers,*
1012 *and is subject to the provisions of the Driver Privacy Protection Act (18 U.S.C.*
1013 *2721-2725). [625 ILCS 5/6-500(22.2)]*

1014
1015 "Nasal Vision Reading" – a field of vision 35° from the straight ahead.

1016
1017 "National Driver Register" or "NDR" – a computerized database of files on
1018 drivers maintained by the U.S. Department of Transportation, National Highway
1019 Traffic Safety Administration.

1020
1021 "Night" – the hours during the period from sunset to sunrise.

1022
1023 "Nighttime Drive" – a road test administered during the hours of sunset to sunrise.

1024

1025 "Nighttime Driving Privilege" – a privilege granted to a licensed driver to operate
1026 a motor vehicle during nighttime hours while wearing a telescopic lens
1027 arrangement.
1028

1029 "Non-CDL" – any other type of motor vehicle license, such as an automobile
1030 driver's license or a motorcycle license.
1031

1032 "Non-CDL Skills Test" – any drive test given to an applicant who is attempting to
1033 obtain a driver's license except for a Class D, a CDL or a CDL endorsement.
1034

1035 *"Non-Excepted Interstate" or "NI" – a person who operates or expects to operate*
1036 *in interstate commerce, is subject to and meets the qualification requirements*
1037 *under 49 CFR 391 (October 1, 2014), and is required to obtain a medical*
1038 *examiner's certificate by 49 CFR 391.45 (October 1, 2014). [625 ILCS*
1039 *5/6-500(22.7)]*
1040

1041 *"Non-Excepted Intrastate" or "NA" – a person who operates only in intrastate*
1042 *commerce and is subject to State driver qualification requirements. [625 ILCS*
1043 *5/6-500(22.8)]*
1044

1045 "Official Investigation" – the act of examining and inquiring into an occurrence or
1046 circumstance with care and accuracy by a duly authorized member of a local, state
1047 or federal agency while acting in a professional capacity.
1048

1049 "Operator's License" – any driver's license to operate a motor vehicle issued under
1050 the laws of any state.
1051

1052 "Organized Religion" – a group of people with the same or similar beliefs brought
1053 together to exercise those beliefs.
1054

1055 "P Endorsement" – a notation on the driver's license that the driver has qualified
1056 to operate a vehicle designed to transport 16 or more persons, including the
1057 driver.
1058

1059 "Peripheral Vision" – vision from the outside line of direct sight toward the
1060 temporal area.
1061

1062 "Preliminary Favorable Medical Report" – a current medical report or a current
1063 written statement on official letterhead that is signed and dated by a competent
1064 medical specialist indicating that in the specialist's professional opinion the driver
1065 is medically fit to safely operate a motor vehicle; however, additional information
1066 and/or clarification or consultation is needed.
1067

1068 "Probationary License" – a special license granting full driving privileges during a
1069 period of suspension and is issued upon successful completion of a driver
1070 remedial education course.
1071

1072 "Problem Driver Pointer System" or "PDPS" – a pointer file consisting of an
1073 index of problem drivers (as determined by adverse driver's license actions) that is
1074 maintained by a driver's home state (SOR) and is accessed by other states (SOI) to
1075 determine a person's eligibility to apply for a driver's license.
1076

1077 "Proof of Insurance" – acceptable forms of proof of insurance include, but are not
1078 limited to, the following:
1079

1080 Illinois insurance card that contains the company name, policy number,
1081 effective and expiration dates, name of the insured, vehicle year and make
1082 and a minimum of the last six characters of the Vehicle Identification
1083 Number (VIN);
1084

1085 *Combination of proof of purchase of the motor vehicle within 60 days and*
1086 *a current insurance card [625 ILCS 5/7-602(b)];*
1087

1088 *Current declaration page of a liability policy [625 ILCS 5/7-602(c)] that*
1089 *contains the company name, policy number, effective and expiration dates,*
1090 *name of the insured, vehicle description and liability limits of the policy;*
1091

1092 *Liability insurance binder [625 ILCS 5/7-602(d)];*
1093

1094 *Certificate of Insurance [625 ILCS 5/7-602(d)];*
1095

1096 *Payment receipt for a liability insurance premium [625 ILCS 5/7-602(d)]*
1097 *that contains the company name, policy number, effective and expiration*
1098 *dates, name of the insured, vehicle year, make and a minimum of the last*
1099 *six characters of the VIN, date of premium payment and signature of*
1100 *company representative;*
1101

1102 *Current rental agreement [625 ILCS 5/7-602(e)];*
1103

1104 *Registration plates, registration sticker or other evidence of registration*
1105 *issued by the Secretary of State's Office only upon submission of proof of*
1106 *liability insurance [625 ILCS 5/7-602(f)];*
1107

1108 *Certificate, decal or other document or device issued by a governmental*
1109 *agency for a motor vehicle indicating the vehicle is insured for liability*

1110 [625 ILCS 5/7-602(g)] (or has qualified for an exemption to the liability
1111 insurance law).

1112
1113 "Prosthesis" – an artificial limb such as arm or leg.

1114
1115 *"Public Safety Worker" – a person employed by this State or a political*
1116 *subdivision thereof that provides firefighting, medical or other emergency*
1117 *services [625 ILCS 5/6-117.2(f)].*

1118
1119 "Questionable Medical Report" – a medical report that contains medical
1120 information raising some reasonable doubt regarding the driver's medical ability
1121 to safely operate a motor vehicle, including the following:

1122
1123 A medical report that indicates the driver has experienced an attack of
1124 unconsciousness within the past six months;

1125
1126 The medical report lacks a professional opinion indicating whether the
1127 driver is medically fit to safely operate a motor vehicle;

1128
1129 The medical report was signed and/or completed by someone other than a
1130 competent medical specialist;

1131
1132 The competent medical specialist recommends the driver has driving
1133 privileges, however, expresses reservations about the driver's ability to
1134 safely operate a motor vehicle.

1135
1136 *"Real ID Compliant Driver's License" – a driver's license issued in compliance*
1137 *with the REAL ID Act, federal implementing regulations (6 CFR 37), and this*
1138 *Part. Real ID compliant driver's licenses shall bear a security marking approved*
1139 *by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security [625 ILCS 5/6-100(e)].*

1140
1141 *"Real ID Compliant Identification Card" – an Illinois Identification Card or*
1142 *Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card issued in compliance with the*
1143 *REAL ID Act, federal implementing regulations (6 CFR 37), and this Part. Real*
1144 *ID compliant identification cards shall bear a security marking approved by the*
1145 *U.S. Department of Homeland Security [15 ILCS 335/1A].*

1146
1147 *"Reckless Driving" – driving a motor vehicle with a willful or wanton disregard*
1148 *for the safety of persons or property or knowingly driving a vehicle using an*
1149 *incline in a roadway, such as a railroad crossing, bridge approach or hill to*
1150 *cause the vehicle to become airborne [625 ILCS 5/11-503].*

1151

1152 "Registration Sticker" – a device or devices to be attached to a rear registration
1153 plate that will renew the registration and registration plate or plates for a
1154 pre-determined period not to exceed one registration year except as provided in
1155 IVC Section 3-414(1).
1156
1157 "Regularly Scheduled Classroom Instruction" – the continuous and uninterrupted
1158 education course that takes place during the specific time period (i.e., quarter) in
1159 which the school has scheduled the student to participate.
1160
1161 "Rehabilitation Institution" – any hospital, center, institute, or facility engaged in
1162 a program to provide driver training for the disabled.
1163
1164 "Religious Organization Bus" – any vehicle other than a vehicle of the First
1165 Division or a school bus as defined by IVC Section 1-182 that is exclusively
1166 owned and operated by a religious organization and is used primarily in
1167 conducting the official activities of that organization.
1168
1169 "Religious Organization Vehicle Restriction" – the authority to operate a religious
1170 organization bus (see IVC Section 6-106.2).
1171
1172 "Representative Vehicle" – a motor vehicle that represents the type an applicant
1173 operates or expects to operate.
1174
1175 "Rescind" – to annul or void a suspension, revocation, cancellation,
1176 disqualification or denial.
1177
1178 "Restricted Local License" – a special restricted driver's license issued under IVC
1179 Section 6-113 and intended to enable a person to drive a specific route.
1180
1181 "Restriction" – the notation on a driver's license or permit indicating requirements
1182 deemed applicable to the licensee by the Department to assure safe operation of a
1183 motor vehicle.
1184
1185 "Review of Driving Habits" – a review of the applicant's driving record
1186 maintained by the Office of the Secretary of State, or documentation from another
1187 licensing entity, that has been certified within 30 days prior to the date of
1188 application, to ~~ensure~~insure that the requirements are met (see IVC Sections 6-
1189 104, 6-508).
1190
1191 "Road Test" – an actual demonstration of the applicant's ability to operate a motor
1192 vehicle (see IVC Section 6-109).
1193

1194 "S Endorsement" – an endorsement for CDL holders who operate as a school bus
1195 driver to transport pre-primary, primary or secondary school students to and from
1196 home, from school to home, or to and from school-sponsored events.
1197

1198 "Safety Course" – an explanation provided by a rental agency to an individual
1199 during the rental transaction concerning the controls and features of the vehicle
1200 and its proper operation.
1201

1202 "Safety Officer" – any individual employed by a third-party certifying entity who
1203 is licensed by the Department to administer the CDL skills tests specified in
1204 subparts G and H of 49 CFR 383 (October 1, 2014) to the entities' employees and
1205 members. A safety officer is equivalent to a [third-party skills test examiner](#)~~Third
1206 Party Skills Test Examiner~~ as defined in 49 CFR 383.5 (October 1, 2014).
1207

1208 "SAVE" – the Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements Program that allows
1209 electronic inquiries to U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) by
1210 state motor vehicle agencies ~~to determine in the determination of~~ the immigration
1211 status of an applicant for [standard or Real ID compliant driver's license or
1212 identification card](#)~~a Visa Status Temporary Visitor's Driver's License pursuant to
1213 IVC Section 6-105.1(a)~~.
1214

1215 "*School Bus*" – *every motor vehicle, except as provided in this definition, owned
1216 or operated by or for any of the following entities for the transportation of
1217 persons regularly enrolled as students in grade 12 or below in connection with
1218 any activity of the entity:*

1219 *Any public or private primary or secondary school;*

1220 *Any primary or secondary school operated by a religious institution; or*

1221 *Any public, private or religious nursery school.*

1222 *This definition shall not include the following:*

1223 *A bus operated by a public utility, municipal corporation or common
1224 carrier authorized to conduct local or interurban transportation of
1225 passengers when the bus is not traveling a specific school bus route but is:*

1226 *On a regularly scheduled route for the transportation of other fare
1227 paying passengers;*
1228
1229
1230
1231
1232
1233
1234

1235 *Furnishing charter service for the transportation of groups on field*
1236 *trips or other special trips or in connection with other special*
1237 *events; or*
1238

1239 *Being used for shuttle service between attendance centers or other*
1240 *education facilities.*

1241
1242 *A motor vehicle of the first division.*

1243
1244 *A motor vehicle designed for the transportation of not less than seven nor*
1245 *more than 16 persons that is operated by or for a public or private*
1246 *primary or secondary school, including any primary or secondary school*
1247 *operated by a religious institution, for the purpose of transporting not*
1248 *more than 15 students to and from interscholastic athletic or other*
1249 *interscholastic or school sponsored activities. [625 ILCS 5/1-182]*
1250

1251 "School Bus Commercial Learner's Permit" or "School Bus CLP" – a learner's
1252 permit that allows an applicant for a school bus permit to operate a school bus, but
1253 only when accompanied by a properly classified driver with a school bus driver
1254 permit.
1255

1256 "School Bus Driver Permit" – a permit issued to an applicant who has met all the
1257 requirements that authorize the individual to drive a school bus (see IVC Section
1258 6-106.1).
1259

1260 "Seasonal Restricted Commercial Driver's License" or "Restricted CDL" – a
1261 limited waiver for employees of certain farm-related services to operate specific
1262 commercial motor vehicles without a commercial driver's license for a limited
1263 period.
1264

1265 "*Second Division Vehicle*" – *any vehicle designed to carry more than 10 persons,*
1266 *those designed or used for living quarters and those vehicles designed to pull or*
1267 *carry property, freight or cargo, those motor vehicles of the first division*
1268 *remodeled for use and used as motor vehicles of the second division, and those*
1269 *motor vehicles of the first division used and registered as school buses [625 ILCS*
1270 *5/1-217].*
1271

1272 "Secondary Dissemination" – the distributing or sharing of an image by a source
1273 other than the primary source (Secretary of State) that has direct access to the
1274 image.
1275

1276 "*Secretary of State*" – *the Secretary of State of Illinois [625 ILCS 5/1-184].*
1277

1278 "Self-Admission" – a statement or indication from the driver that the driver has a
1279 mental disorder/disability and/or physical condition or disability that may impair
1280 the ability to safely operate a motor vehicle or that is likely to cause a loss of
1281 consciousness.

1282
1283 "Self-Certification" – a driver's signed and dated declaration of the type of driving
1284 (NI, EI, NA, EA) in which the driver engages or expects to engage while
1285 operating a CMV.

1286
1287 "Senior Citizen Transportation Vehicle" – a vehicle, other than a vehicle of the
1288 first division or a school bus, exclusively owned and operated by a senior citizen
1289 organization and used primarily in conducting the official activities of the
1290 organization.

1291
1292 "Serious Traffic Violation" – a conviction when operating a commercial motor
1293 vehicle, or when operating a non-CMV, while holding a CLP or CDL of: a
1294 violation relating to excessive speeding involving a single speeding charge of 15
1295 miles per hour or more above the legal speed limit; a violation relating to reckless
1296 driving; a violation of any State law or local ordinance relating to motor vehicle
1297 traffic control (other than parking violations) arising in connection with a fatal
1298 traffic accident; a violation, relating to having multiple driver's licenses (see IVC
1299 Section 6-501); a violation relating to the requirement to have a valid CLP or
1300 CDL (see IVC Section 6-507(a)); a violation relating to improper or erratic lane
1301 changes; a violation relating to following another vehicle too closely; any other
1302 similar violation of a law or local ordinance of any state relating to motor vehicle
1303 traffic control, other than a parking violation, which the Secretary of State
1304 determines to be serious pursuant to 92 Ill. Adm. Code 1040.20.

1305
1306 "Skills Performance Evaluation" or "SPE" – a certificate, issued by FMCSA to a
1307 driver with a missing limb, in accordance with 49 CFR 391.49 (October 1, 2014),
1308 which allows the driver to operate a CMV.

1309
1310 *"Special Needs Individuals" – those individuals who have or are at increased risk*
1311 *for a chronic physical, developmental, behavioral, or emotional condition and*
1312 *who also require health and related services of a type or amount beyond that*
1313 *required be individuals generally [625 ILCS 5/6-117.2(f).*

1314
1315 "SSOLV" – the Social Security Online Verification system that allows electronic
1316 inquiries to the Social Security Administration by state motor vehicle agencies to
1317 verify names and social security numbers of applicants for driver's licenses or
1318 identification cards.

1319

1320 Standard Driver's License – a driver's license issued by the Secretary of State that
1321 does not meet the requirements of the REAL ID Act, federal implementing
1322 regulations (6 CFR 37), and this Part.
1323

1324 Standard Identification Card – an identification card issued by the Secretary of
1325 State that does not meet the requirements of the REAL ID Act, federal
1326 implementing regulations (6 CFR 37), and this Part.
1327

1328 *"State" – a state, territory or possession of the United States, the District of*
1329 *Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, or a province of the Dominion of*
1330 *Canada [625 ILCS 5/1-195].*
1331

1332 *"Suspension" – the temporary withdrawal by formal action of the Secretary of a*
1333 *person's license or privilege to operate a motor vehicle on the public highways,*
1334 *for a period specifically designated by the Secretary [625 ILCS 5/1-204].*
1335

1336 *"Tank Vehicle" – any commercial motor vehicle that is designed to transport any*
1337 *liquid or gaseous material within a tank or tanks having an individual rate*
1338 *capacity of more than 119 gallons and an aggregate rated capacity of 1,000*
1339 *gallons or more that is either permanently or temporarily attached to the vehicle*
1340 *or the chassis. Those vehicles include, but are not limited to, cargo tanks and*
1341 *portable tanks, as defined in 49 CFR 171 (2011). [625 ILCS 5/1-204.4]*
1342

1343 "Telescopic Lens Arrangement" – a non-standard adaptive device that aids in
1344 improving vision deficits.
1345

1346 "Telescopic Lens Vision Specialist Report" – an approved confidential vision
1347 questionnaire directed to the Department, or a statement on letterhead made by a
1348 vision specialist, containing the same information as the form designed by the
1349 Department.
1350

1351 "Temporal Vision Reading" – a field of vision 70° from the straight ahead.
1352

1353 "Temporary Driver's License or Instruction Permit" – a driver's license or
1354 instruction permit issued for no longer than 90 days to a person who is
1355 temporarily unable to obtain a license or instruction permit.
1356

1357 ~~"Temporary Visitor's Driver's License" or "TVDL" – a license issued to:~~
1358

1359 ~~a foreign national who is authorized to temporarily reside in this country~~
1360 ~~allowing the operation of a motor vehicle under the laws of this State~~
1361 ~~(referred to in this Part as "Visa status"); or~~
1362

1363 *an applicant who:*
1364
1365 *resided in this State for a period in excess of one year;*
1366
1367 *is ineligible to obtain a social security number; and*
1368
1369 *is unable to present documentation issued by the United States*
1370 *Citizenship and Immigration Services authorizing the person's*
1371 *presence in this country [625 ILCS 5/6-105.1(a-5)] referred to in*
1372 *this Part as "non-Visa status".*
1373

1374 "Termination of an Adjudication of Disability Order" – an order by a court of
1375 competent jurisdiction terminating an adjudication of disability of the driver
1376 pursuant to Section 11a-20 of the Probate Act of 1975 [755 ILCS 5/11a-20].
1377

1378 "Third-Party Certification License" – a license issued by the Secretary of State to
1379 a third-party certifying entity that allows the entity to participate in the third-party
1380 certification program.
1381

1382 "Third-Party Certification Program" – a Secretary of State program that allows a
1383 third-party entity to administer the CDL skills tests specified in subparts G and H
1384 of 49 CFR 383 (October 1, 2014) to its employees or members.
1385

1386 "Third-Party Certifying Entity" or "Entity" – an entity licensed by the Secretary of
1387 State to participate in the third-party certification program. A third-party
1388 certifying entity is equivalent to a third party tester as defined in 49 CFR 383.5
1389 (October 1, 2014).
1390

1391 "Transportation Security Administration" or "TSA" – a division of the
1392 Department of Homeland Security administering provisions of the Uniting and
1393 Strengthening America by Providing Appropriate Tools Required to Intercept and
1394 Obstruct Terrorism Act (USA Patriot Act; Public Law 107-56, 115 Stat. 272).
1395

1396 "Traffic Regulation Governing the Movement of Vehicles" – a violation for

"Vision Screening" – the readings obtained by a physician, ophthalmologist, optometrist or Department representative of an applicant's visual acuity and peripheral fields of vision.

"Vision Specialist" – a doctor licensed to practice medicine in optometry under the Illinois Optometric Practice Act [225 ILCS 80] or a competent medical specialist.

"Vision Specialist Report" – an approved confidential vision questionnaire directed to the Department, or a statement on letterhead made by a vision specialist, containing the same information as the form designed by the Department.

"Visual Acuity Readings" – the minimum vision standards set forth in Sections 1030.70 and 1030.75.

"Visual Peripheral Readings" – the minimum vision standards set forth in Sections 1030.70 and 1030.75.

"Withdrawal" – the negating of valid driving privileges by a state as the result of sanctions taken against driving privileges.

"Youth for Whom the Department of Children and Family Services is Legally Responsible For" or "Foster Child" – a child or youth whose guardianship or custody has been accepted by the Department of Children and Family Services pursuant to the Juvenile Court Act of 1987, the Children and Family Services Act [20 ILCS 505], the Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act [325 ILCS 5], and the Adoption Act [750 ILCS 50]. This applies to children for whom the Department of Children and Family Services has temporary protective custody, custody and guardianship via court order, or children whose parents have signed an adoptive surrender or voluntary placement agreement with the Department [15 ILCS 335/1A].

An applicant ~~for~~or-obtain a non-domiciled CDL must provide documentation, issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security, authorizing the applicant's presence in the United States. A CDL or non-domiciled CDL may not be issued to an applicant without a social security number.

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- a) An applicant for a Real ID compliant driver's license or identification card shall visit a Secretary of State Driver Services Facility and complete an application form provided by the Secretary of State pursuant to IVC Section 6-106, which shall include the questions provided in Appendix A. The applicant shall provide a Driver Services Facility employee with acceptable documents as provided in Appendix D establishing the applicant's identity (name and date of birth), United States citizenship or lawful status, signature, social security number and Illinois residency.
- b) An applicant for a Real ID Compliant driver's license shall take the following tests as required in IVC Section 6-109:
 - 1) A vision test as provided in Sections 1030.70 and 1030.75;
 - 2) A road test, if required, as provided in Section 1030.85 (exemptions to the road test requirement are provided in Section 1030.88); and
 - 3) A written test, if required, as provided in Section 1030.80.
- c) Applicants for a Real ID compliant driver's license who are 16 or 17 years of age and not legally emancipated by marriage shall not be issued a driver's license without the written consent of the applicant's parent, legal guardian or other responsible adult, regardless of whether the required written consent also accompanied the person's previous application for an instruction permit and until the applicant has, in accordance with IVC Section 6-107(b):
 - 1) Held a valid instruction permit for a minimum of 9 months;
 - 2) Passed an approved driver education course and submitted proof of having passed the course as may be required; and
 - 3) Submitted, on a form prepared or approved by the Secretary of State, certification by the parent of the applicant, the legal guardian having custody of the applicant, or, in the event there is no parent or legal guardian, by another responsible adult, that the applicant has had a minimum of 50 hours, at least 10 hours of which have been at night, of behind-the-wheel practice time and is sufficiently prepared and able to safely operate a motor vehicle. The 50 hours shall be in addition to the required hours spent with a driver education instructor. The person completing the certification shall, upon signing the certification, swear under penalty of perjury that everything contained within the certification is true and correct.

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- d) Applicants for a Real ID compliant driver's license who are 18, 19 or 20 years of age who have not previously been licensed and who have not successfully completed an approved driver education course or the classroom portion of an approved driver education course shall not be issued a driver's license unless the applicant has successfully completed an adult driver education course offered by an adult driver education course provider and proof of that completion has been submitted to the Secretary by the adult driver education course provider.
 - e) A photograph shall be taken of a Real ID compliant driver's license or identification card applicant.
 - f) A Real ID compliant driver's license or identification card shall bear the applicant's full legal name (first name, middle names and last names). Use of initials or nicknames is prohibited.
 - g) The applicant's social security number shall be verified via Social Security Online Verification (SSOLV) and shall be reverified at every renewal.
 - h) If an applicant presents a United States passport or passport card, it shall be verified via the U.S. Passport Verification Service (USPVS).
 - i) If an applicant presents a foreign passport accompanied by an I-94 reflecting the date of the most recent admission into the United States, a permanent resident card or an employment authorization document, it shall be verified via Systemic Verification for Alien Entitlements (SAVE) and shall be reverified at every renewal.
 - j) If an applicant presents a certified birth certificate issued by a State Office of Vital Statistics or equivalent agency in the individual's state of birth, it shall be verified via Electronic Verification of Vital Events (EVVE) only if EVVE is able to verify birth certificates from every state and territory dating back to a time sufficient to verify applicants of every age.
 - k) The Secretary shall not issue a Real ID compliant driver's license to any person who holds a Real ID compliant identification card in Illinois. The Secretary shall not issue a Real ID compliant identification card to any person who holds a Real ID compliant driver's license in Illinois. The Secretary shall not issue a Real ID compliant driver's license or identification card to any person who holds any type of a driver's license or identification card in another state. To determine if an applicant holds a driver's license or identification card in another state, the Secretary shall submit an inquiry via State to State (S2S) Verification Service.

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- l) A secure temporary driver's license or identification card, valid for 90 days, shall be issued at the facility upon completion of all the requirements of this Section and IVC Chapter 6. Upon successful completion of verification by the Secretary of State, which may include, but is not limited to, a facial recognition check of the applicant's image against the Secretary of State image database and verification of residency, the applicant shall be mailed a Real ID compliant driver's license or identification card to the address provided by the applicant.
 - m) An applicant whose immigration documents are submitted to SAVE for verification and for whom SAVE requires additional verification shall be issued a 90-day temporary driver's license or identification card. The temporary driver's license or identification card may be re-issued for another 90-day period. If the applicant is unable to resolve the issue with SAVE by the end of the second 90-day period, no driver's license or identification card shall be issued to the applicant.
 - n) The fees collected for the issuance of an original, renewal, duplicate or corrected Real ID compliant driver's license shall be in accordance with IVC Section 6-118. The fees collected for the issuance of an original, renewal, duplicate or corrected Real ID compliant identification card shall be in accordance with Section 12 of the Identification Card Act.
 - o) A Real ID compliant driver's license shall expire in accordance with IVC Section 6-115. A Real ID identification card shall expire in accordance with Section 8 of the Identification Card Act.
 - p) The Secretary shall photocopy or scan and maintain the documents submitted to the Secretary by a Real ID applicant.
 - q) A Real ID compliant driver's license or identification card shall bear a gold star. A Real ID compliant driver's license or identification card issued to an applicant who is not a United States citizen, ~~or~~ permanent resident, does not have an approved application for asylum in the United States, or did not enter the United States in refugee status shall bear the words "limited term".
 - r) An applicant applying for the first time for a CDL, passenger endorsement, school bus endorsement or hazardous materials endorsement or upgrading a CDL must complete entry-level driver training.

- c) All applicants who receive a temporary driver's license or instruction permit in lieu of a driver's license or instruction permit must show proof of legal name, a valid social security number (if the applicant has a social security number), zip code, date of birth, gender and residence address as described in IVC Section 6-106. The applicant shall affirm that all information set forth on the application is true and correct and bears the applicant's signature.
 - d) Temporary driver's licenses or instruction permits shall be issued for a period of time not to exceed 90 days and shall be valid only when in the possession of the driver.
